

Pre-Kindergarten and Kindergarten Registration for next year is ongoing. Parents who are interested in St. Cecilia should contact the school office to schedule a screening.




HONOR FLIGHT

In the Classroom

What's coming in the next weeks...



Preschool

- **Religion** – Students will begin a God Made Land Unit. Students will learn about different types of terrain that God created to make the Earth unique and beautiful. Students will talk about being thankful as Thanksgiving approaches.
- **Language Arts** – Students will sort words by rhyming sounds ock, am, ee, at. Students will count words in sentences. Students will learn the letters l & d and their sounds. PreK will learn about the life cycle of trees and what types of animals live in trees. Students will construct bird's nests and make bird feeders.
- **Math** – Students will learn to identify the names and properties of 2D shapes.
- **Science and Social Studies** will be integrated through our language arts program, CKLA, throughout the year.
- **Art** – *Teacher did not submit*
- **Music** – Students will sing different poems and tongue twisters.
- **Gym** – Students will participate in Thanksgiving themed relay races.

Kindergarten

- **Religion** – *Teacher did not submit*
- **Language Arts** – Students will continue to focus on the letter sounds: n, h, s, f, v, z, p, e and their corresponding spellings. They will read CVC words containing these letter sounds and letter sounds learned in the previous unit.
- **Math** – Students will finish up their chapter on measurement. They will begin comparing numbers within 10, using math terms such as “greater than”, “more than”, “fewer than”, and “less than”.
- **Science & Social Studies** will be integrated through our language arts program, CKLA, throughout the year. Students will continue their unit of study on classic stories and folktales. They will listen to stories, answer comprehension questions, and will determine the characters, setting, and plot within each story.
- **Art** – *Teacher did not submit*
- **Music** - Students will sing different poems and tongue twisters.
- **Gym** – Students will continue working on underhand throwing and rolling. Students will also learn how to catch with 2 hands.

Grade 1

- **Religion** – *Teacher did not submit.*
- **Language Arts** - Students will continue reading words with double ee and silent e, review tricky words, and spell words with the long a and long i patterns. Students are reading stories from “Gran” and will begin reading stories from “Fables”, and will be answering literal, inferential, and evaluative comprehension questions.
- **Knowledge** - Students will continue learning about Ancient Mesopotamia and Ancient Egypt. They will be comparing and contrasting the two different civilizations, focusing on their farming, leaders, religion, writing, and cities.
- **Writing** - Students will practice writing complete sentences, checking for spelling, punctuation, and capitalization. Students will write sentences about farming, religion, leaders, writing, and cities within Mesopotamia and Egypt in their unit of Knowledge.
- **Math** – Students will wrap up their chapter on numbers to 20, and begin their chapter on addition and subtraction within 20.

- **Science & Social Studies** will be integrated through our language arts program, CKLA, throughout the year. Students will continue learning about Ancient Mesopotamia and Ancient Egypt civilizations.
- **Art** – *Teacher did not submit.*
- **Music** - Students will sing different poems, songs and tongue twisters and discussing about their meanings.
- **Gym** – Students will continue working on underhand throwing and rolling. Students will work on control while throwing various distances.

Grade 2

- **Religion** – *Teacher did not submit.*
- **Knowledge** - Students have begun studying Ancient Greek Civilization, building upon prior knowledge of the elements of a civilization. Students will learn about city-states Sparta and Athens, Mount Olympus and gods/goddesses of Greek Myths, and contributions of ancient Greece, such as the Olympics, democracy and the marathon.
- **Writing** - Students will write descriptive paragraphs about their disguised turkeys for our Thanksgiving project and will write a book report on a story from our reader, *Bedtime Tales*.
- **Skills** - Students are reading and spelling -er, -ar and -or patterns, as well as reviewing contractions and quotation marks. Students will continue to read fables from the reader, *Bedtime Stories*, practicing finding text evidence and identifying setting, characters, plot and moral.
- **Math** - Students are studying Ch.4 Addition and Subtraction with Bar Models, where students will add and subtract using part-whole and comparison bar models.
- **Science & Social Studies** will be integrated through our language arts program, CKLA, throughout the year. Students are studying Ancient Greek Civilization, learning about important figures, such as Alexander the Great and about historical battles, such as the Battle of Thermopylae.
- **Art** – *Teacher did not submit.*
- **Music** – Students will be learning about musical language and how to write and read notes and rhythms.
- **Gym & Health** - Students will begin working with scoops and balls. Students will work on hand-eye coordination and control while throwing, rolling, catching and scooping.

Grade 3

- **Religion** - Students will begin learning about the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy.
- **CKLA** – Students will finish learning about all the animal kingdoms and begin their animal research project
- **Writing** - Students will continue to work on their personal narratives and complete an animal research project (aligned with CKLA).
- **Math** – Students are working diligently on their multiplication tables. Currently we are working multiplying by 7 and 8.
- **Science & Social Studies** will be integrated through our language arts program, CKLA, throughout the year.
- **Art** – *Teacher did not submit.*
- **Music** – Students will be singing canons with 2, 3 and 4 voices.
- **Gym & Health** – Third grade is learning about techniques and skills related to frisbee and scoop toss, while getting our endurance ready for the Turkey Trot.

Grade 4

- **Religion** – Students are finishing their Unit on Sin and the Fall of Adam and Eve.
- **Language Arts** – Students are reading about Arabia and writing a historical fiction to connect to the lives of people during the Middle Ages
- **Math** – Students will complete a unit on multiplication and division.
- **Science** – Students have begun a Unit on Energy, learning about the different kinds of energy.
- **Social Studies** – Students are learning and presenting about the lives of people during the Middle Ages.
- **Art** – *Teacher did not submit.*
- **Music** - Students will be singing different sacred and liturgy songs.
- **Gym & Health** – Students will be participating in Physical Fitness stations related to the Presidential Physical Fitness Challenge.

Grade 5

- **Religion** – Students are wrapping up their unit on Baptism and where Baptism is found in the Bible.
- **Language Arts** – Students are reading *Don Quixote*. They are also studying subject-verb agreement.
- **Math (Smith)** – Students will be dividing fractions.
- **Math (Lewis)** – Students will complete a unit on multiplying and dividing fractions. The students will complete a formal assessment and begin a unit on decimals.
- **Science** – *Not Submitted.*
- **Social Studies** – Students will complete chapters 8 and 9 in their readers, learning about France and the Fur Trade and Dutch traders as well.
- **Art** – *Teacher did not submit.*
- **Music** - Students will play a rhythm ensemble in small band-groups.
- **Gym & Health** – Students have been building up their running for the Turkey Trot.

Grade 6

- **Religion** – Students are learning about the Tower of Babel and other stories in the book of Genesis.
- **Language Arts** – Students are reading the Sherlock Holmes short story, “The Red Headed League”. They are also studying verb tenses.
- **Math** – Students will apply what they have been learning about ratios to solve problems involving rates, unit rates, distance, and speed.
- **Science** – *Not Submitted*
- **Social Studies** – Students will read the last chapter in our reader about how ancient Greece and Rome influenced cultures today, and we will take our unit test on Thursday.
- **Art** – *Teacher did not submit.*
- **Music** – Students will practice voice and choir technique and will sing a 2 voices song.
- **Gym & Health** – Students are preparing for the Turkey Trot, and are playing Ultimate Frisbee.

Grade 7

- **Religion** – Students will continue to study Scripture with a focus on the Gospels. They will also review about this month’s Saint, St. Hildegard of Bingen.
- **Language Arts** – Students will finish an argumentative essay, complete a vocabulary unit and begin a unit on poetry and short stories.
- **Math** – Students will be finding solutions to multi-step algebraic inequalities and graphing their solutions on a number line.
- **Science** – Students will continue a unit on the Earth-Moon-Sun system.
- **Social Studies** – Students are studying the events leading up to the Revolutionary War.
- **Art** – *Teacher did not submit.*
- **Music** - Students will be learning about opera and singing one Aria by reading it from the staff.

- **Gym & Health** – Students will continue training for the Turkey Trot runs and walk and play Ultimate Frisbee in gym

Grade 8


- **Religion** – Students will continue to study the early Church and work on a Newspaper project for their first grade of the trimester. They will also review about this month's Saint, St. Hildegard of Bingen.
- **Language Arts** – Students will work with complements and will complete *The Pearl* by John Steinbeck.
- **Math (May)** – Students will continue solving one- and two- variable algebraic equations and inequalities. They will conclude the unit with an end-of-chapter assessment.
- **Math (Poux)** – Students are finishing this chapter and will then take a Unit 2 quarter exam (required by Roger Bacon). They'll then move on to Unit 3 where they will work once again with the rules of exponents.
- **Science** – Students will finish a unit on Geologic time.
- **Social Studies** – Students will study European maps and complete The Industrial Revolution post-Civil War leading up to the 20th Century
- **Art** – *Teacher did not submit*
- **Music** - Students will practice their music notation by writing a music sheet and will sing one liturgy song.
- **Gym & Health** – Students will continue training for the Turkey Trot runs and walk and play Ultimate Frisbee in gym
