

2022 Mother Caroline Academy School Supply Drive

It's time to buy school supplies! Through September 11. Mother Caroline Academy (MCA) is a tuition-free independent school for girls in Grades 3-8, serving traditionally underresourced Boston neighborhoods. The Grade 3

class is new this fall, and the Board of Trustees has approved a plan to add Grades K, 1, and 2 over the next few years since early education is the key for longevity and academic success. MCA is growing and needs additional support and new donors.

Each fall, SHOL parishioners have been very generous in donating school supplies for the 65 students and 10 teachers at MCA. Donations are requested in the form of Amazon, Staples, or Target gift cards. Since many of the families experience food insecurity, they have little to no money for school supplies, and MCA provides all school supplies to them! Our drive runs through the weekend of September 11. However, if possible, please send your donations early so that the students and teachers have supplies as they begin the school year.

Fr. John Sassani Homily Given on September 5, 2010 Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time Liturgical Year C

I was 8 years old during the Cuban Missile Crisis. I have mostly vague recollections of it, but there are two things I remember very clearly. The first was my fear that my father would have to go to war. The second was something my mother said during that time. The context, of course, was the possibility of a Communist attack on the US. We were talking at supper, talking about the crisis and the "godless communists". And my mother said, "If I have to die for my faith in Christ, well, that's what I'd have to do." I was astounded.

Christ is calling his disciples to prioritize their lives around him. My mother did just that – and said as much during the Cuban Missile Crisis. She built on a foundation that her family laid; I built on a foundation that my family laid. One of my mother's dearest possessions was our – her family's – importance in her life – and hers in our lives. But Christ had also captured her imagination in such a way that Christ took priority over us.

In today's second reading from Sacred Scripture, Philemon, Onesimus, and Paul give us another example of this. The letter of St. Paul to Philemon is the shortest letter of St. Paul that we have – less than 500 words! It is a personal letter. Philemon was a member of the church at Colossae, and St. Paul sent this personal letter to Philemon at the same time as his letter to the Colossians as a community.

Philemon was a church leader who owned a slave named Onesimus. Onesimus escaped and fled to Rome; coincidentally, he met Paul while Paul was in prison. Philemon legally could have had Onesimus whipped,

imprisoned, or crucified for escaping. Paul though writes and asks Philemon to receive Onesimus back – not as an escaped slave, not as a slave, but as a brother in the Lord.

Paul here is not advocating for the abolishment of slavery. He is advocating for an idea that would lead to it: that in Christ, we are one. (Galatians 3:26-28: For through faith you are all children of God in Christ Jesus. For all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free person, there is not male and female; for you are all one in Christ Jesus.)

This idea, born of faith in Christ, changed the relationship between slaves and masters. Eventually, it changed the institution of slavery itself. Ideas – Gospel ideas – what St. Paul calls *having the mind of Christ*, is crucial. My mother reordered her natural priorities as she put on the mind of Christ.

This begs the question: What ideas of ours need to be reformed by Christ and brought into harmony with his mind and heart? What needs to be reformed so that we can let our faith influence how we treat one another, the choices we make, the things we endure and suffer, and the unequivocal stands we have to take?

Christ came to change the world: heart by heart, mind by mind, idea by idea. He speaks now every day by prayer. He speaks every day in the Sacred Scriptures – to influence, develop, or change our ideas. As we gather for the Eucharist today, let's give him the freedom to do that.

Season of Creation 2022: Listen to the Voice of Creation

"Laudato Si', mi' Senore"—"Praise be to you, my Lord." In the words of this beautiful canticle, St. Francis of Assisi reminds us that our common

is like a sister with whom we share our life and a beautiful mother who opens her arms to embrace

us. (1) This sister now cries out to us because of the harm we have inflicted on her by our irresponsible use and abuse of the goods with which God has endowed her. We have come to see ourselves as her lords and masters, entitled to plunder her at will...We have forgotten that we ourselves are dust of the earth; our very bodies are made up of her elements, we breathe her air and we receive life and refreshment from her waters. (2)...The deterioration of the environment and of society affects the most vulnerable people on the planet. (48) (From Laudato Si': On Care for Our Common Home, by Pope Francis)

During this Season of Creation, we are asked to listen deeply to the voice of Creation. Let us listen to the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor, who are affected most by what we do to the earth.

Prayer: Holy Spirit of God, we struggle to listen to your wisdom in and through all that is. We need you to guide us in listening to creation, caring wisely and with love for it and the great web of life in which we live and move and have our being.



Religious Education News: Registration Deadlines Are Approaching!

Registration Continues! Our first registration deadline for Grades K-8 (to begin class on the first day) is Monday, September 19 [Grade 9 registrations must be received by Sunday, September 4; Grade 10 by Sunday, October 16]. Of course, we welcome registrations after these dates. We are eager to receive your registration soon! All information can be found online at https://sholnewton.org/religious-education

The registration form (for all grades and both parishes) is online at https://forms.office.com/r/NjBAE9Ef42.

Volunteers Needed: We are still in need of many more volunteers to serve as catechists (teachers), assistants, hall monitors, and small group leaders (for Confirmation). Please consider whether the Lord is calling you; contact the staff to learn more!

For Grades K-5: There are three in-person class options for elementary school students:

Sundays 8:45-9:45am at Our Lady's (first day: Oct 2) Mondays 4:00-5:00pm at Our Lady's (first day: Oct 3) Tuesdays 4:00-5:00pm at Sacred Heart (first day: Oct 4) (Also, there is one Grade 5 class during the middle school session on Monday 7:00-8:00pm at Our Lady's)

A special note for families with early elementary students: preparation for First Penance and First Holy Communion is a two-year program, with both Grade 1 and Grade 2 classes required before First Communion. We also have a Kindergarten class, which is an optional but very fun introduction to faith formation classes. Students who attend Catholic School and are entering Grade 2 need to register in the parish, as sacrament prep takes place in the parish rather than in school.

For Grades 6-8: There are two in-person class options for middle school students:

Mondays 7:00-8:00pm at Our Lady's (first day: Oct 3) Tuesdays 7:00-8:00pm at Sacred Heart (first day: Oct 4)

For Confirmation Preparation (typically Grades 9 & 10): Confirmation preparation is done collaboratively across our two parishes, with classes at Our Lady's on Sunday evenings 7:00-8:15pm. Classes begin September 18 for Grade 9; October 30 for Grade 10.

Please be aware that high school students who wish to celebrate Confirmation must enroll in the preparation program for two consecutive years—typically but not always Gr. 9 & 10.

Homeschool Option: We are happy to continue offering a homeschool/virtual option for those who need it (all grades except sacrament prep). It will look a bit different from the last two years, but will still include weekly lessons at home and Zoom check-ins with staff. We are also excited to add a family volunteer service component to the homeschool program!

Welcome Back! Finally, we know that the pandemic upended so much of what was normal, including faith formation and sacramental preparation. We are eager to hear from any families who may have been away from Mass and/or Religious Education for the last few years—you are so very welcome to come back! It is always a good time to draw closer to Jesus and His Church! Please reach out!


Festa Donation
