### Upcoming State Tests

In two weeks, students in grades 3-8 will be administered their State of Ohio ELA Tests. These are important tests for all students as their scores will be part of the academic permanent records.

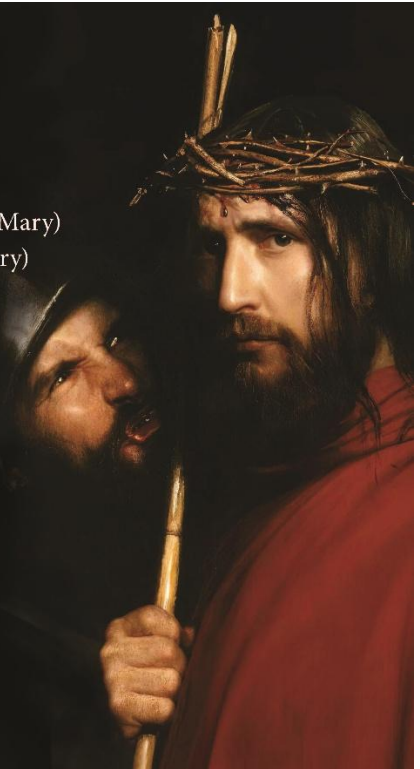

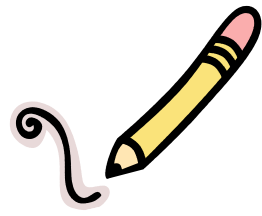

# In the Classroom



What's coming in the next weeks...

## Preschool

- **Religion** – Students will learn about how God made butterflies and then begin learning about the Easter season.
- **Language Arts** – Students will continue learning their letters and the sounds they make. They will continue working on counting syllables in a word.
- **Math** – Students will continue their unit on measurement and start learning about volume.
- **Science and Social Studies** will be integrated through our language arts program, CKLA, throughout the year. Students will begin learning about the tools used to make buildings.
- **Art** – Students are working on their spring flowers creating Zadinsky circles.
- **Music** – Students will be practicing how to keep a steady beat by dancing, clapping, marching and other activities.
- **Gym** – *Not Submitted*

## Kindergarten

- **Religion** – Students will learn about St. Pier Giorgio Frassati and the character trait adventurous. They will continue learning about the Life of Jesus, including His 40 days in the desert.
- **Language Arts** – Students will learn new tricky words and will read them in the context of the decodable unit reader, *Sam*. Students will also move from reading individual words to reading connected text. In addition, students will be introduced to 14 double-letter spellings for consonant sounds.
- **Math** – Students will learn to subtract fluently within 5. They will also learn two different strategies to subtract within 10: counting back and using a ten frame.
- **Science & Social Studies** will be integrated through our language arts program, CKLA, throughout the year. Students will study kings, queens, and royal families. They will hear both fiction and nonfiction stories that will build their understanding of the responsibilities, lifestyle, and customs associated with royalty throughout history.
- **Art** – Students are working on their spring nests.-
- **Music** – Students will be practicing rhythms by playing a single-note percussion instrument.
- **Gym** – Students will begin a unit focused on jumping.

## Grade 1

- **Religion** – Students will learn about St. Pier Giorgio Frassati and the character trait adventurous. They will learn about the beatitudes and Jesus, teaching us how to be happy. They will continue learning about Lent and Jesus' 40 days in the desert.
- **Language Arts** - Students are reading and spelling words with suffixes (ed and ing), reading words with soft g and tch, differentiating between statements and questions, and reading and writing tricky words. Students will continue reading stories from "Kate's Book".
- **Knowledge** - Students will continue their unit of study on the history of the Earth. Students will learn about the three types of rocks, fossils, and dinosaurs.
- **Writing** - Students will be introduced to opinion writing, and will begin planning and drafting an opinion paragraph about stories from their Skills reader.
- **Math** – Students have begun learning about numbers to 120. They will review how to count on from numbers using tens and ones. Students will focus on place value and comparing numbers within 120.

- **Science & Social Studies** will be integrated through our language arts program, CKLA, throughout the year. Students are studying the history of the Earth in Knowledge.
- **Art** – Students are working on their spring nests.
- **Music** – Students will be practicing coordinated movements and rhythms with and without percussion instruments.
- **Gym** – Students will begin a unit focused on jumping.

## Grade 2

- **Religion** – Students will learn about St. Pier Giorgio Frassati and the character trait adventurous. They will learn the parts of the Mass- Liturgy of the Word and Eucharist. They will continue learning about Lent and Jesus' 40 days in the desert.
- **Knowledge** - Students are studying Westward Expansion, learning about the hardships pioneers endured moving west. Students will learn about important innovations, transportation, and communication during this time.
- **Writing** - Students are drafting personal narratives and will edit and revise before publishing their final drafts.
- **Skills** - Students are reading and spelling -er, -ir and -ur patterns, will review singular and plural nouns, and will be introduced to a new reader "The Job Hunt". Students are also practicing fluency and comprehension strategies.
- **Math** - Students are studying multiplication tables, focusing on skip counting by 2s, 5s, 10s, 3s and 4s.
- **Science & Social Studies** will be integrated through our language arts program, CKLA, throughout the year. Students are studying Westward Expansion in Knowledge.
- **Art** – Students are working on spring nest project.
- **Music** – Students will practice and create their own rhythm phrases individually and in groups.
- **Gym & Health** - Students will finish their pickleball unit.

## Grade 3

- **Religion** – Students are learning about Jesus' Crucifixion and death and how Jesus dies for our sins.
- **CKLA** – Students are continuing their hard work outlining and drafting multiparagraph opinion essays about a range of topics from field trip destinations to the best class pet.
- **Writing** – Students will be wrapping up their biography unit and will be doing state test prep.
- **Math** – Students will continue to learn about measurements using cubic inches and cubic centimeters.
- **Science & Social Studies** will be integrated through our language arts program, CKLA, throughout the year.
- **Art** – Students are beginning a new spring project.
- **Music** – Students will finish their ear training unit and begin an instruments unit.
- **Gym & Health** – Students will begin getting outside to practice push-ups, curls, and lunges followed by kickball to practice saying names and encouragement to teammates in any sport

## Grade 4

- **Religion** – Students are presenting their Works of Mercy Projects that they finished last week.
- **Language Arts** – Students will finish reading examples of multiparagraph essays and begin writing their own using evidence to prove their claims.
- **Math** – Students will complete a unit on area and perimeter.
- **Science** – Students are learning about fossils, ancient remains, and changes to Earth's surface over time.
- **Social Studies** – Students are starting to learn about and read important documents like The Constitution, Declaration of Independence, and speeches from various leaders.
- **Art** – Students are working on a new Picasso piece.
- **Music** – Students will practice and perform a 2 voices choral sing.

- **Gym & Health** – Students will finish their pickleball unit.

## Grade 5

- **Religion** – Students are learning about the Last Supper and the Eucharist.
- **Language Arts** – Students will continue reading the detective story, *The Badlands Sleuth*.
- **Math** (Wolfe) – Students wrap up their work on Number Patterns and Line Plots and begin a quick unit on Polygons.
- **Math** (Lewis) – Students began working on polygons, identifying polygons, identifying and classifying triangles.
- **Science** – Students are engaged in scientific research as they write their planet report. Their next unit of study is Motion and Forces.
- **Social Studies** – Students will continue to learn about Feudal Japan.
- **Art** – Students are finishing their spring project.
- **Music** – Students will practice and perform a song on xylophones as a group.
- **Gym & Health** – Students will finish their Pickleball unit.

## Grade 6

- **Religion** – Students are finishing up their unit on the Exodus and the 10 Commandments.
- **Language Arts** – Students will continue reading *A Long Walk to Water*. They will also be studying pronouns.
- **Math** – Students will locate and name points in a coordinate plane, draw and identify polygons in a coordinate plane, and solve real-world problems involving a coordinate plane.
- **Science** – Students consider Energy and States of Matter.
- **Social Studies** – Students will continue to learn about the Industrial Revolution.
- **Art** – Students are beginning their clay project.
- **Music** – Students will practice and perform a choral song with 2 different voices.
- **Gym & Health** – Students will finish their Pickleball unit.

## Grade 7

- **Religion** – Students will be studying the Sacrament of Confirmation in preparation for those who are Catholic to receive the Sacrament. They'll also learn some more about our saint of the month, Pier Giorgio Frassati.
- **Language Arts** – Students will finish a grammar unit on modifiers, complete vocabulary unit 14, and read a *Phineas Gage: A Gruesome But True Story about Brain Science*.
- **Math** – Students will continue their unit on statistics and probability. They will calculate the probability of independent events, approximate probabilities and relative frequencies, and develop probability models.
- **Science** – Students will continue a unit on the properties of matter.
- **Social Studies** – Students will finish their unit on the War of 1812.
- **Art** – Students are completing their floral project.
- **Music** – Students will practice songs as a band playing different instruments.
- **Gym & Health** – Students will finish their Pickleball unit.

## Grade 8

- **Religion** – Students will begin to learn about the Holy Roman Empire and it's first Emperor, Charlemagne in the west. They will learn about how the rise of Islam in the East led to the Crusades. They will also learn some more about our saint of the month, Pier Giorgio Frassati.
- **English** – Students will be creating graphic organizers for an argumentative and literary essay; they will also continue to work with prefixes, suffixes, and Latin roots and begin a unit on clauses.
- **Reading** – Students will be analyzing argumentative essays

- **Math (May)** – Students will solve problems involving volume and surface area of cylinders, cones, pyramids, and spheres.
- **Math (Poux)** – Students will finish up unit 4, review it, and take their test. They will then begin to prepare for the State Algebra I test (which they'll take in place of the Grade 8 test).
- **Science** – Students will begin a unit on evolution.
- **Social Studies** – Students will continue to study World War II.
- **Art** – Students are working on their 1920's art project.
- **Music** – Students will perform songs on xylophones.
- **Gym & Health** – Students will wrap up their floor hockey prior to Easter Break.

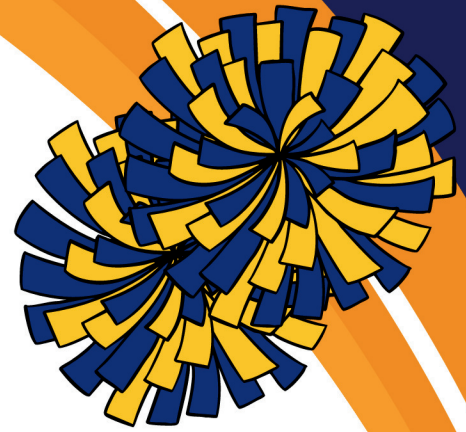
