The Archdiocese Returns to Distribution of the Precious Blood at Communion

Archbishop Shelton Fabre has announced that the Archdiocese will reinstate permission to distribute the Precious Blood to the faithful from the Chalice at weekend Masses on the Feast of Corpus Christi. June 10-11. Since 1978, the Bishops of the United States have encouraged the distribution of the Precious Blood regularly, noting that this "is the fullest sign and most perfect fulfillment of what the Lord did and directed." As always, reception from the Chalice is optional and those who are ill, infirm, or have compromised immune systems should be reassured that our Church also teaches that Jesus Christ is truly and wholly present under both species of bread and wine. Our parish and the especially through The Record Archdiocese, newspaper, will be using this opportunity to provide you with renewed catechesis on the precious gift of Jesus Christ that we have been given in the Holy Eucharist.





The Feast of Corpus Christi, also known as the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, is a solemnity celebrating the Real Presence of the Body

and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. This year the feast falls on June 8, 2023, and on that date and following, we will once again be invited to receive Holy Communion under both species of bread and wine. Please note, Catholicism teaches that Christ is sacramentally (and equally) present under each species, and therefore, if a person receives only one species, Christ is fully present and nothing is lacking. However, Holy Communion will again be administered under both kinds. We will have a workshop for current ministers and anyone who might be interested in this ministry. The Archdiocese of Louisville is committed to ensuring that children and youth who worship, study or participate in church-sponsored activities can do so in the safest and most secure setting possible. In an effort to fulfill this commitment, **ALL** employees or volunteers who have contact with children or youth (18 and under) for **ANY** length of time are required to participate in one of the 2-hour Safe Environment Training Workshops.

Check with Parish Office to see if you are up to date with your training. If you have ever been to a training, you will not need to attend a live session, but will take a very simple refresher course online. However, for those who are attending for the first time, the next session will be Monday, May 15th, at 6:30 pm at St. James, Elizabethtown, at Batcheldor Hall.

- You must arrive at least 15 minutes prior to the workshop start time listed, in order to complete paperwork. Failure to do so will result in your having to take the class again. Signup sheets will be available – no early registration necessary.
- All registrants must attend/stay the ENTIRE 2-hour presentation, and finish completion paperwork. You will need to bring paperwork back to the Parish Office for the files.
- Important reminder: No one under the age of 18 will be admitted. This includes infants. Also, anyone 18 or older who is in a supervisory role with children MUST have a criminal background check. (Anyone under 18 is not to be given an adult supervisory role of minors.)

If your training and/or background is older than 5 years, contact the Parish Office to receive refresher information. Also, if you cannot attend this upcoming session, but know you will be working with minors, there are two more sessions scheduled in Louisville before the end of summer: May 16th at Holy Spirit, and June 13th at St. Andrew Academy (both at 6:30 pm).
