## Care for Creation: Help with Newton Power Choice

You may already know that the City's Newton Power Choice program is being launched this winter, and letters are going out to all Eversource Basic Service customers in January, alerting them to the program. This program enables Newton residents to have a much higher percentage of their electricity supply (60-100%) from New England renewable (solar and wind) sources, instead of the 14% mandated by state law. Green Newton is aiming to put up at least 200 yard signs around the city, urging people to sign up for the 100% renewable option in the program. ## Enhancing the Pastoral Use of Sacred Heart Rectory

Back in December 2017, Fr. Dan asked Andy Majewski, Chair of Our Lady's Finance Council, and me, Tom Morrison, Chair of Sacred Heart's Finance Council, to work with him to put together a Collaborative Space Utilization Committee ("Space Committee") to deal with the short- and long-term needs within the collaborative regarding the use of the facilities. The goal is to effectively support the pastoral/spiritual mission of our two parishes while being good stewards of both sets of properties. We added to the committee, from Our Lady's: Cathy Belli Duffy and Joanne Madden, and from Sacred Heart: Chris Golden and Paul Schreier.

An immediate opportunity now centers on the Sacred Heart Rectory. Currently, Fr. Michael is the only priest in residence there, and he will be leaving in July 2019. One need that has been identified is to increase pastoral presence and to better support pastoral activities and parish functions at Sacred Heart. The Space Committee views the rectory as a great place to address this need and to enhance the use of the building. Representatives from the Pastoral Council, the Finance Committees of both parishes, and the Space Committee collectively are excited about the possibilities of better utilizing the building to support the community and make it more accessible and welcoming. This historic, beautiful building hasn't been substantially improved since it was built in the early 1900s! The project is in very early phases right now so no specific plans are in place, but further information will be forthcoming in the spring of 2019, at which time we will be welcoming your input.

## Important Notice – Phishing Emails and iTunes Cards

The Archdiocesan Informational Technology Department has noted an increase in the number of phishing reports impacting parishes and parishioners. Phishing is an attempt by fraudsters to (1) have you transfer money, (2) make a purchase, e.g., iTunes cards, and/or (3) reveal personal information. Phishing emails are often related to a hacked email account where the email contacts are then used to target people.

Note the following excerpts from a recent example:

### 1st Email to parish staff or parishioner

Hello. How are you? I need a favor from you. Email me back when you get this message. Many Blessings,  
(Name)

### 2nd Email to parish staff or parishioner, if the person responds to the first email

Good to hear from you, I need you to get an iTunes gift card for some patients going through cancer in the hospital and i promised each patient but i can't do this right now. I'm currently busy in a pastoral meeting. Can you get it from any store around you? I will pay back as soon as i get back. Let me know if you can get it now

**Note that some recipients of these emails have gone through the process of purchasing iTunes cards and have provided the codes on the cards to the fraudsters, who have then used them to make purchases.**

### Do not fall victim. Here are some tips on dealing with phishing:

- Confirm as legitimate any email that is requesting a sensitive task to be completed.
- If the tone of the email is urgent, this should be a signal for additional caution.
- Never respond to a wire transfer or money request - always **STOP-CALL-CONFIRM** with the pastor or parish business manager.
- Do not share bank account numbers or other banking information over email.
- Be cautious about opening email attachments or clicking on links in emails. Even your friends' or family members' accounts could be hacked. Files and links can contain malware used to harm your computer or steal your personal data.
- Learn more about how to protect your personal information. Search for the terms 'email spoofing' and 'phishing' to become familiar with these tactics. Visit [IdentityTheft.gov](http://IdentityTheft.gov). Victims of phishing could become victims of identity theft; there are steps you can take to minimize your risk.
- Routinely back up your files, and test that you can recover these on a periodic basis (in case malware wipes your data).

### Secure your email:

- Do not use the same password for your various internet accounts (email, Facebook, Twitter, banking, etc.). Each account must have a unique password.
- Do not use simple passwords, but rather use complex passwords comprising a mix of uppercase and lowercase letters, numbers, and special characters.
- Use multifactor authentication (MFA) if you have that option.
- Change your email account password at least every 6 months.

## Specific to Sacred Heart & Our Lady's

In the last few months, it has happened several times that staff members and parish ministry leaders have received emails from people impersonating our priests and requesting financial help, similar to what is describe above. These were phishing attempts.

The official email accounts of staff members are the [sholnewton.org](http://sholnewton.org) addresses. You can and should call either parish office if you are not sure about the authenticity of any email.

## Beyond Our Walls

### The Church's Best-Kept Secret: Catholic Social Ministry Gathering

Saturday, February 2-Tuesday, February 5  
Omni Shoreham Hotel, Washington, DC

What is it? The Catholic Social Ministry Gathering (CSMG) is an opportunity to Connect, Learn, Pray, and Advocate with other Catholics from around the country who want to put into action the social justice teachings of the Catholic Church.

As we connect with others from Massachusetts and elsewhere, we learn about current social justice issues from excellent speakers, panelists, and video presentations. In 2018, topics included immigration, the environment, aid to people in need both at home and abroad.

After learning about current needs and issues, experts brief the gathering on the federal budget that Congress will soon be enacting. Particular attention is given to key line items that the Church believes should be funded in order to relieve the suffering of the poor.

After this briefing, members of the gathering go to Capitol Hill to meet with their Representatives and Senators, or their aides, to share information about the Church's position on specific budget proposals that help the poor and impact the environment.



## St. Vincent de Paul Update

**We Help People.** The past few months have been busy ones for the Collaborative's St. Vincent de Paul conference. Earlier in the fall, we conducted a food drive to benefit the Centre Street Food Pantry, as well as a clothing drive. More recently, we assisted with the Thanksgiving and Christmas meal and gift drives. Thanks to the generosity of our parishioners, meals were provided for more than 85 neighbor families, helping to make the holidays much more enjoyable! The holiday drives are always among the most enjoyable, yet humbling, events for our volunteers. The people we help are always deeply grateful.

We also continued to make home visits to people who called the parishes for help. In most cases, these families are just managing to get along until some crisis occurs – one of our members calls them “potholes in the road” – like a job loss, illness, or separation, and they have nothing in reserve to help them bridge the gap. During the past few months, we helped more than 10 families, primarily with rent and utility assistance. Too often, those in need in our community are hidden from our sight. But thanks to our generous donors, we have been able to help these families get through a difficult time.


