

Third Grade Reading Guarantee

On Tuesday and Wednesday, our third grade students will be administered a very important state reading test. The Third Grade Reading Guarantee requires that all third grade students pass this test in order to be promoted to 4th grade. Students will have multiple testing opportunities this year to demonstrate reading proficiency. These two early tests will provide good indicators of where each third grader reader's present reading level is.



Honor Flight America 250 Service Project

Saint of the Month

Pope St. John Paul II

Pope St. John Paul II (1920–2005), born Karol Józef Wojtyła in Poland, was pope from 1978 to 2005 — one of the longest pontificates in history. He was the first non-Italian pope in over 450 years and played a major role in ending communism in Eastern Europe, especially in his native Poland.

A deeply spiritual and charismatic leader, he emphasized human dignity, the sanctity of life, interfaith dialogue, and the "theology of the body." He survived an assassination attempt in 1981, later forgiving his attacker. Canonized in 2014, he is remembered as a saint who inspired millions through his faith, intellect, and compassion.




A Note on Water Bottles

In the Classroom

What's coming in the next weeks...



Preschool

- **Religion** – Students will learn about how God made food and water. Students will learn about the role of food and water both in the church and to help people, plants, and animals live and grow.
- **Language Arts** – Students are rhyming through nursery rhymes. Students are clapping out syllables in names of students in preschool class. Students are listening and counting our sounds made by musical instruments.
- **Math** – Students will begin a unit on 2D shapes identifying shapes and their characteristics.
- Science & Social Studies unit focus: Students will begin a unit in trees. First learning about parts of trees and different places and habitats where trees are found.
- **Science and Social Studies** will be integrated through our language arts program, CKLA, throughout the year.
- **Art** – Students are working on their secondary colors and developing fine motor skills.
- **Music** – Students will be singing nonsense songs and dancing actions songs.
- **Gym** – Students will complete obstacle courses and practice following two and three step directions while exercising gross motor skills.

Kindergarten

- **Religion** – Students are learning about St. Pope John Paul II. They will begin learning about All Saints and All Souls Day. Parents and students will pick a saint and prepare for the All Saints School Mass. They will continue learning about the Holy Trinity.
- **Language Arts** – Students will focus on the following letter sounds: n, h, s, f, v, z, p, e and their corresponding spellings. Students will also begin learning “tricky words”, which are words that do not follow the typical rules of phonics and cannot be sounded out.
- **Math** – Students will begin their unit of study on measurement. They will compare lengths, widths, and height.
- **Science & Social Studies** will be integrated through our language arts program, CKLA, throughout the year. Students will finish their unit of study on the five senses and will begin their new unit on classic stories.
- **Art** – Students are working on a fall pastel project developing their use of a new medium.
- **Music** - Students will be singing and dancing game and seasonal songs.
- **Gym** – Students will begin an underhand throwing unit.

Grade 1

- **Religion** – Students are learning about St. Pope John Paul II. They will begin learning about All Saints and All Souls Day. Parents and students will pick a saint and prepare for the All Saints School Mass. They will continue learning about the Holy Trinity.
- **Language Arts** - Students will continue to read words with the double e spelling pattern, review tricky words, spell words with the ‘th’ digraph, and will begin reading words with silent e. Students are reading stories from “Gran”, focusing on print concepts, and answering literal, inferential, and evaluative comprehension questions.
- **Knowledge** - Students will continue their unit on fairytales and folktales. They will focus on the story, “Little Red Riding Hood”, and discuss the similarities and differences between two other stories.
- **Writing** - Students will begin correcting sentences by checking for capital letters, punctuation, spacing between words, and correct letter formation.

- **Math** – Students will make patterns using 2D and 3D shapes, and will wrap up their chapter on shapes.
- **Science & Social Studies** will be integrated through our language arts program, CKLA, throughout the year. Students will study some countries and continents from the stories in their unit of Knowledge.
- **Art** – Students have begun their latest project and are learning how to print.
- **Music** - Students will be singing call and response songs.
- **Gym** – Students will begin an underhand throwing unit.

Grade 2

- **Religion** – Students are learning about St. Pope John Paul II. They will begin learning about All Saints and All Souls Day. Parents and students will pick a saint and prepare for the All Saints School Mass. They will continue learning about the Holy Trinity.
- **Knowledge** - Students are finishing up their studies on Ancient Asian Civilization, learning about the contribution of silk and The Great Wall of China, as well as the teachings of Confucius.
- **Skills** – Students are reviewing the doubling rule when adding suffix -ed, working on long vowels with magic e, have begun their new reader, *Bedtime Tales*, which explores various fables, and are reading and spelling tricky words.
- **Writing** - Students will write about the contribution of paper and calligraphy from Ancient China, citing facts they learned from the lesson.
- **Math** - Students are practicing 3-digit subtraction with and without regrouping, and will learn about subtraction across zero.
- **Science & Social Studies** will be integrated through our language arts program, CKLA, throughout the year. Students are continuing to learn about the characteristics of a civilization, focusing on the Yellow River Valley in ancient China.
- **Art** – Students are learning about various brush strokes and patterns in art.
- **Music** – Students will learn about musical language and rhythm notes.
- **Gym & Health** - Students will wrap up their frisbee unit.

Grade 3

- **Religion** - Students will be learning about Christ's first miracle, the Wedding Feast at Cana.
- **CKLA** – Students are researching and categorizing living things using terms like cold-blooded, vertebrate, etc.
- **Writing** - Students will continue to learn how to write a narrative.
- **Math** – Students will be completing Chapter 3 subtracting numbers within 10,000 with and without regrouping.
- **Science & Social Studies** will be integrated through our language arts program, CKLA, throughout the year.
- **Art** – Students are learning about color blending as they start by preparing their background piece for the fall project.
- **Music** – Students will be learning about musical form and singing canon.
- **Gym & Health** – Students are perfecting their frisbee throw and beginning Ultimate Frisbee.

Grade 4

- **Religion** – Students will continue learning about Sin and how the Fall of Man affects mankind today.
- **Language Arts** – Students are creating opinions about the roles and freedoms of various groups in the Middle Ages for their persuasive paragraphs
- **Math** – Students will continue a unit on multiplication and division.
- **Science** – Students will finish their unit on forces and energy.
- **Social Studies** – Students are detailing the changes brought about in the Middle Ages and their impacts on various groups in society
- **Art** – Students are painting a background for their Scarecrow painting.

- **Music** - Students will start learning about breathing techniques and singing easy songs.
- **Gym & Health** – Students will be developing their abilities to throw and catch a frisbee. They will then use these skills to play Ultimate Frisbee.

Grade 5

- **Religion** – Students will learn about the Sacraments of Initiation.
- **Language Arts** – Students are finishing their unit of study on Poetry, and will be compiling all of their original poems into a Poetry Portfolio.
- **Math (Smith)** – Students are learning to multiply and divide fractions.
- **Math (Lewis)** – Students are currently working on multiplying fractions.
- **Science** – Students are learning about the properties of matter and chemical reactions.
- **Social Studies** – Students will wrap up our chapter on Portuguese Exploration and begin our chapter on Christopher Columbus.
- **Art** – Students are starting their Dinosaur terrain background papers.
- **Music** - Students will read and play rhythmic ensembles.
- **Gym & Health** – Students will continue their frisbee unit.

Grade 6

- **Religion** – Students will learn about Conscience through the story of Cain and Abel.
- **Language Arts** – Students will finish reading the novel, *Boy*, by Roald Dahl. To culminate their study of personal narratives, they will write original personal narratives.
- **Math** – Students will begin a chapter on ratios. They will explore how ratios are used to compare two quantities, determine equivalent ratios, and solve real-world problems involving ratios.
- **Science** – Students are learning about geological features and changes to Earth's surface.
- **Social Studies** – Students will finish our chapter on the Punic Wars and begin our chapter on Julius Caesar and the Age of Augustus.
- **Art** – Students have started to plan their compassion layouts.
- **Music** – Students will read and write sheet music and practice choir techniques.
- **Gym & Health** – Students will be playing Ultimate Frisbee.

Grade 7

- **Religion** – Students will finish their unit on the Mysteries of the Rosary. They will learn about the communion of saints and begin their study of the 4 Gospels.
- **Language Arts** – Students will continue reading *Strange Case of Jekyll and Hyde*, complete Vocabulary Workshop unit 5, and continue a grammar unit on verbs.
- **Math** – Students will wrap up their chapter on algebraic expressions. They will begin a chapter on solving algebraic equations and inequalities.
- **Science** – Students will finish a unit on weather and climate.
- **Social Studies** – Students will begin Chapter 4: The American Revolution.
- **Art** – Students are working with watercolor and watercolor pencils on a wooded scene/lake.
- **Music** - Students will read and write sheet music and practice voice techniques.
- **Gym & Health** – Students will continue their training for the Turkey Trot run/walk scheduled for the end of November. They will also continue to play Ultimate (Frisbee).

Grade 8

- **Religion** – Students will begin their study of church history.
- **Language Arts** – Students will complete their final essay for the trimester - a film critique based upon the story "Lost Hearts". Students will also continue to work with verb tense.
- **Math (May)** – Students will be solving complex algebraic linear equations and determining the number of solutions to linear equations.
- **Math (Poux)** – Students will graph linear inequalities and then work with graphing and applications of systems of equations.
- **Science** – Students will continue a unit on Earth's geologic history.
- **Social Studies** – Students will begin to study the history of the late 1800s and early 1900s, focusing on immigration patterns and the Industrial Revolution.
- **Art** – Students are working on pumpkins for fall.
- **Music** - Students will read and write sheet music and practice choir techniques.
- **Gym & Health** – Students will train for the Turkey Trot run/walk scheduled for the end of November and play various frisbee games.


