

Immunization

Seventh grade families are reminded that it is Ohio Law (ORC 3313.671) that all incoming 7th graders must have written documentation from a health care provider of a Tdap booster (tetanus, diphtheria, and acellular pertussis) and one dose of meningococcal (serogroups A, C, W, and Y). Please obtain a complete updated immunization record from your primary care physician, and send a copy of this record to school. **This must be done by the end of September.**

September Perfect Attendance

Attendance is critical for student learning. Like last year, we will reward students each month who have had Perfect Attendance. Perfect Attendance requires that students are not only present during school days, but arrive on time each morning (barring an excusable circumstance), and stay for the entirety of the (again, barring an excusable circumstance). Being chronically tardy or regularly leaving early for convenience are not excusable. Although we encourage 8th grade shadow days, students will be considered absent on these days; the same for families that may be absent for a variety of reasons (weddings, funerals, etc.) We have nine months of school. All students will have ample opportunities to gain multiple out of uniform days. Last year, 12 students achieved Perfect Attendance for the entire year! Providing a special monthly out of uniform day is just one way we can encourage students to value being in school as we know it is essential to being successful.

October - Month of the Rosary

October is the Month of the Rosary. Students will be learning about Jesus' life and ministry by studying the mysteries of the rosary and praying a decade of the Rosary each day throughout the month. By the end of the month we will have prayed the Joyful, Luminous, Sorrowful, and Glorious Mysteries. Our special intentions throughout the month will be for the protection of the unborn, respect for women, the dignity of all persons, and protection of parental rights. As you are probably aware, Ohio has a proposed Amendment on November's ballot. Although the Church may not advocate for particular candidates or political parties, the Church may advocate stances on particular issues. Many parishes across Ohio have been doing this for week's, providing important information regarding the language of the proposed amendment. Please review it, and join us throughout October, leading up to the election, that Ohioans reject a proposed amendment that puts into real danger the protections of women, children, and parents.

We are anxiously awaiting the arrival of Sister Arulmozhi, Sister Gracy, and Sister Martina from the Franciscan Sisters of the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Although we do not know the exact date of their arrival, we are anticipating that they will be joining our staff by November. Please pray for their safe arrival and smooth transition.













Preschool

- **Religion** Students are learning about St. Monica and the virtue of patience.
- Language Arts Students are learning the letter "D" in its written form, as well as the sound that it makes. Students are also learning how to draw handwriting strokes.
- **Math** Students are learning how to count 1-5, how to recognize numerals 1-5, and how to sort and count like objects in amounts of 1-5.
- **Science and Social Studies** will be integrated through our language arts program, CKLA, throughout the year. Students are learning about community helpers. Students are also learning about the human body.

- Music Students will practice playing instruments to a steady beat.
- **Gym** Students will continue to learn how to use gross motor skills to run, jump and play. Students will use the scooters and play "Sharks and Minnows" during gym class.

Kindergarten

- **Religion** Students will learn how Jesus is the Son of God and Mary. They will begin learning the Our Father
- Language Arts Students will focus on oral language exercises, such as blending syllables in words as well as blending sounds within three-letter words. Students will continue with prewriting exercises. They will learn how to draw additional shapes and strokes that will be helpful for when they begin writing letters in the next unit.
- Math Students will finish up chapter two, which focuses on numbers 0-9. They will begin their next chapter, which focuses on comparing and ordering objects by size, length, and weight through sight and feel.
- **Science & Social Studies** will be integrated through our language arts program, CKLA, throughout the year. Students will begin their unit of study on the five senses.

Grade 1

- **Religion** Students will learn about Creation and how God created everything out of love. They will also learn the Our Father. They will begin learning about the Trinity.
- Language Arts Students will continue working on the first unit of skills. Students will begin reading from the skills "Snap Shots" reader, and will be focusing on writing complete sentences based on questions about key details from the given story. Students will also continue practicing key skills, like, oral language exercises, vowel sounds, understanding nouns, and reviewing tricky words.
- Knowledge Students will continue learning about the human body and the different systems and
 organs that make up the human body. Students will be able to label and draw the systems and parts of
 the human body throughout the coming weeks.
- **Writing** Students will continue learning about the writing process, and building onto their informational writing about the human body.
- **Math** Students will continue working on chapter 3, which focuses on addition from 1-10. Students will be learning how to make addition sentences, addition stories, and solving addition word problems.
- **Science & Social Studies** will be integrated through our language arts program, CKLA, throughout the year. Students will begin their unit of study on the human body.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT ISSUE 1



What is Issue 1?

Issue 1 is a proposed amendment to the Ohio Constitution that would endanger the health and safety of women, threaten parental rights, and allow for abortion through all nine months of pregnancy. Ohioans will vote on November 7, 2023, whether to make this change to the Ohio Constitution.

What would Issue 1 do?

Put women at risk:

 Health and safety standards in Ohio could be eliminated. Doctors could no longer need to examine a woman or explain the risks of the abortion procedure ahead of time.

Threaten parental rights:

• A fifteen-year-old could have an abortion without her parents knowing. Current Ohio law requires parental notification and consent before a child under 18 can obtain an abortion. These parental right protections could be removed as they directly conflict with the amendment which would allow all individuals, including minors, to make their own reproductive decisions.

Allow for abortions of fully formed babies:

 Abortion would be legal through all 9 months of pregnancy. Physicians at an abortion clinic could use a woman's age or emotional well-being as a reason to perform an abortion in the 3rd trimester.

Would abortion be illegal in Ohio if Issue 1 does not pass?

If Issue 1 does not pass, abortion would still be legal in Ohio until a baby's heartbeat can be detected. This standard was challenged in court and placed on hold, allowing for abortions up to 22 weeks as of September 15, 2023. Current laws that protect the safety of women and parental rights would stay in effect.

Doesn't Issue 1 simply restore Ohio back to when Roe v. Wade was in effect?

Issue 1 goes dangerously beyond what was legalized in the Roe v. Wade ruling. It opens the door to remove important health and safety measures that protect women, threatens parental consent and notification of any minor seeking an abortion, and allows for abortion through all nine months of pregnancy.

Will miscarriage care or ectopic pregnancy treatment be denied if Issue 1 fails?

The passing or failure of Issue 1 will have no effect on the care a pregnant woman receives when her life is in danger, even if the treatment results in the loss of life of her unborn child. There is a fundamental difference between an elective abortion and the care provided after a miscarriage or for ectopic pregnancies. Women can always receive lifesaving treatment, including in Catholic hospitals. No law restricts this care in Ohio or any other state in the country.

How is the Church helping pregnant women in need?

For decades, numerous Catholic social service agencies, in collaboration with faith-based and secular organizations, have assisted pregnant women in need with material resources and personal accompaniment during pregnancy and after their child is born. Project Rachel helps those struggling post-abortion. Every woman should be able to depend upon a community for support and the Catholic Church remains committed to woman in need.
