Dear Parishioners,



As you know Fr. Tim Roth has been assigned to go to get a doctorate in Canon Law. This will end his assignment here in Euclid at SJC & SRW. His last day with us will be May 31. Please keep Fr. Tim in your prayers as he makes this transition in his life. I am very happy to share with that Bishop Perez has assigned Fr. Andrew Morkunas to our parish as

Parochial Vicar. His assignment is to our parish, St. John of the Cross. He will serve "part-time" here at SJC. He will also serve as the Chaplain of Hillcrest Hospital. He will live at St. Francis of Assisi Parish in Gates Mills since it is next to Hillcrest Hospital and he will be "on-call" most nights there for emergencies. Fr. Andrew will help with Masses, Confessions, Funerals, and teaching PSR, RCIA, etc. Fr. Andrew was ordained for the Archdiocese of Washington DC and has been ordained 10 years. He grew up in the Cleveland area and has asked Bishop Perez to consider him serving in the Diocese of Cleveland to be closer to his family and friends. At this time he will remain a priest of the Archdiocese of Washington DC and be "on loan" to the Diocese of



Cleveland while Bishop Perez and he discern an official transfer to our Diocese. I knew Fr. Andrew and his family when I served at St. John Vianney in Mentor where some of his family are parishioners. He seems like a great guy! He will start with us on July 1.

Fr. Thom will remain assigned to Ss. Robert & William and will work full time there. After July 1, he will only do Masses at SJC if Fr. Mehok, Fr. Andrew or myself is not available. His focus will be SRW. I will continue to share my ministry at both parishes. Please keep Fr. Tim, Fr. Andrew and all priests experiencing transition in the coming months in your prayers.

We will have our next 10th Anniversary Talk this Saturday, May 18 at 10 am in the church. We have invited Sr. Kathleen Glavich, a Sister of Notre Dame, to give a presentation. Her presentation is entitled, "In the Footsteps of the Blessed Mother." She will give her talk in the context of a May Crowning. It is free and open to everyone. Please mark your calendar.

The first reading this weekend holds one of my favorite Scripture passage- "So they shook the dust from their feet in protest against them, and went to Iconium." We have discussed boundaries many times and I have frequently written about how important it

is to have healthy boundaries in our personal relationships. This passage is always a good reminder of this fact. Those that were willing to hear the words of the disciples were delighted and glorified the Lord. Those that were either unwilling or unable to hear the words of the disciples expelled them. The last line of this passage is especially poignant- "The disciples were filled joy and the Holy Spirit." On the walk to Iconium, the disciples were not filled with regret due to those who were not converted. They were not filled with feelings of inadequacy or failure. Some people become depressed and/or anxious because of feelings of personal failure, especially when trying to help others overcome or change their problems or behaviors. We need to remember that people are responsible for their own choices and we cannot take their freedom away from them. Sometimes, we have to take a step back. It is important to note too that when the disciples were cast out of Antioch, they did not stop loving the people there. In the same way, when we take a step back from those we are unable to help, we do not stop loving them.




May Crowning & Talk
