Living Laudato Si': Food- As part of its yearlong focus on the call of Pope Francis to care for our common home, the Earth, Holy Trinity Church will host a panel discussion about food and its meaning, preservation, storage, and disposal. Wed., January 17, at 7:00 p.m. in the Multipurpose Building. Experts in the areas of theology, the environment, food preparation and storage, and composting will discuss these issues and offer practical steps for individuals and families. Speaker Tim Darst of Kentucky Interfaith Power and Light will discuss why reducing food waste is a sacred act. Chef Hank Levitt of the Common Table will present ideas on purchasing and storing food to reduce waste, and Bethany Pratt of the Jefferson County Cooperative Extension Office will talk about how to compost. Faith Formation

Confirmation Classes for Adults - "Be sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit." It is never too late to receive the Grace of this important Sacrament. It is not unusual that one not have received the Sacrament of Confirmation as a young person. For this reason, St. Christopher parish offers a preparation program for adults of all ages. The preparation for adults is guite different from that of children or young teens. The process is one of a small-group, adult learning experience. The focus of the program is to connect the practice of our Catholic Faith to our experiences in our everyday lives. For many who participate in this program, it is an opportunity to see, for the first time, the faith of the Church with an adult understanding. Ideas formed in childhood are challenged, developed and nuanced. The resources are varied and many and they include a scripture study of the Book of Acts, The US Catholic Catechism for Adults, the Bible and some of the Vatican II documents. Participants will look at how their image of God affects the way they are in relationship with Him and spend significant time connecting daily life with the underlying meaning of incarnation and Eucharist. Classes begin February 11, 2018.

RCIA - We offer an opportunity to come together in a small group to learn more about our faith. Sessions focus on the teachings and experience of Church and prepare individuals to celebrate the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist during the Easter season. You are welcome to participate in the process with your questions, your insights and your faith story in a warm accepting setting. For information please contact Glory Kramer.



WORSHIP

READING 1

1 SM 3:3B-10, 19

Samuel was sleeping in the temple of the LORD where the ark of God was. The LORD called to Samuel, who answered, "Here I am." Samuel ran to Eli and said, "Here I am. You called me." "I did not call you, " Eli said. "Go back to sleep." So he went back to sleep.

Again the LORD called Samuel, who rose and went to Eli. "Here I am, "he said. "You called me." But Eli answered, "I did not call you, my son. Go back to sleep."

At that time Samuel was not familiar with the LORD, because the LORD had not revealed anything to him as yet. The LORD called Samuel again, for the third time. Getting up and going to Eli, he said, "Here I am. You called me."

Then Eli understood that the LORD was calling the youth. So he said to Samuel, "Go to sleep, and if you are called, reply, Speak, LORD, for your servant is listening." When Samuel went to sleep in his place, the LORD came and revealed his presence, calling out as before, "Samuel, Samuel!" Samuel answered, "Speak, for your servant is listening."

Samuel grew up, and the LORD was with him, not permitting any word of his to be without effect.


"What are you looking for?"
