From Fr. Dan, Pastor

Dear Friends,

We are so proud of those who were Confirmed this Saturday and thereby have received a special outpouring of the Holy Spirit and thus have become fuller members of God's family, the Church, in order to give witness to Jesus and follow his way of love. Congratulations!

Congratulations to all receiving Jesus in First Holy Communion. Also, a very warm welcome to all who are visiting for this joyful occasion.

"The Resurrection Brings Joy: First, the Resurrection is a proclamation that Jesus is alive and present with us. In the Resurrection appearances, the disciples experienced Jesus in their midst. The same Jesus who had walked with them now again touched their lives, and spoke and ate with them. Jesus now lived the glorious life beyond death, but he was again with them. The Resurrection proclaims that Jesus is with us as well. We encounter Jesus in the Scripture, in the sacraments, and in our brothers and sisters.

Second, death has been conquered. Death opens the way to eternal life. Jesus gives witness to God's faithfulness even in death. We need not be afraid of death since it is not the end, but the beginning of eternal life.

Third, Jesus' Resurrection affirms the value of the human person and the world in which we live. Jesus was raised as a whole person—body and soul. Jesus did not take on human flesh and then discard it. Jesus retained his whole humanity. The Resurrection assures us that God has identified with matter. God has embraced the human condition. A profound unity forever exists between God and the world, between spirit and matter. As Christians, we do not believe simply in the immortality of the soul. We believe in the immortality of the human person. Jesus' Resurrection and ours speak of continuity between this life and the next. Jesus' Resurrection also acknowledges the value of creation.

This world is a gift of an all-loving God. Our faith in the Resurrection assures us that everything of beauty and love and creativity lasts forever. The Resurrection is the foundation of a holistic view of the human person and an incarnational and sacramental view of life.

In summary: Jesus is with us, death has been destroyed, and human life and activity have lasting value—these are all reasons to rejoice." – Excerpted from *Putting on the Heart of Christ* by Gerald M. Fagin, S.J.

New & Ongoing in Our Community

Support for the SHOL Racial Justice Ministry

The Sacred Heart & Our Lady's Racial Justice Ministry, which was started by a group of parishioners, began meeting twice a month over a year and a half ago to promote true equality and equity of human beings within the Catholic Church and the world. Shortly thereafter, we were fortunate to have Deanna Morgan, who earned a Master's of Christian Education at Princeton Theological Seminary, volunteer to lead the group. By use of media, guest speakers, books, and action to be taken, members of the group immersed themselves in non-white cultures and began to confront the sin of racism.

In mid October 2021, the Ministry held a virtual Racial Justice Retreat entitled "Awaken to Racism", attended by over 50 SHOL parishioners and others from local parishes. This retreat, with guest speakers and discussions that followed, was the first of its kind and one that we hope to have annually. Currently, we are following the curriculum for "Faith and Racial Healing: Embracing Truth, Justice, and Restoration" created by Just Faith Ministries. The group meets once a month on Zoom, and all members of the parishes are welcome to join. This new curriculum requires the use of books and Session Guides that are needed to address race and racism from a spiritual perspective.

In order to fund these programs for our parishes, we are asking for support from current participants, those who would like to become involved, and those who believe this is a worthwhile ministry. 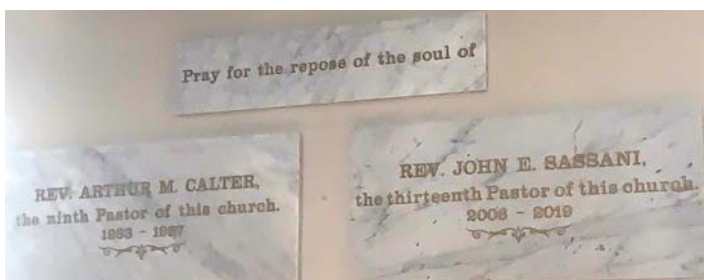
Remembering Fr. John Sassani (1954-2019)



On April 24, we gathered together as a community to pray for, remember, and honor Fr. John Sassani, our former pastor.

For those who couldn't join us in person, see the photo below of three new plaques: one entreating the reader to pray for the souls of our deceased pastors, one naming Fr. Arthur Calter (Pastor 1983-1987, who died on Easter Sunday, April 16, 2017), and one naming Fr. John (Pastor 2006-2019). They are fabricated from the marble that had surrounded the altar in the former convent chapel at Our Lady's, and they join the existing memorials to the first eight pastors of Our Lady's, all located in St. Jean's Hall in the Lower Church Hall. Please be sure to visit the plaques and keep all the deceased pastors of the parish in your prayers.

Looking Ahead: Religious Ed for 2022-23

As we wrap up the Religious Education year and celebrate the sacraments, the Religious Ed team is having conversations about next year already! We plan to have information available and open registration by early July. Please keep an eye on the bulletin and on your inbox!

A special note for families with students in early elementary school: preparation for First Penance and First Holy Communion is a two-year program, with both Grade 1 and Grade 2 classes required before First Communion. We also have a Kindergarten class, which is an optional but very fun introduction to faith formation classes. Students who attend Catholic School and are entering Grade 2 need to register in the parish, as sacramental preparation takes place in the parish rather than in school.

Additionally, high school students who wish to celebrate Confirmation must enroll in the preparation program for two consecutive years, typically - but not always - Grades 9 and 10.

Fr. John Sassani
Homily Given on May 2, 2010
Fifth Sunday of Easter—Liturgical Year C

I am a very shy person, so it often takes some time and effort for me to be comfortable with new people I meet. Many years ago, when I was stationed in another parish, I was called to visit a teenage girl who was very sick. She had been hit by a car while she was bicycling and was seriously injured. I saw her right away and continued to visit her once a week at least. One night, her family asked me to dinner. I was hesitant, but I went – and not just once. Little by little, we became friendly, became friends. That was about twenty-five years ago, and we are still friends. In fact, we are like family – and it all started over dinner.

Jesus's job, His mission, is to make all of us and everyone in the world into God's family. Families eat together. It's one of the things that deepens our love for one another. Food makes us healthy and strong. Meals make us connected and deepen our relationships of love with one another.

Jesus wants us to be His family. He wants us to grow in love. He doesn't want us separate from one another. We hear this in the second reading from Revelation. John describes a new heaven and a new earth and says, "The sea will be no more." That's not because the sea is bad, but because it keeps us separate from one another.

This weekend, we are celebrating First Communion for some of our children. Our family, our parish family, eats together every Sunday to deepen our love for one another, for others – even our enemies – and for God, by eating this meal. Christ becomes our food and drink to unite us and to give us His life and His love.

We hope that this will be something our children will do often: join us as we come together to meet Christ in the Eucharist, so that He can influence us and we can influence others until all are gathered around this table.

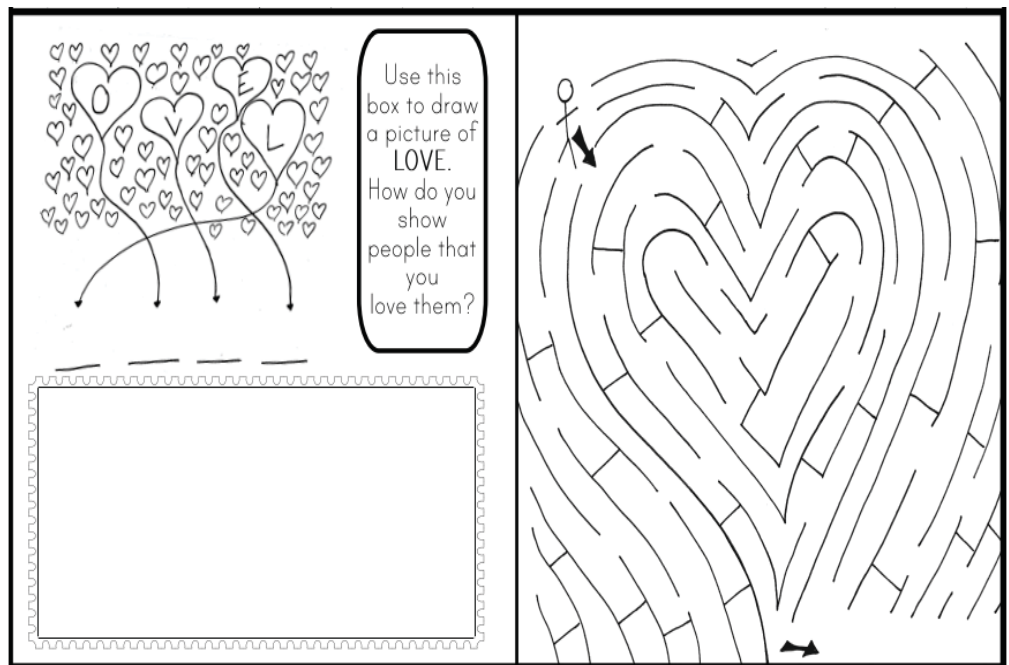

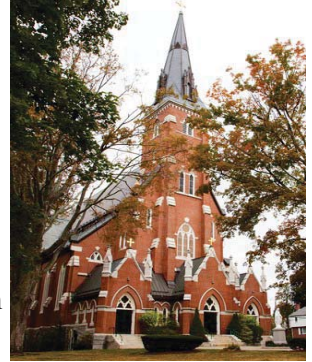


