From Fr. Dan, Pastor

Dear Friends,

Welcome! We are honored you are here!

Texas shootings: Pope condemns indiscriminate trafficking of arms: Pope Francis said his heart was broken at the loss of innocent lives. "I am praying for the children and adults who were killed, and for their families. It is time to say enough to the indiscriminate trafficking of arms. Let us all commit ourselves so that such tragedies can never happen again."

The same article on the official Vatican Website went on as follows. Cardinal Blase J. Cupich, Archbishop of Chicago, said: "America is awash in guns. We have more firearms than people," he said. "As I reflect on this latest American massacre, I keep returning to the questions: Who are we as a nation if we do not act to protect our children? What do we love more: our instruments of death or our future?"

The Cardinal noted that mass shootings have become a daily reality in America today, recalling that just last week dozens of people fell victims to such events. "The size of the crisis, and its sheer horror, make it all too easy to toss up one's hands and declare: Nothing can be done. But that is the counsel of despair, and we are a people of hope. What do we hope for our children?" he said.

"We must weep and soak in the grief that comes with the knowledge that these children of God were cut down by a man who was just a few years their senior," Cardinal Cupich continued and then issued an urgent appeal: "But then we must steel ourselves to act in the face of what seems like insurmountable despair." He pointed out that gun safety measures make a difference, and that a 2021 Northwestern Medicine study found that the Federal Assault Weapons Ban prevented 10 mass shootings during the 10 years it was in effect. "Researchers also determined that if the ban had remained in place in the years since it was allowed to expire, it could have prevented another 30 public mass shootings that killed 339 people and injured 1139 more," he continued.

"The Second Amendment did not come down from Sinai. The right to bear arms will never be more important than human life. Our children have rights too. And our elected officials have a moral duty to protect them." (<https://www.vaticannews.va/en/pope/news/2022-05/pope-francis-heartbroken-at-latest-us-shooting.html>).

STATEMENT ON UVALDE, TX SHOOTING

"Today's tragedy in Uvalde, Texas leaves us all stunned by the unthinkable loss of so many innocent young lives and the teacher[s] who devoted [their lives] to educating and nurturing the children.

Our nation has too often become a place of unspeakable crimes of gun violence that have taken far too many lives, though none more heartbreaking than innocent children. We must take action to stop this senseless carnage.

We pray for the grieving families and the Uvalde community, whose lives are forever changed. In this moment we embrace them with prayers for peace and healing as we commend to the Lord those lost, consoled by the promise of eternal life. "

Support for the SHOL Racial Justice Ministry

The Sacred Heart & Our Lady's Racial Justice Ministry, which was started by a group of parishioners, began meeting twice a month over a year and a half ago to promote true equality and equity of human beings within the Catholic Church and the world. Shortly thereafter, we were fortunate to have Deanna Morgan, who earned a Master's of Christian Education at Princeton Theological Seminary, volunteer to lead the group. By use of media, guest speakers, books, and action to be taken, members of the group immersed themselves in non-white cultures and began to confront the sin of racism.

In mid October 2021, the Ministry held a virtual Racial Justice Retreat entitled "Awaken to Racism", attended by over 50 SHOL parishioners and others from local parishes. This retreat, with guest speakers and discussions that followed, was the first of its kind and one that we hope to have annually. Currently, we are following the curriculum for "Faith and Racial Healing: Embracing Truth, Justice, and Restoration" created by Just Faith Ministries. The group meets once a month on Zoom, and all members of the parishes are welcome to join. This new curriculum requires the use of books and Session Guides that are needed to address race and racism from a spiritual perspective.

In order to fund these programs for our parishes, we are asking for support from current participants, those who would like to become involved, and those who believe this is a worthwhile ministry. 

An excerpt from His Bulletin Column
May 27, 2007
Pentecost Sunday—Liturgical Year C

When the Son completed the work with which the Father had entrusted him on earth, the Holy Spirit was sent on the day of Pentecost to sanctify the Church unceasingly, and thus enable believers to have access to the Father through Christ in the one Spirit. He is the Spirit of life, the fountain of water welling up to give eternal life. Through him the Father gives life to men, dead because of sin, until he raises up their mortal bodies in Christ..

[Moreover,] the Holy Spirit not only sanctifies and guides God's people by the sacraments and the ministries, and enriches it with virtues, he also distributes special graces among the faithful of every state of life, *assigning his gifts to each as he chooses*. By means of these special gifts, he equips them and makes them eager for various activities and responsibilities that benefit the Church in its renewal or its increase in accordance with the text: *To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for a good purpose*.

These charisms, the simpler and more widespread, as well as the most outstanding, should be accepted with a sense of gratitude and consolation, since in a very special way they answer and serve the needs of the Church.

"(De)Facing White Supremacy" Pax Christi Webinar on June 7

"(De)Facing White Supremacy" is a webinar intended to create space for deep reflection and discussion about the identity of Pax Christi USA as a Catholic institution that aspires to be anti-racist. As a Catholic organization in the United States, Pax Christi believes [we] "must reflect on our identity as a largely white organization in a human institution that has yet to fully acknowledge its historical sins toward Black and Indigenous peoples and its continued role in supporting white supremacy."

The webinar is directed specifically at white members of Pax Christi USA (and other white Catholics), with the intention of providing a starting point to begin to do the work of facing, confessing, and dismantling white supremacy, and working toward the goal of racial solidarity. Even though it is directed to white Catholics, all are welcome to participate.

The webinar will address three questions:

- 1) How do we name the point the Catholic Church in the United States is in, in regards to anti-black supremacy?
- 2) How did we get here historically, socially, politically, economically, and ecclesially?
- 3) What is our work going forward to undo anti-black white supremacy in Pax Christi USA and our church and world?
