

From Fr. Dan, Pastor

Dear Friends,

Covid Cases declining! Your vaccinating, masking, etc. are working. Keep doing these good things. Your actions are saving lives!

How might we offer God's kindness to others? Here at 10 down to earth ways.

- (1) Kindness puts the other person at the center. With kindness, the other is the most important person.
- (2) Kindness focuses especially on those who most need it like: the poor, the unborn, victims of discrimination, those threatened by climate change, those most hurt by Covid, etc. Like Jesus, the model of kindness, a special focus is on those most in need.
- (3) Kindness offers practical help -- like running an errand for someone, or sending a text to a friend or family member.
- (4) Kindness is powerfully given by good listening. Listening intently to a friend or family member can relieve stress, pressure, and anxiety, and give them the energy and confidence to handle their challenges. Be a good listener by giving your full attention. Listening is a powerful act of kindness.
- (5) Kindness comes through by staying connected especially in this time of Covid -- it is so kind and helpful to check in and stay connected with family and friends who are

less connected. A simple text or call lets others know you are thinking of them. If safe – a face-to-face connection is even better.

- (6) Have and share a positive attitude accentuating the positive. Then, share that positive focus with others. It lifts them up. Our emotions and outlook are contagious. Cultivate and share a positive attitude!
- (7) Smile at others a smile warms the heart of the other and lifts their spirits. It often triggers a return smile. Like emotions, smiling is contagious and has a positive effect on our mental health. It makes us and the other feel better.
- (8) Compliment others -- Complimenting others releases a boost of joy and feeling loved in others. Don't let chances to give sincere compliments go unused.
- (9) Say: "Please," "Thank You," and "I'm Sorry" those little polite phrases do wonders. They make others feel respected and appreciated. They make our relationships much better.
- (10) Be kind to yourself as opposed to being harsh on yourself. Self-kindness makes it easier for us to be kind to others.

February 6—5th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Each of the readings in today's liturgy make clear that we are the ones to carry on the work of making disciples. The prophet Isaiah when asked by God, "Whom will I send?", declares, "Send me." St. Paul states frankly, "I handed on what I received." Moreover, Jesus invites his disciples to "put out into the deep..." to take that leap of faith and be fishers of men (and women). The message is clear – these readings are intended for US! Will you respond like Isaiah, saying, "send me"? Will you step out of your comfort zone as Jesus invites the disciples to do and reach out to someone in faith? Being a disciple and making disciples is now our task!

LIVE LENT! Join a Small Faith Group

This Lent, our small faith communities will be reflecting on the Lenten gospels using the a faith sharing book called *Live Lent!* With reflections and prayers written by Sr. Terry Rickard, O.P., *Live Lent!* will help you make the most of this season of preparation and spiritual renewal. *Live Lent!* will be your ideal companion as you gather weekly in small groups to gain inspiration from next Sunday's Gospel and its roots in the Old Testament and as you reflect each day of the week on how to live your faith in everyday life. Be inspired by the Sunday Gospel readings, explore Old Testament insights, and take action in everyday life. These sessions are sure to bring much joy and insight into your own Lenten journey.

New & Ongoing in Our Community

From the Racial Justice Ministry during Black History Month

Lynching. What pictures does that word paint in your mind? Lynching is defined as extrajudicial killing of a perceived transgressor to punish or to intimidate. As I was growing up in the mountain west, that word conjured cowboy justice (with an all-white cast). The history of Utah, where I was born, and other western states bears my childhood image out to some extent. 82 of the 84 people lynched in Montana between 1882 and 1968 were white. Other states show a very different pattern, however. Of the 493 people lynched in Texas in that same period, 352 of them were Black; in Alabama, statistics show 299 Black victims out of a total of 347.

Between the Civil War and World War II, thousands of Black Americans were lynched in the U.S. These murders were acts of terror, traumatizing Black people who were forced to endure them without any protection or recourse. Some of the most chilling evidence of this practice is historic photographs of crowds of ordinary white citizens of all ages gathered to observe and celebrate the event, complete with refreshments.

The history of lynching is one of the saddest manifestations of societally sanctioned racial violence in America. It took the lives of 14-year-old Emmett Till in 1955 and of freedom riders James Chaney, Michael Schwerner, and Andrew Goodman in 1964. The recent murders of George Floyd, Ahmaud Arbury, and others echo this tragic history in the present day. February is Black History Month. Is there anything people working for racial justice here in Newton in February 2022 can do in response? One thing is not to forget it. If we forget history, we are doomed to repeat it in one form or another.

Several news stories have appeared recently about the National Memorial for Peace and Justice which opened in Montgomery, Alabama, on April 26, 2018. The Memorial and the Legacy Museum that adjoins it were established by the Equal Justice Initiative (EJI). The EJI was founded in 1989 by Bryan Stevenson to provide legal representation for those who may have been denied a fair trial. The SHOL Book Club read Stevenson's Book Just *Mercy* about his racial justice work.

Since I first read about the Memorial, I have been considering a trip to Montgomery to see it. It contains over 800 steel columns, one for each county in the U.S. where a documented racial terror lynching took place. The names of the lynching victims are engraved on the columns (https://lynchinginamerica.eji.org/report/). A visit would be a way to honor those who died and those who were terrorized by the murders. It might also provide a moment for remembrance and for meditation on each person's role (however small) in bending the arc of the moral universe toward justice. Maybe next February.

Fr. John Connelly An excerpt from his bulletin column: February 1992

It is amazing how an obscure figure from early centuries of the Church should still have a modest role in Catholic piety even today. As we all know so well, St. Blase, bishop and martyr, is the patron of those with illness in general, but in particular illnesses of the throat. It might be good to put this act of piety in its theological context.

We know that suffering and illness are great problems that trouble the human spirit. Christians feel and experience pain as do all other people. Our faith should help us grasp more deeply the mystery of suffering, and teach us to bear pain with the courage of martyrs and saints. Part of God's providential plan is that we fight strenuously against all sickness and carefully seek the blessings of good health, so that we may fulfill our roles in human society and the church.

In the United States, the annual blessing of throats is a traditional sign of the struggle against illness in the life of the Christian. It is part and parcel of many sorts of blessings given to the sick, blessings that are rooted in the imitation of Christ and of his apostles.

Safely Worshipping at Mass during Winter 2022 Covid Surge

We, the staff, are seeing folks coming down with Covid in our two parishes in numbers that far surpass anything we have seen before. We love you and want you to be safe, and so we offer these thoughts for your consideration.

- (1) **No Ordinary Time:** During this surge time, as cases are skyrocketing, it is much more likely than in non-surge times that folks who are unaware they have Covid are at the Mass you are attending.
- (2) **TV/Online Mass or In-Person Mass?** Please consider the TV/Online Mass option especially if you have conditions that put you at a higher risk. Our Sunday Mass goes out by Flocknote every week.
- (3) **Vaccinations.** Thank you for being fully vaccinated and boosted as you are able.

- (4) Masks. "Experts say it's best to wear N95, KN95, or KF94 masks [during the Omicron Surge]." Some experts say wearing these better masks makes a night vs. day difference. (Wearing a mask indoors is required by the City of Newton and required at Mass by Cardinal Sean O'Malley.)
- (5) Err on the safe side: If you have any symptoms suggesting you might have Covid, please do not come to Mass until you are sure you do not have Covid.
- (6) **Health concerns and the Sunday Mass obligation.** If you stay home for reasons due to concern about Covid, Cardinal Sean has stated you are not in violation of the obligation to attend Mass.




