

From Fr. Dan, Pastor

Dear Friends,

For I know the plans I have for you, declares the LORD, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope. - Jeremiah 29:11

Resuming Public Masses

WEEKEND MASSES: Our TEMPORARY Mass Schedule is:

11am @ Sacred Heart (ASL), 6pm @ Our Lady's

We continue to work incrementally toward expanding in the direction of the pre-COVID Mass schedule. The huge number of tasks involved in doing this safely during this once-in-a-century pandemic is the reason we are doing this so carefully and incrementally. Thank you for your patience and understanding.

WEEKDAY MASSES: The weekday Mass schedule is: Monday, Friday, and Saturday 9am @ Sacred Heart Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday 7am @ Our Lady's

CONFESSIONS: TEMPORARY: they are Saturday 2pm-3pm. In November, they will be at Our Lady's, Main Church. In December, they will be at Sacred Heart, Upper Church.

WHO SHOULD COME TO MASS? The dispensation from the Sunday Mass obligation will continue for the foreseeable future—for EVERYONE. Cardinal Sean strongly encourages people in vulnerable populations, especially the elderly and those with complicating physical conditions, to continue to worship virtually from home. I find this question helpful: "Would my doctor want me to worship from home or at church?" If you are unsure about the answer, may I suggest she would be happy to get a call from you with that question. Please be safe!

SAFETY AT MASS: Please come with your own mask; they are required for all those over age 5 who do not have a medical condition that precludes a mask. Please also bring your own hand sanitizer so you can use it frequently while at Mass. While we have some hand sanitizer at the entrances to the churches, given the scarcity of supplies, we request you help make it last by bringing your own,

and also because it will key to have your own in the pew with you.

For safety, we can only seat as many people as can be kept 6 feet apart. The church will be marked to ensure your safety and fellow parishioners, and staff/volunteers will graciously guide you.

If we learn that someone at Mass tests positive for COVID-19, we will post this on the collaborative website, while keeping the person's name confidential.

VOLUNTEERING AT MASS: We request that you consider giving crucial and much needed help in furthering God's work in our two parishes by volunteering to assist with the very many tasks that go with holding public Masses during the pandemic. We really need the help of a lot of people! You can email:

Please keep safety front and center. We strongly encourage you, especially if you are at risk due to age or a medical condition, to limit your involvement to what is safe for you. For some, that may mean connecting by phone, internet or mail, instead of face to face, at this time.

THE VIRTUAL MASS will be continuing as usual since the pandemic began, and it will go at least until the virus is totally gone, and maybe even continue after that. Those of you not able to be at Mass in person are especially important to us. By 8am on Sundays, we send out an email like this with a link you can click on. New & Ongoing in Our Community

Msgr. Dennis Health Update (Sat. November 7th, 7PM)

During the six days Msgr. Dennis spent at Newton Wellesley Hospital he <u>tested Covid-negative upon admission</u>, but later on, unknown to him, he was accidentally exposed to Covid at the hospital, and just after being discharged on Friday he was brought back to be tested at NWH and they found <u>he has Covid now</u>. On Saturday Nov. 7 he moved to a nearby facility as his health was too good for hospitalization, and at the same time he needs to quarantine (with no visitors). Assuming his health remains good, when he is past the quarantine period he would then transition to Regina Cleri for a temporary stay so that he can get the medicine and level of nursing care needed to bring him back to us completely recovered from the initial reason he went to the Hospital on October 31. Fr. Dennis feels confident of being back here in mid-December. He is in good spirits, grateful for your prayers, and looking forward to Christmas at Sacred Heart and Our Lady's. – Fr. Dan

Christmas Mass Reservations

Reservations for all Christmas Masses will be required in order to comply with government and Archdiocesan guidelines regarding capacity, social distancing, and contact tracing. We expect that Christmas Mass attendance otherwise would exceed our available seating. Therefore, we are creating a Pre-Registration and Arrival Check-In process, scheduled to be available in early December. The Pre-Registration will utilize the SignUp feature of Flocknote, which

creates a publicly accessible link which will be available on our Collaborative website and shared through Flocknote and on social media (which makes it easy to access). For those without access to a computer, when registration opens you will be asked to call the parish offices at Sacred Heart or Our Lady's to register your information (name, phone number, which Mass you want to attend, and number of people who will attend Mass). Seating will be assigned in the order that reservations are received, while trying to accommodate the most people allowed under COVID guidelines. Registration will automatically close if and when we reach capacity. We will not be able to accommodate anyone arriving at Christmas Mass without a reservation.

- We anticipate that the Cardinal's dispensation from the Mass obligation will remain in place (as it was for Easter). Individuals at particular risk are strongly urged to avoid the risks associated with attending public celebrations of the Mass. This includes older adults and those with complicating medical conditions.
- A special recorded Christmas Mass will be available on our website (and YouTube channel) by Christmas Eve.

Help a Neighbor in Need This Holiday Season

Given the pandemic, we've had to rethink the entire process of providing holiday meals and gifts, carefully balancing our desire to help families with the need to follow proper guidelines for safety and in-person contact. Instead of providing boxes and baskets stuffed with turkeys, hams, and all the fixings that would be picked up all in one busy afternoon, we will be providing Stop & Shop food cards only and distributing them via a safer drive-through model, at both Thanksgiving and Christmas.

We are focusing on Thanksgiving for now and will have Christmas information in a few weeks. Please consider helping us support approximately 80 families in need by donating food cards. We expect to help families ranging in size from 1 person to 11 people. The average family size is 5 people, and we would like to provide \$140 for a family that size.

Donors are asked to purchase Stop & Shop food cards, depending

on how large a family they'd like to support, and to return them to Our Lady's Parish Office no later than Sunday, November 15.

Fr. John Sassani Homily Given on November 13, 2005 Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time Liturgical Year A

Do you ever cut yourself some slack regarding a general principle in a specific situation? I do. I think the state lottery is a reality with conflicting elements. A lot of money comes back to the cities and towns. But when I see people buy \$50 worth of scratch tickets at a time, it makes me wonder why we do this. However, when Mega Millions get's up in the \$310 million dollar range, I buy a ticket or two.

Why do I bring this up, you ask? Because the Gospel is about mega millions. It seems Jesus invented our use of the word Talent. To us it means gifts and abilities with which we've been endowed. In Jesus's day, a talent was a unit of measure, the equivalent of 75 pounds. As he tells the story, a talent is 75 pounds of money. The commentators say this is 20 years' worth of a laborer's wage – mega bucks. That's for the servant who got one talent – the servant who got 5 talents and makes 5 more ends up with mega millions.

But what is the point of the story? The servants, not the money are the key. Two worked with what they've been given, one doesn't. Two take what they've received and use it as if it were their own.

One understands that what he has isn't his. Two discover that, by using what they've been given, it pleases the master and what they've been given becomes theirs. One, for his lack of initiative, loses what he had and what could have been his. Most importantly, two know what their master was really like – generous beyond measure, who wants his talents used well and wisely. The third thinks the master hard – and in the end, by living wrong, he's right – the master treats him harshly.

The point is – we've been given talents in the sense of gifts and abilities, and they come from Christ. When we work them for the good of others and the glory of God, we are enriched. When we fail to use them, everyone is impoverished.

The woman in the Book of Proverbs is held up as a model – someone who uses her natural talents, not just for the good of her family but for the good of the poor too. She is a woman of faith. Whenever she learned her lesson – that to whom much is given, much is expected – she learned it well.

Jesus knew that, humanly, he had been given much and much was expected of him. He calls us today to know and to do the same. We've been given much. We're capable of much.

The Eucharist, as the great prayer of Thanksgiving, requires stock taking on our part, to see the talents – the gifts and abilities – we've been given so that we can be grateful in the concrete. The Eucharist is also the great experience of grace, impelling us to do all that we can with what we've been given – in partnership with Christ – for God's glory and the good of others.

Let's pray that Christ will give us eyes to see – and the inspiration to use – the many talents we have.

Religious Education has adopted a new program created by the Archdiocese of Boston for Grades 1-6, to meet the needs of families during Covid and to launch an ongoing project for parents to take on the natural role of bringing up their child in the Catholic faith as promised at Baptism. Project Nazareth is a toolkit for parents, designed to bring God into the everyday life of a family in a natural way without Zoom, textbooks, and workbook homework. Instead, the toolkit provides weekly prompts that guide parents as they have conversations with their children to wonder/ponder/share their faith and the person of God. Mentors from our parish support parents through phone calls, prayer and virtual meetings that provide a built-in connection with other parish families.

Confirmation and Middle School students (Grades 7-9) will meet 2x per month on Zoom with alternating home lessons and videos focusing on how the Catholic faith provides them with the keys to a happy life.
