Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

As I know many of you are aware, the Roman Catholic Diocese of Harrisburg filed for chapter 11 bankruptcy in February of this year. We made this decision in an effort to ensure our financial ability to both provide fair and equitable compensation for survivors of past sexual abuse and ensure the future of the missions and ministries of the Roman Catholic Church within our Diocese's territory.

In support of this effort, I have asked your Pastor (Parochial Vicar) to read this letter to all of you this weekend and again in September to ensure that we reach as many survivors as possible before the claims filing deadline. The claims filing deadline is November 13, 2020. Claims can be made confidentially. Information on how to submit a claim has been posted at every church and school within the Diocese. We have also made this information available on the Diocese's webpage and the webpage maintained by the Diocese's claims and balloting agent, Epiq Restructuring, at https://dm.epiq11.com/case/redh/info. Additionally, information will also be published at least twice in your parish's weekly bulletin and you can ask any priest within our Diocese for more information as well. I ask that you please share this information with your family and friends who are not here today. Thank you in advance for your cooperation. Please be assured of my continuing prayers and I ask that you please keep me as well as all of the priests, deacons, and consecrated religious of our Diocese in your prayers as well.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Lord.

This year has proven to be a very different and a very difficult time for our Church, our nation, our communities, and for individuals. However, is not a time to be indifferent to those around the world who are suffering and need the solidarity of other Christians to face the pandemic and life's harsh reallities.

Christian solidarity and a response to basic needs is at the heart of the Missionary Cooperative Program which our diocese sponsors each summer. To welcome a missionary priest to our parishes and listen with an open heart to his story allows each of us to hear the voice of Jesus challenging us to care for the "least ones" among our brothers and sisters in mission lands.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the decision was made to cancel in-person appeals for the summer Missionary Cooperative Program, and instead institute a "Missionary Cooperative Sunday" in your parish wherein the pastor will read an appeal letter from that missionary organization and take a special collection for its needs.

Mission talk from Fr. Patrick Kroteh, Mission Representative for the Diocese of Cape Palmas, Liberia, West Africa... I am Fr. Patrick Kroteh, a priest from the Diocese of Cape Palmas, Liberia.

The country Liberia was founded when slavery was abolished in the United States in the 18th century. Slaves repatriated to Africa settled in a place we now call Liberia. The population of Liberia is about 4.5 million people. Literacy rate of Libera is about 48.3%. About 83.3% of the population lives on less than US \$1.25 per day. About 12% of the population has access to electricity. The nation is recovering from the effects of a brutal civil war that killed more than 250,000 people. Liberia was among the three countries that suffered the deadly Ebola virus disease attack. These situations broke down every aspect of the country. Trying to get on our feet again, we join the rest of the world to go through the COVID-19 that has stalled everything in our country like any other country. Our situation is perhaps more devastating because of the issue of the COVID-19 has exacerbated our present struggle against bad economy and low standard of living.

The Diocese of Cape Palmas sees herself as an agent of the Good News of Jesus Christ is such a country with all these problems. For effective evangelization, the Diocese established institutions like schools, clinics, Catholic Justice and Peace Commission to defend the poor who are often suppressed, and also CATRITAS to cater to the social needs of people. We rune parishes to take care of the pastoral need of the faithful.

Running these institutions often pose a challenge to the Diocese in the face of all the social and economy problems. It is against this background that we are making this appeal to you so that we will continue to be effective agents of the Good News of Jesus Christ.

Money collected from this appeal will be used for religious education, provide health care for the elderly and the disadvantaged in our society, assistance for kids who are orphans as a result of HIV and AIDS, provide education for the needy.

May God Bless you are you continue to share in the Mission to which all of us are called by the virtue of our baptism. The collection will be taken the weekend of July 11/12.
