Dear Friends,

**Ash Wednesday is this Wednesday!** Please spread the word. Most Catholics want to come to Church that day and could easily miss out as the date varies from year to year. Your mentioning it can make all the difference.

**Welcome! Thank you for choosing to spend your valuable time** coming to Mass with us. I hope you feel warmly welcomed, refreshed, spiritually renewed, and that you make Sacred Heart and Our Lady's your spiritual home.

**The Earthquake: Our heartfelt love, prayers and material aid** go out to the people of Turkey and Syria in the wake of this horrible tragedy.

**Grateful to God for Vaccinations and Paxlovid minimizing my Covid.** While I got Covid on Sunday Feb 5, being fully vaccinated and then calling my doctor (and she put me on Paxlovid) made the experience much easier than it would have been. Thank you Jesus!

**“May looking at the Last Judgement never frighten us: rather, may it impel us to live the present better.”** This tells us that the expectation of the Lord's return is the time of action in which we should bring God's gifts to

fruition, not for ourselves but for him, for the Church, for others. The is the time to seek to increase goodness in the world always. Have you thought about the talents that God has given you? Have you thought of how you can put them at the service of others? Life is not given to us to be jealously guarded for ourselves, but is given to us so that we may give it in turn. A word about the passage on the Last Judgement in which the Lord's Second Coming is described, when he will judge all human beings, the living and the dead (cf. Mt 25: 31-46). The image used by the Evangelist is that of the shepherd who separates the sheep from the goats. On his right he places those who have acted in accordance with God's will, who went to the aid of their hungry, thirsty, foreign, naked, sick or imprisoned neighbor. This tells us that God will judge us on our love, on how we have loved our brothers and sisters, especially the weakest and the neediest. Of course we must always have clearly in mind that we are justified, we are saved through grace, through an act of freely-given love by God. Christ comes to bring us the mercy of a God who saves.” – Pope Francis.

**Special Collection for Earthquake Relief This Weekend**

The images coming out of Turkey and Syria following the 7.8 magnitude earthquake on February 6 show us that the people there are experiencing immense suffering, destruction, and death. There are reports that the death toll has surpassed 40,000 and continues to rise. Catholic Relief Services reports that “across affected areas in both countries, apartment buildings and schools have been leveled. For Syrians, the damage took place in areas already devastated by years of war. In Turkey, the airports and the high roads of Anatolia are closed, and most hospitals are unusable. Schools have been closed across the country.”

Recognizing the growing need for assistance, Cardinal Seán has asked that a special collection be taken this weekend. Funds raised will help to provide safe shelter, and access to food, clean water, and hygiene supplies.

## Black Catholics on the Path to Sainthood

Last year, our Collaborative Book Club read Shannon Dee Williams's *Subversive Habits*. It tells the story of Black Catholic women in the U.S. who were called to the religious life at a time when no white religious congregation would accept them, or allowed them to enter but segregated them or treated them as second class citizens. I was amazed by the strength with which these valiant women embraced and followed their vocations.

Three of them (Mother Mary Lange, Mother Henriette Delille and Sister Thea Bowman) are now on the official path to Sainthood. Their stories are told, along with those of three other Black American Catholics, Pierre Toussaint, Augustus Tolton and Julia Greeley, in an excellent film entitled *A Place at the Table: African Americans on the Path to Sainthood*. All of them exhibited heroic virtue in seeking to follow God's call and serve God's people despite the sin and scandal of racism in the U.S. Catholic Church during their lifetimes.

Whether they were born into slavery, as Pierre Toussaint, Augustus Tolton and Julia Greeley were, or born free but limited at every turn by the structures of caste, they persevered in their vocations, and their dedication to good works. Mother Lange and Mother Delille both founded religious congregations when they were excluded from all white orders. Father Tolton was rejected

by every American seminary but he worked to become fluent in Italian in order to attend the Pontifical Urbaniana University in Rome. He was ordained the first American Black Catholic Priest.

Pierre Toussaint and Julia Greeley were angels of charity in their adopted homes of New York City and Denver. Sister Thea worked to share Black spirituality and culture with our American Catholic Church and ended a presentation to the Bishops of the U.S.C.C.B by joining hands with them as they all sang "We Shall Overcome" together.

It is truly impossible to do justice to the lives of these remarkable Christians here, but I would encourage everyone to see the film or learn more about their stories in a number of online articles like this one: <http://www.catholicmessenger.net/2022/11/african-american-catholics-on-the-path-to-sainthood/>

## Mail and Bank Fraud Alert

- If you discover a discrepancy, notify your bank and the parish immediately.

## Catholic School Scholarship Fund Opportunity

Do you know the family of a Catholic school student who would benefit from a \$1000 scholarship? Applicants must be in grades 1-8 of the school year for which they are applying for a grant. ## Synod Voices

Pope Francis has asked for Catholics around the world to participate in a global synodal process, to promote "Communion, Participation, and Mission" by all members of the Church.

**Synod Voice:** "Throughout the synodal process, it was evident that most participants genuinely believe that support for one another is essential—laity and clergy; Churched and unchurched; and those in need of healing." (Anonymous participant)

**Synod Voice:** "People at both ends of the political spectrum have set up camp opposing the 'others,' forgetting that they are one in the Body of Christ. Partisan politics is infiltrating homilies and ministry, and this trend has created divisions and intimidation among believers; our use of media increasingly serves to reinforce our preconceived notions or preferred ideology." **Homily Given February 21, 2011**  
**Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time**  
**Liturgical Year A**

There was a news story recently that asked, if Osama bin Laden were captured, should he be held at Guantanamo Bay or on the United States mainland? A poll was taken, and not many people liked either option. One reporter interviewed someone who suggested that the US should kill bin Laden but never report it. Christians must have participated in this poll.

In today's Gospel, we are still in the Sermon on the Mount. Two weeks ago in that same Sermon, we heard Jesus tell us that we are to be the Light of the World and the Salt of the Earth. How did this apply? How are we to do that and be those things?

Back in Jesus' time, justice was proportional. A balanced response. "An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth". But Jesus – he advocates for no vengeance at all. No hitting back, no showing anger. In the Holy Land at that time, soldiers could conscript people to carry their equipment for one mile. Jesus says –

choose to go two miles. Jesus chooses all this.


Jesus was betrayed – he forgives. Jesus was slapped across the face – he doesn't raise his hand, only asks, "Why did you hit me?" Jesus tells us to love our neighbor and, when asked "Who is my neighbor?", makes it clear that it's everyone, even our enemies. Even when he hangs on the cross, Jesus says to the thief, "Today you are with me in paradise".

We face many challenges: tension, resentment, anger, hatred. Between and among Christians. Between and among Catholics or even fellow parishioners. Between us and "the Archdiocese". It may seem like the light we are called to share is dim at best. It may feel like we are incapable of enhancing or improving a situation, like salt can enhance the taste of food.

As we gather for the Eucharist today, let's ask Christ to give us the courage and strength we need to follow his instructions, so as to make the Kingdom of God more tangible in our world.

### Company of Grace: Celebrating Sacred Stories





### What about Fasting and Abstinence?

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of our Roman Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59, with exceptions for reasons of illness, pregnancy, and breastfeeding. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of our Roman Catholic Church from age 14 onwards, with exceptions as stated above.




