LUKE BROWN'S REFLECTION

As a counselor, some of the most common questions I get are about parenting. Parenting is not easy and is often an incredibly complicated and difficult task that requires changing and adapting to new challenges. This is especially true of the last year with everything that happened related to the pandemic. God the Father should serve as our example of an ideal parent and one of the first things I recommend is to pray for guidance as a parent. Learning to be a good parent is not only good for children's mental health, but also for the parent. Effective parenting skills and strategies can help us to remain calm, improve conflict resolution, and nurture good communication. Another recommendation I usually give is to attend a parenting class. Parenting classes can be a great place for learning new parenting skills, finding a supportive environment of other parents, and practicing or discussing new strategies. Love and Logic is an example of a parenting philosophy that has helped many adults improve their parenting skills by providing classes. If you are interested, you can find Love and Logic trainers that provide classes locally by visiting www.loveandlogic.com. A good place to start if you are curious about Love and Logic is to read Parenting with Love and Logic by Foster Cline, MD and Jim Fay. It is full of helpful suggestions and tools for raising confident and motivated children. There are no perfect parents, which means parents can always work on improving their skills and techniques. If you are interested in improving your parenting skills, consider praying about attending a parenting class or picking up some parenting books.

CALL OF LOVE MINISTRY

Call of Love is a phone outreach ministry. It is a loving process to reach out to see how people are doing, and offer to pray for them.

How does it work?

Call of Love phone helpers will reach out to the entire parish community on a regular basis, asking this question: "We are calling to see how you are and if there is anything you want us to pray for.

As a Call of Love Minister, you would be calling parishioners and basically saying we love you and want to support you in prayer. Once up and running, this phone ministry becomes a true expression of stewardship. It is building relationships of love and belonging which is the heart of a vibrant parish.

There will be teams of 4 callers who will rotate making the calls on a monthly basis. There will be an initial training session.

Call of Love is both an outreach and prayer ministry. Each team will start with prayer and end the evening in prayer, as the team will pray for all those who were contacted.

Please consider this necessary ministry. We are not asking for a lifetime commitment. The estimated start up day is June of 2021.




