

From Fr. Dan, Pastor

Dear Friends,

Happiness, joy, enchantment, security, and comfort. These feelings are aroused in us as we allow ourselves to get caught up in the praise of God in creation. As we view creation with awe and wonder we lose ourselves in God's beauty and praise of God arises. It is not something a person must force and wrestle for. We only have to open our eyes and see God's care for us in all things. This poem will help. "For the sunshine, and the whispering of the leaves, the tender lilies of the valley, and the dark evergreens, the flight of birds and the grass and the butterflies, and our view of the stars, and for all the days, the evenings and the nights. Celebrating Mass during the Pandemic

WEEKEND MASSES: Our TEMPORARY Mass Schedule is:

We hope to return to the pre-COVID Mass schedule when it is safe to do so. The huge number of tasks involved in doing this safely during this once-in-a-century pandemic is the reason we are doing this so carefully and incrementally. Thank you for your patience and understanding.

WEEKDAY MASSES: The weekday Mass schedule is:
Monday, Friday, and Saturday 9am @ Sacred Heart
Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday 7am @ Our Lady's

CONFESSIONS: TEMPORARY: they are Saturday 2:30pm-3:30pm. In February, they will be at Sacred Heart, Upper Church. In March, they will be at Our Lady's, Main Church.

WHO SHOULD COME TO MASS? The dispensation from the Sunday Mass obligation will continue for the foreseeable future—for EVERYONE. Cardinal Sean strongly encourages people in vulnerable populations, especially the elderly and those with complicating physical conditions, to continue to worship virtually from home. I find this question helpful: "Would my doctor want me to worship from home or at church?" If you are unsure about the answer, may I suggest she would be happy to get a call from you with that question. Please be safe!

SAFETY AT MASS: Please come with your own mask; they are required for all those over age 5 who do not have a medical condition that precludes a mask. Please also bring your own hand sanitizer so you can use it frequently while at Mass. While we have some hand sanitizer at the entrances to the churches, given the scarcity of supplies, we request you help make it last by bringing your own,

and also because it will key to have your own in the pew with you.

For safety, we can only seat as many people as can be kept 6 feet apart. The church will be marked to ensure your safety and fellow parishioners, and staff/volunteers will graciously guide you.

If we learn that someone at Mass tests positive for COVID-19, we will post this on the collaborative website, while keeping the person's name confidential.

VOLUNTEERING AT MASS: We request that you consider giving crucial and much needed help in furthering God's work in our two parishes by volunteering to assist with the very many tasks that go with holding public Masses during the pandemic. We really need the help of a lot of people! You can email:

Please keep safety front and center. We strongly encourage you, especially if you are at risk due to age or a medical condition, to limit your involvement to what is safe for you. For some, that may mean connecting by phone, internet or mail, instead of face to face, at this time.

THE VIRTUAL MASS will be continuing as usual since the pandemic began, and it will go at least until the virus is totally gone, and maybe even continue after that. Those of you not able to be at Mass in person are especially important to us. By 8am on Sundays, we send out an email like this with a link you can click on. March 7 ~ Third Sunday of Lent

In today's Gospel, we have a scene that may make us uncomfortable. Jesus knew that some of the temple practices were rife with social injustices. What made matters worse were that it was done in the name of religion. Jesus' heart ached to think that any Gentile seeking the presence of God would feel unwelcome in the house of God. If Jesus were to enter this community, would he find an exclusiveness, a coldness, or a place where the "seeking" stranger finds welcome, solace and peace? Lent gives us the opportunity to

examine our attitudes and make the necessary change so that every person feels welcome in this house of God. The pandemic restrictions need not hinder becoming a strong evangelizing parish.

COVID-19 Vaccine Information

Phase two of the vaccination rollout continues, with those ages 65+ now eligible as of February 18, along with those with two or more specific medical conditions and those who live or work in low-income and affordable senior housing. From Fr. Dan: How to Make a Pledge to the Catholic Appeal

If you are able, please make a pledge to the Catholic Appeal. How? Any one of the following convenient ways works.

- (1) By using the response form in the letter you may have already received from Cardinal Sean.
- (2) By hitting the Catholic Appeal "donate" button in the email sent to many of you last Tuesday and this Tuesday, or found on our website.
- (3) Google "Catholic Appeal Boston" and, when you get to the website, hit the donate button there.

When you make your pledge, be sure to include the name of your home parish, so that the correct parish will get credit towards the goal each parish is assigned. Also, only a pledge is required at this time – you do not have to give money now – though you are welcome to do so. In addition, your pledge is not something you will be held to; it is simply your best estimate of what works for you. Finally, when you fill out the pledge form, you will notice the option of doing your pledge over 10 installments, which I encourage, as spreading the installments out often makes a more generous pledge easier to do.

Homily Given on March 19, 2006
Third Sunday of Lent
Liturgical Year B

In John's Gospel, Jesus makes three pilgrimages to Jerusalem for the Feast of Passover. Today's Gospel of Jesus cleansing the temple in Jerusalem is the first one. On a later pilgrimage, He cures the crippled man at the Pool of Siloam. At the third, we hear of his triumphal entry, before his conviction, death, and Resurrection. In all three accounts, the Evangelist notes how people react. In this first scene, "many began to believe in his name when they saw the signs he was doing." The same is true the second time with the cure of the crippled man. And the same is true the third time, after the crowd heard that He had raised Lazarus from the dead.

The point is that, in all three instances, people believed in Him and they changed. St. Paul tells us that the Jews demand signs and the Greeks look for wisdom. Christ is both the sign and the wisdom. His sign is the cross, and His wisdom is selfless love. Both the sign and the wisdom are inherent in the temple of his body. "Templum" means a place marked out for soothsayers, a place to see and understand. The temple of Christ's body is a place to see the sign—the Cross—and a place to understand its meaning—the selfless love of God in Christ.

Several years ago, I came across a book about the Martyrs of the Atlas Mountains. This was a group of seven French Trappist monks of the Abbey of Our Lady of Atlas who were kidnapped and assassinated in 1996 during the Algerian Civil War. What moved me especially was the testament of the Prior, Dom Christian de Chergé. He wrote it two months before the kidnapping. In it, he expresses his faith in God, his acceptance of what might occur, his love for the Algerian people, and most poignantly, his forgiveness of the one who would strike him down. He concludes his testament saying, "And also you, my last-minute friend, who will not have known what you were doing. Yes, I want this THANK YOU and this GOODBYE to be a 'GOD BLESS' for you, too, because in God's face I see yours. May we meet again as happy thieves in Paradise, if it please God, the Father of us both." Fr. Christian, the other six monks, and countless of others became part of the Temple of Christ's Body.

I look at Lent this year at age 51 and where I was at 41 and realize that this Lent is better than some, not as good as others. You may feel the same. Little by little, though, there is movement into the Temple of Christ's Body, to see and to understand the Cross and the selfless love of God in Christ. Today again, the Temple is present, the Cross is present, Selfless Love is present, in the Eucharist: this is My Body given for you...this is My Blood poured out for you...do this in memory of Me. In this Eucharist, we are called to love and forgiveness in this most valuable time of Lent.


Psalm: Trace the words and learn to pray like Jesus!

Religious Education Update

Things look a little different this year because of the pandemic, but what hasn't changed is the joy of seeking to grow our relationship with Jesus! Our program has moved online this year, and we have been having so many wonderful faith experiences with our parish families.

Family Webinars: Family webinars occur each month with families of all sizes and ages. Each month, approximately 200 families participate in one of five sessions.

In October, we kicked off our year with a foundational question: Who Is God? We staff members shared our own thoughts about how we find God in all aspects of our lives, and we invited several parishioners to share video reflections as well. We were so encouraged by all the sharing and discussions at this first session!

In November, we focused on the saints, our departed loved ones, and the importance of gratitude. There was a fun saint scavenger hunt that we recorded in the church, then an opportunity to share about how our departed loved ones are still present in our hearts, and finally an invitation for families to express their gratitude to one another for all that makes each individual special.

December had us celebrating Advent and looking forward to Christmas. We talked about love, humanity, and vulnerability - the amazing truths of God sending his Son Jesus to live as a human being - the great mystery of the Incarnation. We also shared about favorite family Christmas memories and thought about how we might try to live the true meaning of Christmas this year, like having a special Nativity set at home. We ended by proclaiming the Christmas story from the Gospel of Luke and trying out imaginative prayer, seeking to envision what it was like at the manger.

In January, we explored vocation - all the ways that God calls us to serve God and serve one another—priests and deacons, religious, and lay people alike. Fr. Dan, Deacon Bill, Sr. Marian Batho, and Nick Frega (Pastoral Associate) all shared about their individual vocations to serve the church. No matter what unique vocation each of us is called to, we made sure to remind one another that LOVE is the ultimate vocation for everyone!

Weekly Lessons: In addition to the monthly online gatherings, each student is using an age-appropriate at-home curriculum called Pflaum Gospel Weeklies, which use the Sunday reading as the basis for learning about Jesus and our Catholic faith. What a great way to encounter Christ!

First Penance and First Communion: There are 54 girls and boys who prepared for Penance by Zoom classes during the fall and received the grace of this sacrament in early December. They have just begun their weekly Zoom classes preparing now for the reception of First Holy Communion in the spring. This year is always so special!

Confirmation: Our Zoom Confirmation classes will be starting up at the end of the month, and we are excited for nearly 70 young women and men who will receive this outpouring of the Holy Spirit this spring.

Affirmations: We are so grateful for the efforts of parents for their time and commitment and for creating environments at home to enable this kind of new faith formation this year. We are also indebted to our sacramental preparation catechists and to all those who have contributed to or assisted during a webinar. It really does take a village!
