From Fr. Dan, Pastor

Dear Friends,

Your coming to Mass warms my heart! It really feels uplifting to see you all. Thanks for choosing to spend your valuable time worshipping Jesus and receiving his real presence in Holy Communion.

“I experience religious dread whenever I find myself thinking that I know the limits of God's grace, since I am utterly certain it exceeds any imagination a human being might have of it. God does, after all, so love the world.” — Marilynne Robinson,

“Detective Steven McDonald: Peacemaker (1957–2017). In 1986, Detective Steven McDonald, a New York City policeman, was shot three times by a fifteen-year-old boy, a suspected bicycle thief. Though he survived, McDonald was paralyzed from the neck down. He would have to relearn how to live, dependent on others for his daily care. But he felt he needed to learn more. ‘I prayed that I would be changed, that the person I was would be replaced by something new.’ He was determined to let go of the anger and bitterness that his injury had unleashed: ‘I needed to free myself of those emotions so that I could love my wife and our child and those around us.’ McDonald kept that pledge. He reached out to the boy

who had shot him and forgave him. But beyond his assailant, his commitment to live in a spirit of forgiveness also meant a determination not to be defined by his disability and all that had been taken from him. He spoke widely at schools and churches, proclaiming the power of forgiveness, but also trying to break the cycle of violence that makes victims of so many people, including those like the boy who shot him—a young man whom ‘society had failed way before he met me in Central Park.’ McDonald died on January 10, 2017. Cardinal Timothy Dolan, who presided at his funeral Mass at St. Patrick's Cathedral, remembered McDonald as ‘an icon of mercy and forgiveness, a prophet of the dignity of all human life.’ ‘Just like you have to work to keep your body fit and your mind alert, you've got to work on your heart too. Forgiving is not just a one-time decision. You've got to live forgiveness, every day.’

Livestreaming Mass from Our Collaborative Coming Soon!

By Holy Week, and maybe as early as late March, we will be live streaming the 9:30am Mass from Sacred Heart every Sunday to all who would like to view it in both Our Lady's and Sacred Heart. (We will also be live streaming the Holy Week services.) This will differ from our former practice during the Covid shutdown of making a taped Mass, with one camera, and with me doing it alone. This will be a livestream, utilizing multiple cameras, of the actual 9:30am Mass, with the full congregation, the music ministry, etc. The reason for doing this at Sacred Heart is that it is easier and less expensive to do it there instead of Our Lady's. Still, this is a service intended for both parishes, with a special concern for those who are unable to attend in person. In addition, we will post the Mass, so that you will

have the option of viewing the Mass as it is being done live, or doing so at the time of your choosing. Special thanks to Nick Frega and Erica Johnson for leading this effort. — Fr. Dan

January 22– Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's readings are filled with inspiration and instruction and offers us great words of encouragement! Isaiah reminds us that we no longer walk in darkness. Synod Voices

Pope Francis has asked for Catholics around the world to participate in a global synodal process, to promote "Communion, Participation, and Mission" by all members of the Church. This began with a local consultation, which was synthesized into a national report, and the national reports around the globe were synthesized into a working document. We will include some quotes, directly from the participants, to share from these various documents over the coming months.

These first two quotes come from the synthesis document from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops:

Synod Voice: "The value of simply listening is a clear message of the Synod process. People must be able to speak honestly on even the most controversial topics without fear of rejection. We must be open to new ideas and

new ways of doing things. That will require an understanding of what is central to the identity of church, diocese, and parish; and what changes can help us grow rather than feel threatened." (Anonymous participant)

Synod Voice: "Throughout the synodal process, it was evident that most participants genuinely believe that support for one another is essential—laity and clergy; Churched and unchurched; and those in need of healing." (Anonymous participant)

Homily Given January 27, 2008
Third Sunday in Ordinary Time
Liturgical Year A

In some ways, most of us could be meteorologists. We can't interpret atmospheric pressure, but we can interpret the atmosphere – the feeling – and speculate about the climate, the human atmosphere. You walk into a household and feel the peace, or you walk into a household and feel the tension. If the household atmosphere is good, you feel it; if it isn't, you feel it.

We have several households represented in the Sacred Scripture we hear proclaimed today. Jesus has moved from Nazareth to Capernaum. Here, he met the sons of Zebedee – James and John – and Peter and Andrew. There is no atmosphere to interpret here except this: the two pairs of brothers seem to be working well together. The atmosphere of the Zebedee home may have changed when James and John left their father alone to mend the nets when they followed Jesus.

The second reading is a bit different. The Christians in Corinth met in the households of some of its members, and there was some division within and among them. Paul has heard that the atmosphere is bad, and he wants to address it. There are factions: rich and poor, theological opinions, various personalities. Paul urges them to be united, as brothers and sisters. The word used here for "united" means *putting things back together that have been separated*, like mending a net.

The Church has a certain unity, though much more is

needed to be sure. We have just concluded the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, an observance that's been going on for 100 years this year. Here in the Archdiocese, parishes are still keeping vigil to stay open, Catholics are alienated because of the sex abuse crisis, and parishes are closing. And of course, there were the troubles here at Our Lady's two years ago. The atmosphere seems normal now, but there may be deep resentments, ongoing hurts, and hidden – or, at times, not-so-hidden – rifts.

When the atmosphere is bad in our households, none of us wait too long to clear the air. In the Church, it should be the same. The net for being fishers of men and women is nothing other than us. People are caught for Christ by communities that are Christlike. If the net of the Church needs mending, people will not get caught. Christ is the fisher of men and women; we are the net. Christ mends us by the Eucharist – the family meal that makes us one in Him to change us.

The bread and the wine are easily changed by the power of God; the bread and the wine have no will to resist. But *our* will allows or prevents the changing that Christ seeks. As we gather for the Eucharist today, let's allow the Word helps soften our will and deepen our desire for the change that the Eucharist seeks to accomplish – that we should **be** the Body of Christ, changing the atmosphere of the world into the Kingdom of Heaven.

Monthly Food Collection Is Coming Back!

Our monthly collection of a specific food item, suspended when Covid first hit, will resume in February! Because St. Francis House, the previous recipient of our donations, is not accepting food donations, we will be supporting the Kids Club Program at the Centre St Food Pantry (CSFP). The program began, pre-Covid, as a way to assist families during school vacations and during the summer when meals provided in schools were not avail-

able. It first expanded to a year-round effort when schools were closed due to Covid and now assists the many families who have turned to the food pantry for support because of rising food prices. Because of the great need (500+ bags per month), CSFP depends on food donations to supplement what it can buy with its budget. Stay tuned for collection details in the next few weeks.

Sacred Heart Parking Lot Explanation

I (Fr. Dan) am sorry that I did not share this explanation earlier. The reason that the location of the drive-in entrance on Crescent Avenue to the parking lot was moved 15 yards was to cooperate with our outstanding tenant, the Weilan School. (The rent from the Weilan School contributes greatly to the funding of the pastoral work in our parish.) This change makes things safer for the young children going in and out of the main school entrance.

I must admit that, being a "creature of habit" and being within two months of my 67th birthday, I myself have sometimes bypassed the new entrance location! Thanks to all for adapting to this new change.

Our Lady's News

Going Green! Numerous and Significant Lighting Upgrades in Process at Our Lady's!

Over the past few months, we've been working closely with Eversource and their contractors to replace the older and inefficient bulbs and fixtures within the Parish Center, Dearborn School, and the Church. Excepting the Church, the work has been completed. The labor and material costs for these improvements in the Parish Center and School totaled \$148,000, yet the cost to the parish was **entirely forgiven (\$0)** due to Eversource incentives. Eversource expects we'll save \$26,000/year in electricity costs because of these lighting upgrades.

The Church remains the last (and most complicated) phase of the project. The chandelier lights are not the issue and will be replaced beginning the week of January 23. The problem is with the ceiling attic lights. The older (and dimmable) configuration (circa 1995) and the hazardous height of the fixtures proposes a unique challenge. Regardless, the contractor who will be onsite the week of January 23 will assess and offer solutions. The goal is to replace the missing ceiling lights with safe, dimmable and longer lasting bulbs that preserve the warm tones that work so well in the Church. Also, lighting in the sanctuary is to be improved – for example, making the lighting on the Ambo the same wonderful brightness we already have achieved with the altar and presider's chair. This projected cost is TBD, but, thanks to your generous support of the Grand Annual Collection, we're in a position to fund this work. Once complete, the parish can anticipate a Church electrical savings of \$23,000/year.

Thank you for your support! Know that we are investing your gifts toward the long-term benefit of our parish!




