## From Fr. Dan, Pastor

Dear Friends,

**Happy Independence Day Weekend!** May God help us more fully live up to the inspiring ideals this great nation was founded upon.

**Four score and seven years ago** our fathers brought forth on this continent, a new nation, conceived in Liberty, and dedicated to the proposition that all men are created equal. Now we are engaged in a great civil war, testing whether that nation, or any nation so conceived and so dedicated, can long endure. We are met on a great battlefield of that war. **Homily Given July 8, 2007**  
**14th Sunday of Ordinary Time—Liturgical Year C**

I suppose we all have travel tips we follow when we travel either for business or vacation. My travel tip is this: be prepared for anything! My shaving kit is stocked with enough equipment to do minor surgery. For a five-day trip, I'll pack seven days' worth of clothes. I amazed myself last summer on a trip to North Dakota to give a retreat to a group of nuns in a convent there. On that eight day trip, I brought clothes for only four days. I realized that they must have washers and dryers – no need to overstock the suitcase.

In the gospel today, Jesus is sending the disciples on a business trip – His business – the business of the Kingdom. He gives them His travel tips: take no money, take no clothes, stay with strangers. It's not about traveling light. It's about being *vulnerable*. In sending out His disciples, He wants them to be vulnerable as He is vulnerable – vulnerability for the sake of availability. Christ wants His disciples to be able to announce the Kingdom with personal conviction. The disciples have benefitted from Jesus' personal conviction. Now he wants others to benefit from the disciples' personal convictions. To be sure, His disciples were vulnerable, liable to encounter brigands and bandits, wild animals, hostile audiences, and especially the evil spirit, the enemy that St. Paul is talking about in his letter.

Our obstacles are similar, particularly the enemy. He prevents us from being vulnerable disciples by our own thoughts, obstacles that he sets for us in our minds. The first one is that faith is a private matter, something that is not up for public discussion. The second is that active discipleship – doing Christ's work – is for 'professional' Christians, priests and sisters and lay ministers. The third is – I have too many doubts and fears to be able to talk about my faith to others.

Listening to these thoughts keeps people from meeting Christ through us. It prevents the work of Christ from being done as fully as it needs to be done. When we fail to ignore these thoughts – 'faith is private' or 'I'm not equipped to do these things' or 'my faith is not strong enough' – we're carrying too much baggage. We're not traveling light enough. We're not vulnerable either to the grace of Christ or to the needs of our neighbors or to our *true selves* made in the image of Christ at Baptism.

The Eucharist that we celebrate each week gives us as disciples food for the journey. This is the meal of Christ's vulnerability:

*My Body is for you*

*My Blood is for you*

*Do this in memory of Me*

As we come to the Eucharist, let's ask the Lord to help us to be vulnerable so that we can do His work this week for the coming of the Kingdom.

## Care for Creation: An Emergency Response to Climate Crisis

Faced with a climate emergency, the world must act immediately to mitigate global warming to 1.5 degrees Celsius and avoid committing "a brutal act of injustice" on the poor and future generations, Pope Francis told a group of energy and oil executives and global investors, who in their own statement offered support for a price on carbon emissions.

"Time is running out! Deliberations must go beyond mere exploration of what can be done and concentrate on what needs to be done from today onward," he said.

"We do not have the luxury of waiting for others to step forward or of prioritizing short-term economic benefits. The climate crisis requires our decisive action, here and now," he said June 14 at the Vatican. -Catholic News Service


