

The Church proclaims on this last Sunday of the Liturgical Year Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior, is King of the Universe. Help Your Neighbors In Need In Newton: St. Vincent de Paul Fundraiser

Are you looking for a way to help those in need? The mission of our conference of St. Vincent de Paul is to provide food, clothing, and housing-related assistance to our Neighbors in need in the greater Newton Community. Many of the Neighbors we help have hit an unexpected "pothole" in their lives – a car repair, job loss, illness in the family, a divorce, a loss of childcare – but they have no financial cushion to soften these unexpected blows. They live on the edge, with no wiggle room.

Due to the generosity of our donors, over the course of the past year, the Sacred Heart and Our Lady Help of Christians Collaborative Conference of St. Vincent de Paul spent approximately \$28,000 to assist those in need in our community, a 33% increase over the previous year. We need your financial assistance to help us to continue to fulfill our mission. Our only expense is postage and a \$200 annual dues payment to the regional chapter. Other than that, every dollar you give goes directly to helping our neighbors right here in our community.


Holly Harvest Fair Is This Weekend!

Fr. John Sassani—Homily Given on November 25, 2007 Feast of Christ the King—Liturgical Year C

I am sometimes asked about the prayer that we say just before Communion (“Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.”). It comes to us from the liturgy of Saint John Chrysostom; the full prayer reads:

O Lord, my God, I am not worthy that You should come into my soul, but I am glad that You have come to me because in Your loving kindness You desire to dwell in me. You ask me to open the door of my soul, which You alone have created, so that You may enter into it with Your loving kindness and dispel the darkness of my mind. I believe that You will do this for You did not turn away Mary Magdalene when she approached You in tears. Neither did you withhold forgiveness from the tax collector who repented of his sins or from the good thief who asked to be received into Your kingdom. Indeed, You numbered as Your friends all who came to You with repentant hearts. O God, You alone are blessed always, now, and forever.

For me, this describes the spectrum of being a disciple. One could fall far short like Judas, or one could get there just under the wire like the Good Thief. And there's everything in between.

Judas knew Christ for three years. The Good Thief only knew Christ for three hours. For some of us, we have 60 or 70 or 80 years of discipleship. It is less about the “years in” and much more about the impact and the effort of our striving.

As for me and the impact discipleship has had on me, I think back 30 years ago to when I was a senior in college seminary. I was on retreat, and I heard “He is before all things. He is before all else that is.” I heard nothing else on that retreat. In four years in seminary, it was on that day when I entered the school of discipleship. It was when I really began to let Christ

set the priorities and to characterize my life. I went from being a senior in college to a freshman in the school of discipleship – perhaps now I'm a sophomore or a junior!

Today we mark Christ the King. It is the end of the liturgical year, so it is a good time for end-of-the-year evaluations. How am I doing in the service of the King? Do I let him set the priorities for me? Do I choose to let his life characterize – give character – to mine? And do I do these things not just as an individual but as part of a community of faith?

Christ calls us to passionate spirituality. Judas had a greater passion than his passion for Christ. The Good Thief had NO greater passion than his longing for Christ, even as he was suffering his execution. For us as Christians, our spirituality is how we assess and foster our relationship with Christ. He fosters a passion in us – he catches our imagination – so that he can set our priorities and deepen our character.

Next week begins Advent, a time of awaiting Christ's coming – not just at the end of time but everyday in various ways. In the next few weeks, we have opportunities to await his coming with presentations on the faith given by Celia Sirois and our own Fr. Dennis Sheehan. We can assist the underprivileged through the Giving Tree. We are called to penance and prayer as we await Christ, including Taizé prayer on December 10, 2007.

The Eucharist is a priority for Catholics because it is the embodiment of selfless love. It characterizes us as a community of faith and of love. Today, as we gather at the altar, let's confess Him, so as to live in and contribute to the full flowering of his Kingdom.

Care for Creation: Pray for World Leaders During COP27

Leaders and climate activists from around the globe are meeting November 6-18 in Sharm el Sheikh, Egypt, for the UN 27th Climate Conference, or COP27. With a backdrop of floods, droughts, and resulting climate refugees, melting polar ice and disappearing wildlife, it is not hard to hear the cries of the Earth, as Pope Francis urges.

But Francis asks us to listen to the cries of the poor as well—those for whom the climate crisis is not the future, it is now. COP27 is well poised to do so, taking place on the African continent, which has borne a major share of loss and damage from climate change, while contributing the least to its cause.

During these two weeks of COP27, world leaders are negotiating global goals for tackling climate change, presenting their individual countries' plans for contributing to these goals, and reporting on their progress. The 21st COP in 2015 produced the Paris Agreement on climate, which set a goal of limiting global warming to 1.5 degrees Celsius (2.7 degrees Fahrenheit) and creating a climate neutral world by 2050. But global greenhouse gas emissions continue to rise, and the goal is in jeopardy.

Let's join in praying for world leaders as they deal with these difficult issues that have enormous consequences for the earth and for all people, especially those who are most vulnerable to the devastation caused by climate change.

Prayer for the COP27 Climate Summit

God of blessings, the universe sings of your glory. Deepen our gratitude for all you have made and awaken in us a renewed commitment to care for the earth and each other. Inspire world leaders at COP27 with openness to listen to those most affected by climate change and with courage to act urgently and wisely, so that our common home may be healed and restored and all people, and generations to come, may delight in it. Amen.
