"I really miss going to my church."

When visiting the homebound and those in nursing facilities, it is frequently heard: "I really miss going to my church. I wish I could go to Mass and participate in parish activities."

Some of our parishioners are unable or are not healthy enough to take an active part in the various parish Masses and activities. Possibly your neighbors or a



family member are desiring to be connected to the parish. **Linked-In-Prayer is a new ministry being offered at St. John of the Cross Parish.** This new ministry is a project of the Spiritual Life Commission of the parish.

Linked-In-Prayer will be comprised of the sick, handicapped, homebound, those who live in assisted living environments and our elderly. From the comforts of where they live, they can be connected to the parish through prayer.

Linked-In-Prayer allows those who feel separated from the parish to offer their prayers, joys, sorrows and sufferings for particular needs in the parish and the universal church. Individuals are recognized as being part of a special ministry of the parish. **There are no meetings, no membership dues, and no phone calls making requests.**

A monthly letter will be sent to participants highlighting specific needs and prayer intentions of the parish. Participants are asked to pray for these petitions using a prayer book that will be provided or utilizing their present favorite prayers. The mailing will also include some insights as to how to grow in personal faith.

If a member of your family or someone else you know desires to be reconnected to the parish, they could possibly benefit from being "linked-in" to the parish through prayer. 

How do you relax and unwind? When I ask this question to clients, I use the word recreation. The word recreation is derived from the latin root "recreare" or re-create. I specifically use that word because we should use our leisure time to create

ourselves again. A good way to find out if you are recreating yourself is by reflecting on how you feel after you do your favorite leisurely activities. Do you feel better? Are you motivated to go back to work? Are you motivated to be better in your relationships? If not, maybe consider a new activity! On weekends, I'm often tempted to watch Netflix for about 10 hours straight. The times that I have done so, Mondays loom larger, I don't want to be around others, and I feel bad about myself afterwards. If I watch Netflix for a bit, then exercise, grab coffee with a friend, and finish my day with a Rosary, I feel much better and refreshed. Many activities like TV, video games, and time spent on Facebook are perfectly fine, but they can become an issue when they are our sole form of recreation. Some activities are like a cheesecakewe feel very differently after we've eaten one piece vs the entire cheesecake. Maybe take some time this week to reflect on how you recreate and how you could do better!
