

## A Note from Our Pastor

#### "Joy and Gratitude"

These two words were spoken repeatedly during **Bishop Perez's** first homily after being installed as our bishop. He spoke of the joy and gratitude in his heart as he became the

11th Bishop of our diocese, the joy and gratitude that he felt for the many who had paved the way for him, from family and friends to brother priests, parishioners and those most recently in Cleveland. The words poured from his lips over and over again, with an incredible smile on his face and what everyone knew was love in his heart...he not only felt joy and gratitude, it was apparent that he **lives** joy and gratitude.

It was an honor, a privilege and a blessing to attend **Bishop Perez's** installation. Not only because of the historical nature of the event, but also to witness something beautiful in the cathedral. A true sense of peace, love, and yes, joy and gratitude filled that church as **Bishop Perez** brought those things to us. It seemed as though his very presence impacted the hearts of those present...and it brought me great hope and peace.

As we remember the 16th anniversary of September 11 this Monday, not only do I recall the horrific events of that day, but I will, as I pray that day, recall **Bishop Perez's** installation...why? Because I believe that, as we strive to bring peace into our world, we all need to be a little more like him if the peace of Christ is to reign.

I witnessed, first hand, the power that the love of one person can have, the impact that can be felt from the heart of one whose love is genuine and real and true. There was no doubt that the love was palpable, that everyone, no matter where they came from, where they had been, or where the future might take them felt his love. I would venture to guess that most, if not all, who attended the installation left wanting better for themselves and for our world.

Of course, most of us will never have the power to bring peace to every corner of our globe, and yet we can all do something to bring peace to our acre of God's world...to the acre of God's world that we inhabit. 9/11 should, of course, be a day on which we remember, but it should also be a day on which we reflect, on which we act to make peace. We should ask ourselves how we can bring reconciliation to fractured relationships, calm to tension, healing to division, understanding where there is currently an inability to understand.

We know that our world is full of discord, that peace seems elusive, that so many people are full of hatred for those who are not like them...but on this anniversary of 9/11 let us commit to doing something about a lack of peace in our own lives...to start with ourselves and let peace radiate from our hearts. We may not be able to change the world, but we can change a small part of the world with hope, and yes, with joy and with gratitude. **Bishop Perez** proved that last Tuesday.




