


Our Parish Mission

The first reading at this weekend's Mass has always been a good reminder against complacency. Complacency is deeply corrosive to the spiritual life and mental health. We may become complacent when we are happy with

where we are at and we are content to rest for a while instead of continuing to pursue holiness and health. Unfortunately, there are no plateaus in the journey to holiness. We are either moving towards God or away from Him. When we become complacent, pride sneaks up on us and we might believe that there is nothing left for us to work on or we lack the desire to push ourselves further. While it is good to be proud of our accomplishments and to be content with our identity, it is never good to believe that there is nothing left to change or lack the desire to pursue greatness. We must always be on fire for the Lord and constantly pursuing greater holiness. In my line of work, complacent people become stale, depressed, and anxious because they are not pursuing higher goals, self-improvement, and the Lord in prayer. The journey to Heaven is lifelong and only ends when we die, not when we reach a certain point in our spiritual lives and stop. When we are aimless, our life becomes a seedbed for mental health issues. We need to always keep the end goal in mind and be tireless in our pursuit. If you find yourself complacent, consider asking the Lord to rekindle in your heart a desire for Him and a desire for greater holiness.

In the month of September, students in Kindergarten through grade 8 completed the first round of MAP testing. MAP stands for Measurement of Academic Progress. This is the fourth year we have used this tool to assess where students are in the learning process and recognize what each student is ready to learn. These tests are taken on the computer and are adaptive and personalized for each student. As a student answers a question, the test generates the next question based on the answer. When completed, MAP assigns students a RIT score. RIT stands for Ready for Instruction Today. MAP uses this RIT scale to measure what students know, regardless of their grade level, as well as growth over time. Using the RIT score, teachers are able to meet students where they are and differentiate instruction to present material that students are ready to learn. During testing, students really focused in on being persistent and determined, the "P" and the "D" from our school theme. Students worked rigorously on the tests and understood how this test not only show teachers what he/ she knows, but how teachers are able to use results to make classroom learning more accessible. The tests will be given again in the winter and spring, and teachers will easily be able to see growth in students throughout the school year. We cannot wait to see how our Warriors thrive this school year!
