Welcome Fr. Bart Geger, S.J.!



We are glad to welcome Fr. Barton Geger to the Collaborative; he will be with us for Mass, usually celebrating 1 or 2 Masses each weekend, along with one weekday Mass. He will continue to live with his brother Jesuits in Brighton.

Fr. Bart was born in St. Louis and joined the Society of Jesus (the Jesuits) in 1990. He did his initial theology studies in London and Cambridge, MA, and received a

doctorate in theology from Universidad Pontificia Comillas in Madrid in 2010. Prior to arriving in Boston in 2017, he was a theology teacher and superior of the Jesuit Community at Regis University in Denver. He is currently a research scholar at the Institute for Advanced Jesuit Studies at Boston College, he teaches graduate theology at the university's School of Theology and Ministry, and he is general editor of *Studies in the Spirituality of Jesuits*. His principal project is a new English-language study-edition of the Jesuit Constitutions, written in the 1550s by St. Ignatius Loyola, founder of the Jesuit Order.

Have You Lost Someone You Love? Grief Support Group

The death of a loved one is unlike any other. Whether the death was sudden and tragic, or one with warning and preparation, the reality of death leaves most of us shocked, confused, and sad. These feelings may last for years. Grieving people need time and space to honor their grief. Your loss may be recent, or it may have been years ago. Our Lady's and Sacred Heart has developed a program to help you and yours start the healing process. We offer two 6-week workshops each year with a monthly drop-in group in between sessions. The next 6-week session will begin after Easter. Until then you are invited to drop-in on the first Sunday of the month, no registration is required and the group is open to all. Monthly sessions will meet at Our Lady's in the McPherson Room (lower level of main church building, by the stairs at the parking lot entrance)

An Important Announcement about Our Pastor, Father John Sassani

March 2019

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Over the past several years, since Fr. John shared in a May 2017 bulletin that he has a progressive neurological disease that is not curable, you have probably noticed that he has experienced some challenges. Even with those challenges, he has been such a blessing, and we truly are so very grateful to have had him among us for so long. He has been such an enormous gift to our community since he became Pastor of Our Lady's thirteen years ago and of the Collaborative five years ago. In addition to his time here as Pastor, some of you have known him from his days when he lived at St. Jean's or through Cursillo or the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius of Loyola. His warmth, his wisdom, his deep faith and spirituality, his kindness, and his willingness to respond to the needs of those who asked for his help have touched countless people, as well as his humor, his preaching, his knowledge, his leadership, and his selflessness.

For that reason, it is most difficult to share with you that Fr. John's disease has progressed to the point that it is no longer safe for him to live in a rectory. Accordingly, Fr. John's family has decided to care for him. One of Fr. John's deepest beliefs is that he knows he will be fine as long as he knows he belongs to Christ. What a shining example he is for us all, in sickness, in health, and in faith.

Due to Fr. John's health, we are unsure at this time when and how we will be able to celebrate his years with us and to say, "Thank you!" We are working on this.

Our relationship with Fr. John continues. We will keep you up to date as we all pray for him and ask God to bless him during this challenging time. If you would like to send him a card, please send it to the office, and we will see that he receives it. May God continue to bless Fr. John and us all.

Care for Creation: Pope Francis on Lent and Lifestyle

Lent offers us a new opportunity to examine our lifestyles. In his Lenten reflection, Pope Francis puts fasting, praying, and almsgiving in a creation care frame. It might be good for all of us to reflect on this:

Fasting, that is, learning to change our attitude towards others and all of creation, turning away from the temptation to "devour" everything to satisfy our voracity and being ready to suffer for love, which can fill the emptiness of our hearts. *Prayer*, which teaches us to abandon idolatry and the self-sufficiency of our ego, and to acknowledge our need of the Lord and his mercy. *Almsgiving*, whereby we escape from the insanity of hoarding everything for ourselves in the illusory belief that we can secure a future that does not belong to us.


