

From Fr. Dan, Pastor

Dear Friends,

Happy Independence Day / Fourth of July! May God help us more fully live up to the inspiring ideals our nation was founded upon. Enjoy the cookouts!

Pope Francis "pointed out that the most serious illness in life is a lack of love, and not being able to love. The Pope lamented that at times we seek useless remedies for our lack of love, throwing ourselves into vain searches for success and money, even looking online. "The Lord waits for us to encounter Him, to open our hearts to Him. By growing in intimacy with Jesus, we are healed." Pope Francis encouraged everyone to "let Jesus look at and heal your heart." If we have already experienced His gaze, then we should turn to those around us who may feel wounded and alone to show them love. "Jesus asks you for a gaze that does not stop at the outward appearance, but that goes to the heart: a gaze not judgmental, but welcoming, because love alone heals life."

nate to have Deanna Morgan, who earned a Master's of Christian Education at Princeton Theological Seminary, volunteer to lead the group. By use of media, guest speakers, books, and action to be taken, members of the group immersed themselves in non-white cultures and began to confront the sin of racism.

In October 2021, the Ministry held a virtual Racial Justice Retreat entitled "Awaken to Racism", attended by over 50 SHOL parishioners and others from local parishes. This retreat, with guest speakers and discussions that followed, was the first of its kind and one that we hope to have annually. Currently, we are following the curriculum for "Faith and Racial Healing: Embracing Truth, Justice, and Restoration" created by Just Faith Ministries. The group meets once a month on Zoom, and all members of the parishes are welcome to join. This new curriculum requires the use of books and Session Guides that are needed to address race and racism from a spiritual perspective.

In order to fund these programs for our parishes, we are asking for support from current participants, those who would like to become involved, and those who believe this is a worthwhile ministry. Msgr. Dennis Sheehan Homily Given on July 8, 2007 Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time—Liturgical Year C

This is a gospel you might be saying, "For missionaries. It has nothing to do with my daily life." Wrong. "This is a gospel for street preachers and people who go from house to house spreading the gospel. It's not even remotely about my Christian living." Wrong again. Look at one detail: Jesus sends seventy. Seventy in the Bible is the number of fullness. Seventy means Jesus sends everyone. This gospel is about you.

But we don't look like people on a missionary journey. We don't act for the most part like Jesus sends us. That's true enough! Why not? What we need to hear is a message so important it underlies this and every other gospel where Jesus sends people. There's a "message behind the message" here today. We need to hear it, let it penetrate our bones, and sink into our hearts. Jesus' message is three simple words: Don't be afraid!

Remember when Jesus walked across the water and got into the boat? He said it then: Don't be afraid. Remember when he healed the synagogue leader' daughter? He said it then. Don't be afraid.

Today, Jesus sends his seventy and all of us. Get out there, he calls, do my work, speak my words, lead my life. Do you imagine those first seventy were any less fearful and apprehensive than us? What must it be like to go to unfamiliar places and meet people without being invited? What must it be like to stand for gospel values in places where we may seem strange or peculiar? Today's gospel lifts up 4 possible fears, names them, and says resoundingly: Don't be afraid.

The gospel deals with four possible fears. The first is fear of people. Jesus sends those first disciples to heal the sick. What wisdom there is in that! But did people always recognize their illness? No. People, then and now, Jesus says, will turn you

down, scorn you. Are you afraid of them? Look deeper, Jesus says. See their brokenness. See the pain that bubbles over in anger – even anger at you. Do you fear this? Jesus says, just move on. Do what you can and keep going. Don't fear people.

Four possible fears. The second is obvious, fear of failure. We breathe it in like the air around us. Jesus doesn't say: push harder. Jesus doesn't say: success is all that matters. He says again: move along. You carried the message. You lived and spoke authentically. Jesus himself was a failure. But God reached into the failure of Jesus crucified and brought forth a whole new life. Don't fear failure.

Four fears. The third fear is fear of not having things. We spend lots of time wanting stuff. If I had more money. If my shoes were better. I need a digital TV. The consumer culture tells us we are what we have. An iPhone will make me more of a person. Jesus says things can be distracting, can absorb our lives in worry and desire. Travel light, Jesus says. Don't fear things - what you don't have.

The fourth and last fear is the fear of needing. Be content with the food you get, says Jesus. That's all you need. Be content with the roof over your head. You don't really need a cathedral ceiling and a gourmet kitchen. What you really need you may already have: friends, food and shelter, support and affection. Do you fear for these?

Jesus wants us free from fear. But we have them, nonetheless. One of these fears will probably crop up in the week ahead: fear of people, fear of failure, fear of not having things, fear of being in need. The fear will keep us from living as people sent by Jesus. The fear, not the gospel, will direct our lives. At that moment, listen again to Jesus: I am sending you. I am sending you like sheep among wolves. There you have it. Just don't be afraid. Why not? You're on Jesus' mission, and he's with you. That's reason aplenty not to be afraid.

June 24, 2022: Cardinal Seán O'Malley Statement regarding Supreme Court Ruling in Dobbs v. Jackson

For all of us who have spoken, written, worked, marched, and prayed to reverse Roe v. Wade, today's Supreme Court decision in Dobbs v. Jackson is deeply significant and encouraging. This decision will create the possibility of protecting human life from conception; it calls us to recognize the unique burden faced by women in pregnancy; and it challenges us as a nation to work together to build up more communities of support — and available access to them — for all women experiencing unplanned pregnancies.

During the past half-century, as the abortion debate continued, the Catholic Church has often been accused of imposing a religious belief on our pluralistic society. It is indeed the case that, when addressing the Catholic community, the Church has used both religious and moral arguments to oppose abortion. But when engaging the wider American civil society, elected officials, and our legal system, the Church has defended human life from its inception as a matter of human rights. Our continued efforts in advocating our position on the protection of unborn children is consistent with our advocacy for issues affecting the dignity of all persons at all stages and in all circumstances of life. The Church employs this principle of consistency in addressing issues of race, poverty, and human rights generally. It is a position that presents a moral argument as a foundation for law and policy to protect human life.

I welcome the Court's decision, but I do not underestimate how profoundly divisive the issue of abortion has been and will continue to be in our public life. Even more tragic has been the personal suffering of women facing unplanned pregnancies in difficult situations. The Church has consistently opposed the moral and legal dimensions of Roe v. Wade; we also adamantly reject stigmatizing, criminalizing, judging or shaming women who have had abortions or are considering them. Too often isolated and desperate, women have felt they had no other choice. They need and deserve spiritual, emotional, and material support from the Church and from society.

In the Archdiocese of Boston, we have sought, through Project Rachel and Pregnancy Help, to support women facing a crisis pregnancy and women whose lives have been impacted by an abortion. In addition, the Church offers the Lord's boundless mercy and healing to those suffering from the spiritual harms of abortion. In the face of recent statistics indicating an in-

crease in abortions, our pastoral and social support for women will continue, will be welcoming, and will be available to all who need them.

Today's Supreme Court decision begins a new chapter in our legislative and legal forums as the public debates about abortion will not end. Since 1973, there has been continuing opposition to Roe v. Wade's reasoning and its consequences. Those consequences have permeated the political, legal, and social fabric of American life. The radical character of the Roe decision catalyzed some of the deepest reactions and responses to any issue in our nation's history. The public arguments will now shift to the states, the Congress, and the courts. It is my hope that this new chapter may be a time of a different tone and focus in our civic life.

First, we must adopt a wider vision of the multiple threats to human life in our society today. The recognition that human life begins with conception and continues through natural death. All human life deserves moral and legal protection at all times. Protection of life should be comprehensive, not selective. The Church, in its own positions, should reflect this wider vision, and we are called to engage our civil society around this more holistic view of the value and dignity of human life. It is commonly recognized by those on both sides of the abortion debate that conditions of poverty and injustice have been and are today a major factor contributing to abortions. Those who have opposed and supported Roe can and should find common ground for a renewed commitment to social and economic justice in our country.

Second, protecting human life at all times can only succeed if we rediscover the value of civility in discourse, in protest, and in policy advocacy. Respect for life calls for mutual recognition of and respect for our common dignity as persons and citizens. In recent years, the idea of civility and respectful discourse has suffered from neglect, as has the respect for human life. The renewal of both is possible and urgently necessary.

As a bishop and a citizen, I hope and pray we can create a culture that protects the most vulnerable at the beginning of life and at any time life is threatened in any way.



Religious Education News: Registration

Registration Is Open! The Registration for the 2022-2023 school year has begun! Returning families have gotten information sent to them by email, and we are so eager to hear from newly-registering families who will be joining us in the fall. All information can be found online at https://sholnewton.org/religious-education

The registration form is online at https://forms.office.com/r/NjBAE9Ef42, and this is one common form for all grades and both parishes.

For Grades K-5: There are three in-person class options for elementary school students. At Sacred Heart, classes are Tuesdays 4:00-5:00pm. At Our Lady's, classes are Sundays 8:45-9:45am and Mondays 4:00-5:00pm. We also plan to offer one Grade 5 class during our Monday night (7:00-8:00pm) middle school class time at Our Lady's. Classes begin October 2-3-4.

A special note for families with students in early elementary school: preparation for First Penance and First Holy Communion is a two-year program, with both Grade 1 and Grade 2 classes required before First Communion. We also have a Kindergarten class, which is an optional but very fun introduction to faith formation classes. Students who attend Catholic School and are entering Grade 2 need to register in the parish, as sacramental preparation takes place in the parish rather than in school.

For Grades 6-8: There are two in-person class options for middle school students. At Sacred Heart, classes are Tuesdays 7:00-8:00pm. At Our Lady's, classes are Mondays 7:00-8:00pm. Classes begin October 3 & 4.

For Confirmation Preparation (typically Grades 9 & 10): We have made the decision to combine our two parish programs into one collaborative program, to be hosted at Our Lady's on Sunday evenings 7:00-8:15pm. Classes begin September 18 for Grade 9; October 30 for Grade 10

We are also excited to add a family volunteer service component to the homeschool program!
