#### FROM THE DESK OF OUR PASTOR

A few weeks ago, I got a text from my niece...a text that brought joy to my heart, and tears to my eyes, because it was the first time that I laid eyes on my great niece., her daughter. No, she had not yet been born...she texted me a picture of the ultrasound that had been taken just a short time before.

I stared, in awe, at the picture...in awe of God's amazing love, in awe of this creation that I have not yet met, but whom I love so very much, in awe of the life that pulses within this child already at 19 weeks after conception. I also considered the fact that this beautiful child could still legally be aborted, and sadness filled my heart.

This weekend, we remember a historic decision made by the US Supreme Court on January 22, 1973. We remember a decision that is still contentious today, and I believe, calls each of us to work even harder for a world in which all life is valued, treasured, and recognized for its sacredness.

The good news is this... The abortion rate in the United States has fallen to its lowest level since *Roe v. Wade* Supreme Court decision legalized abortion nationwide. But, there are still over 3,000 abortions in the US and about 125,000 worldwide each day. Yes, the abortion rate has been declining for decades, but, of course, we must still work for the rights of the unborn, for an increase in the awareness of the sanctity of all life, and for the healing of men and women whose lives have been impacted by abortion.

I hope that you will join with me in a Nine Day Novena for Life available in the Gathering Area as one way for us to do this. To allow ourselves time over the next nine days to pray for an end to abortion in our country and in our world, and for a true sense of the beauty and sacredness of all life. Let us pray for the teens and adults from our parish who will attend the Pro Life Rally in Washington, DC next weekend. And may our prayer continue in the days, weeks, months and years ahead...remembering that with God, all things are possible, and that our prayers truly make a difference.

And by the way, I would like to introduce you to my latest great niece at 19 weeks...name still be to determined, due April 18. What a gift.

## 15 MINUTES OF ADORATION AFTER ALL MASSES THIS WEEKEND

Please plan to spend 15 minutes before the blessed sacrament after the Mass you attend this weekend as we pray together for an end to abortion and for an increase in the awareness of the sanctity of all life on the anniversary of Roe v. Wade which legalized abortion in the US. The World Health Organization estimates that there are 40-50 million abortions performed throughout the world each year (approximately 125,000 per day) and the US, there are approximately 3,000 per day or 125 per hour. Let us raise our voices in prayer to the God who gives us life. Let us pray for those who consider abortion, those who have had them, and for all of the children whose lives were ended in the womb.

"He called them, and immediately they left their boat and their father and followed him." Peter, Andrew, James, and John's lives would never be the same. They were going about their usual business--fishing on the Sea of Galilee-when Jesus approached them and said, "Come after me." And that's just what they did. "At once they left their nets and followed him." Such a quick response to such a radical request!

What compelled these men to leave their livelihood to follow the Lord? His promise to them was that he would make them "fishers of men." Perhaps they thought that promise sounded fabulous. But it seems more likely that it was Christ himself who drew the men. There must have been something utterly attractive about him, and completely trustworthy. Otherwise, it seems unbelievable that these men would have been so quick to respond to his call.

This compelling man is the same Christ who calls us. We hear his voice in a different way, of course, through the Church and through the Bible, through his Spirit in our hearts, but it is nonetheless the same Jesus of Nazareth who asks us to follow him. Have we allowed ourselves to be drawn by his voice? Are we open to a real encounter with the Lord who changes lives?

If our relationship with Jesus does not transform us, if it does not change us into different, better people moment by moment and day by day, then chances are that we are not truly encountering him. He is too powerful to be inconsequential. It might take some courage and commitment to come into authentic contact with the Lord, but when we do, our lives will never be the same.
