

From Fr. Dan, Pastor

Church as a field hospital: Perhaps one of the most poignant images of the church that Pope Francis has conjured was his description early on of the church as "a field hospital" during an interview with Jesuit Father Antonio Spadaro in August 2013. During that conversation, which took place in three different meetings, Francis said, "The thing the church needs most today is the ability to heal wounds and to warm the hearts of the faithful; it needs nearness, proximity. I see the church as a field hospital after battle." "It is useless to ask a seriously injured person if he has high cholesterol and about the level of his blood sugars! You have to heal his wounds. Then we can talk about everything else," he said.

The Scrutinies are special rites that help prepare the Elect (those participating in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults—RCIA—to enter the Church). The purpose of the Scrutinies is to "uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful..." and "...to strengthen all that is upright, strong, and good".

March 26—Fifth Sunday of Lent

As we draw closer to the end of Lent, our spiritual journey must continue! Today's readings give us hope and reassurance that God's spirit remains with us. Hear again God's promise to Ezekiel and us: "I will put my spirit in you that you may live...I have promised, and I will do it, says the LORD." Jesus also gives us assurance of the life that awaits us: "whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die." Change in Distanced Seating and Masking Policies

Beginning on Holy Thursday, we have made the decision to open up all available seating in our churches and will no longer be roping off pews for distanced seating. In addition, masks will become optional for clergy and Ministers of Holy Communion. This decision has been made to reflect the lower Covid levels and increasing Mass attendance that both parishes are seeing (both of these facts are truly wonderful!). The staff encourages those who have a concern with these changes to reach out.

**Livestreaming Mass Beginning
Palm Sunday, April 2, 2023**

We will be livestreaming the 9:30am Sunday Mass from Sacred Heart every week to both Our Lady's and Sacred Heart. (We will also be livestreaming the three 7:30pm Holy Week services.) This will be a livestream, utilizing multiple cameras, of the actual 9:30am Mass, with the full congregation, the music ministry, etc. Please note: in addition to the livestream, we will post a recording of the Mass, so that you will have the option of worshipping live, or doing so at the time of your choosing. Special thanks to Nick Frega and Erica Johnson for putting a huge amount of time into this!

An item we considered was: should we do this for both churches or just one at this time? And if one, which one? In consultation with the finance councils and the staff, it was decided to do one parish for now, and Sacred Heart was chosen. Here is why. (1) The cost is very considerable and so doing one – at least for now – was a substantial savings. (2) Why Sacred Heart? The Sacred Heart upstairs church already has the necessary high volume Wi-Fi in place to do livestreaming, while at this time Our Lady's Church building does not. Nonetheless, this livestreaming is a service intended for both parishes. I would also not rule out the possibility that in the future we can invest in the livestreaming infrastructure for Our Lady's too. One step at a time. Thanks for your sensitive understanding of this. We are so happy to be able to provide this service to those who are unable to attend in person. Our beloved homebound parishioners are so very important! Love and God bless you! – Fr. Dan

Fr. John Sassani Homily Given on April 10, 2011 Fifth Sunday of Lent—Liturgical Year A

What things at a house break and need to be fixed? The dryer, the dishwasher, the oil burner, the air conditioner, the transmission in the car, the computer...So, someone comes to the house or you bring it somewhere – to be fixed.

It seems like the Gospel today is a fix-it story. Lazarus was sick, and he died because Jesus was late in arriving. Jesus comes late, but he can still fix him – at least that's what Martha and Mary desire.

Jesus doesn't seem to agree. He didn't say, "I am the resurrector for Lazarus." Instead, he says to Martha and Mary, "I am the Resurrection and the Life." He resurrects Lazarus to reveal that he is the Resurrection and the Life.

The experiences recounted in the Sacred Scripture today may seem remote to us – Adam and Eve in the Garden, Jesus in the desert. They seem to be not only distant from our life but opposite to each other, only linked by temptation.

In the second century, St. Irenaeus wrote, "The Glory of God is the human person fully alive." Jesus is the Resurrection and the Life, and his mission is for us to have abundant life through him. Lazarus died again sometime after the recounting of today's Gospel, but he died differently because Jesus had changed his life once before.

There was a day of prayer for a group of people yesterday, and one part of the day was to reenact the washing of the feet. A man told me about the experience of having his feet washed – he was self-conscious and hesitant as the priest washed his feet. But he also felt like Jesus was washing away all kinds of things from his whole life. This wasn't a pedicure but a cure – a changed life. The relationship between this man and Christ changed. The man became more fully alive and more fully connected to Jesus as his Way, his Truth, and his Life.

Lent is offering that change for those preparing for Baptism at Easter, and the Christian life is offering it to the rest of us, today and every day, over and over again.


With the Lord

What about Fasting and Abstinence?

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of our Roman Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59, with exceptions for reasons of illness, pregnancy, and breastfeeding. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of our Roman Catholic Church from age 14 onwards, with exceptions as stated above.

Thanks from the Sisters of St. Joseph Prison Aftercare

When women are released from prison, volunteers with whom they have been meeting go shopping with them. Your gifts help to purchase personal care products, household necessities, and clothing to help them as they restart their lives after prison. Egg Tree Outreach for Easter

Newton Freedge Drive—March Item: Rice & Beans

Our support of the Newton Food Pantry Freedge (at 420 Watertown St) continues! In March, we are collecting **rice (boxed or bagged) and beans (dried in bags or canned)**.

Donations can be dropped in the bin by the St. Patrick statue in the church (this is on the parking lot side of the church building, under the stairs that lead up to the main church). Students attending in-person Religious Ed classes can also bring donations to class and give them to a staff person. Thank you!

Lenten Campaign for Honduras Scholarships

Here in our own community and country as a whole, we know that children and teenagers have suffered because of the lack of in-person school for portions of the Covid pandemic. Many students are now behind in their studies, and parents, teachers, and counselors report the increasing mental health challenges so many young people face as a result of not being in school. Virtual classes were available, but they do not come close to the experience of being with peers and teachers personally.

Consider, then, the effects of the pandemic on children in our sister parish of San Marcos, Honduras, where in-school classes only became available toward the end of 2022 for three months. The pandemic has been devastating to these students and also to their families.

This year, the San Marcos committee that ran the scholarship program is beginning it again. An insert in last weekend's bulletin at Our Lady's explained that the renewed scholarship program will fund 50 students, elementary and high school, with an average of \$300 per child. A new selection process will reach out to more of the very poorest families from the most remote areas, to ensure those children have the opportunity to be given financial help for shoes, books and supplies, uniforms, transportation to school, even food.

This weekend, members of the Honduras Committee are at the back of church after all Masses at Our Lady's, with displays of the San Marcos community and of children who have received scholarships in the past. We hope you'll visit them, pick up a flier, and possibly contribute to the scholarship program. The children and their families are so grateful for the help of our parishioners. Muchas gracias!




