From Our Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

In the Gospel last weekend, Jesus sends his disciples out into the world to share His peace. One of the most interesting things I noticed about this passage was how Jesus sends them out *in pairs*. Couldn't they have covered more ground if they went out individually? Then I realized why Jesus does not send

people out on their own- because we were made for relationship. A common misconception about consecrated men and women such as priests and nuns is that they were made for the single life. How sad that would be if it were true! They are just called to relationship in a different way. The reason I bring this up this week is because I see a lot of people in my line of work believing they do not need anyone else's help or love. Better yet, they like to describe themselves as "independent," as if relationships are for the weak and tepid. Those that describe themselves that way are, deep down, some of the most miserable and lonely people I have ever met. If you've ever seen Cast Away you may think that, after being stranded on an uninhabited island, Tom Hank's character was officially insane when he started speaking to a volleyball like a companion and named it Wilson. However, I tend to believe the opposite-that speaking to Wilson kept him sane. Yes, it was a strange and artificial relationship, but it kept him communicating, sharing ideas, and, in a way, loving. No man is an island as the saying goes. For your spiritual life and mental health, remember that permanent solitude and independence are illusions of happiness that will only lead to despair. God created us for each other. God created us for relationship.
