

Resuming Public Masses

We continue to work incrementally toward expanding in the direction of the pre-COVID Mass schedule. The huge number of tasks involved in doing this safely during this once-in-a-century pandemic is the reason we are doing this so carefully and incrementally. Thank you for your patience and understanding.

WEEKDAY MASSES: The weekday Mass schedule is: Monday, Friday, and Saturday 9am @ Sacred Heart Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday 7am @ Our Lady's

CONFESSIONS: TEMPORARY: they are Saturday 2pm-3pm. In September, they will be at Our Lady's, Main Church. In October, they will be at Sacred Heart, Upper Church.

WHO SHOULD COME TO MASS? The dispensation from the Sunday Mass obligation will continue for the foreseeable future—for EVERYONE. Cardinal Sean strongly encourages people in vulnerable populations, especially the elderly and those with complicating physical conditions, to continue to worship virtually from home. I find this question helpful: "Would my doctor want me to worship from home or at church?" If you are unsure about the answer, may I suggest she would be happy to get a call from you with that question. Please be safe!

SAFETY AT MASS: Please come with your own mask; they are required for all those over age 5 who do not have a medical condition that precludes a mask. Please also bring your own hand sanitizer so you can use it frequently while at Mass. While we have some hand sanitizer at the entrances to the churches, given the scarcity of supplies, we request you help make it last by bringing your own,

and also because it will key to have your own in the pew with you.

For safety, we can only seat as many people as can be kept 6 feet apart. The church will be marked to ensure your safety and fellow parishioners, and staff/volunteers will graciously guide you.

If we learn that someone at Mass tests positive for COVID-19, we will post this on the collaborative website, while keeping the person's name confidential.

VOLUNTEERING AT MASS: We request that you consider giving crucial and much needed help in furthering God's work in our two parishes by volunteering to be a member of the people assisting with the very many tasks that go with holding public Masses during the pandemic. Please keep safety front and center. We strongly encourage you, especially if you are at risk due to age or a medical condition, to limit your involvement to what is safe for you. For some, that may mean connecting by phone, internet or mail, instead of face to face, at this time.

THE VIRTUAL MASS will be continuing as usual since the pandemic began, and it will go at least until the virus is totally gone, and maybe even continue after that. Those of you not able to be at Mass in person are especially important to us. By 8am on Sundays, we send out an email like this with a link you can click on. Msgr. Dennis Sheehan Homily Given on September 25, 2011 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time Liturgical Year A

When you think about religion and church, I guess I'm a good example of an "insider". After all, I've spent the majority of my adult years in church ministry. I'm a priest. I study Scripture and liturgy. I'm a monsignor to boot. Yes, I'm a real "insider".

So are many of you too - when you realize that only about 17% of Boston's Catholics are in church on Sunday. Church attendance is the most important indicator of active commitment. If you're here, it's probably because you're an "insider" too.

Strange then, that Jesus appears not to be an "insider" in the religious setup of his day. He has no official post. He's wandering about in the boonies of Galilee. Here in Jerusalem – the scene of today's story - he gets into friction and hot water. He's in conflict with the "insiders", the keepers of the status quo.

Listen to Jesus rail at them: "Tax collectors and prostitutes are going into God's kingdom before you insiders." These are some of the sharpest, meanest words Jesus ever spoke – and you and I are the ones he's speaking to. Imagine it. Those "outsiders" who don't go to Mass, who know nothing about Scripture – they're ahead of me?!

But wait. Suppose you're an outsider yourself. Suppose you're someone who's not a moral paragon. If you're back in church after wandering for years, wouldn't Jesus' words sound like good news to you?

Once in a while, I urge people back to church. Their response? Often: "I wouldn't fit in. They really wouldn't want me there." It's true. Sometimes we "insiders" are a real problem when it comes to welcome of the roving and straying.

Can you imagine a hospital that insisted its patients had to be healthy? Absurd, you say. But sometimes a church can act that way. Like a hospital, we're not here for ourselves. You and I, as insiders, are here in the service of those outside. We're not a church of the good and the virtuous. We're more like an emergency room for the battered and broken.

Even when Jesus is a little hard on us, we need to listen. For grace to be welcoming, for grace to reach out, we give thanks.

Happy Birthday, Msgr. Dennis! He turns 82 on Wednesday, September 30. He is a great gift to us all!



Sacred Heart Religious Education Plans for the 2020-2021 Year

Sacred Heart Religious Education classes will begin using a new initiative called **Project Nazareth: Faith Begins at Home for Grades 1-6.** It is faith taught from home, by delivering weekly resources to families to guide them on how to **Pray, Listen, Act, and Ponder** with a given topic. Catechists will support and guide parents as well as provide resources to help both parents and child grow in their faith. Catechists will use Zoom meetings with small groups of parents to build support, suggest strategies, and encourage parents on how to make faith the center of family life.

Grades 7-10 will use the online **Chosen Curriculum** (and text) by Ascension Press, with parents guiding the curriculum from home using monthly to bimonthly meetings on Zoom. Online Zoom meetings with students will not take place during the former Tuesday class times. The new times for Zoom meetings are TBD.

Sacramental Preparation for the Eucharist and Confirmation will seek to have in-person retreats as safety guidelines permit.

Parent Zoom Meetings will be scheduled in late September to work out details for at home faith formation and online support schedules.

Registration has been extended until October 6. Please remember to include Baptismal Certificate and fee if you are mailing the registration to the Sacred Heart office. Mail all fees and documents to Sacred Heart Parish, 1321 Centre St, Newton, MA 02459.

Special Note about 9:00am Mass on Sunday, October 18

Confirmation will take place at the 9:00am Mass on Sunday, October 18. There will be some one-time only changes due to the larger crowd and pandemic seating limitations. As usual, all are welcome to the 9am Mass. When we run out of space upstairs, overflow will be guided to the downstairs church where there will be a live projection of the Mass. Communion will be brought downstairs at Communion time. We are very hopeful this will provide enough total seats. Thank you for accommodating these one-time only changes as we joyfully celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit upon our seven candidates.

2020 Annual Report to the Parishioners from Tom Morrison, Chair to the Sacred Heart Finance Council **NOTE: The finances of Sacred Heart are independent and separate from those of Our Lady's**

This has definitely been a different year for all of us, which is why I have to provide you the annual financial report this way rather than joining you personally at each of the Masses.

I will provide you a very brief overview of Sacred Heart's financial status, but know that we will post additional detail on the Collaborative website, including the financial statement that we provide you each year.

In this last fiscal year, we did have a little over 8 months of normal activity before the coronavirus hit us in March. Masses, baptisms, weddings, funerals—all of our normal activities—ceased. However, through your additional donations, our operating revenue exceeded budget by almost \$20,000. Thank you so much! With all that many of you have gone through, this was truly an example of our parish coming through under extreme situations.

With many of our parish functions not occurring for over 2 months and diminished in scope for the last 4 weeks of the fiscal year, many of our expense line items were significantly reduced to where we experienced a reduction in operating expenses of \$74,000.

Concerning capital expenditure projects: we have been fortunate through the generosity of several parishioners' bequests and the monies from the sale of the St. Philip Neri properties, when their parishioners joined our parish, to continue to maintain our church property and make modifications to meet our changing needs. Over the past year, we have made significant renovations to our rectory which will now allow all parishioners access to the first floor. We made upgrades to the convent to provide for our largest renter, Wellan Montessori School, the ability to add a 7th and 8th grade while bringing the rest of the convent up to code and making that facility also accessible to all parishioners. We continued to provide general repairs to our church and the MacKenzie Center.

Be assured, through your additional support, we have been able to meet all of our obligations and successfully surpass the requirements to allow our church to open its door this past May for those who could come to Mass. Fr. Dan, Msgr. Dennis, Fr. Kevin, and all of our terrific and hard-working staff joined together to help address our spiritual needs in creative ways they never had to before.

With all of that, we maintained a solid balance sheet. Thank you again so much. Fr. Dan and all the staff appreciate your generosity and all that you do to support our parish.

Don't forget, in the coming weeks, you will find a more detailed report on the parish's finances on the Collaborative's website. I invite you to read it.

Invitation to Serve: Ministers Needed and Welcomed!

As we cautiously reopen, many people have stepped forward to help us celebrate Mass safely—and we would be grateful to recruit more. Please consider serving!

<u>Eucharistic Ministers</u>: Eucharistic Ministers go out into the congregation to serve people in their pews. Masks are worn and hand sanitizer is readily available.

<u>Ushers</u>: Ushers seat people in specific pews as they arrive. During Communion, ushers make hand sanitizer available to the Eucharistic Ministers. Finally, ushers control the dismissal of the congregation at the end of Mass, ensuring that social distance is maintained. The usher is a friendly face to all those who join us.

<u>Counters</u>: Since we currently have a limited capacity in the church to ensure social distancing, counters monitor the attendance at each Mass, using a clicker counter.

<u>Lectors</u>: We are seeking new lectors at all Masses. Lectors participate in the Mass in a particular way, proclaiming the Word of God in the assembly.
