

#### From Fr. Dan, Pastor

Dear Friends,

God is a welcoming God and we warmly welcome you to Sacred Heart and Our Lady's. God welcomes anyone and everyone into His family. Jesus always welcomed anyone into His presence. We warmly welcome you!

"The family who does not face at least one major problem does not exist." A revered priest told us this in the seminary. Pope Francis recently addressed this issue with regard to the Holy Family. "The way the Holy Family lived their life, poor, facing obstacles, with such sorrow -- this tells us something very beautiful: God, whom we often imagine to be beyond problems, came to live our life with its problems. As the son of a mother and father, Jesus lived in a family where he spent most of his time growing, learning, in everyday life. And he did not avoid difficulties. Rather, in choosing a family, a family that was 'expert in suffering,' he says this to our families: 'If you are facing difficulties, I know what you are experiencing. I experienced it. I, my mother and my father, we experienced it so we can say to your family too: You are not alone!""

**Entitlement or Service?:** There are two

fundamentally different approaches to life: Entitlement and Service. We Catholics choose service. We follow Jesus who said, "he came to serve, not to be served." As the three kings gave their gifts to Jesus, we give our talents and gifts to Jesus in service of his mission of making the world a better place. Allow me to illustrate this with a heartwarming true story of service. About a century ago, a poor beggar played his violin on a bridge were many people walked by. Sadly, few people ever took notice, and as a result the donations dropped into the beggar's hat were hardly enough to keep him alive. However, one day, a stranger stopped, and instead of giving him a little money, he took the violin and started playing it, producing incredibly beautiful music.

In no time, huge crowds gathered around, and the beggar's hat was overflowing with money, dramatically changing the beggar's fortunes. The man who helped the beggar was the famous Italian violinist Niccolo Paganini. Paganini could have acted entitled, but instead, like Jesus, he used his gifts to help others. That is what we Catholics do.

People often ask for an example of a "best practice" to understand what evangelization looks like. Today's gospel sums it up clearly – one-on-one relationships. Who are you being called to bring to Jesus?

# Fr. John Sassani Homily Given on January 18, 2009 Second Sunday in Ordinary Time—Liturgical Year B

All of us have encountered unex-

pected circumstances in our lives. Fr. Sean McGraw, away for the holidays, expected to be back last Tuesday but, because of bad weather in South Bend and here, he is coming back now, five days later.

Some unexpected circumstances create opportunity. I married a couple a few years ago who met at the airplane gate for a snow-delayed flight. The lengthening time led to conversation that led to follow-up phone calls, subsequent meetings, and eventually marriage.

Something like that happens in today's Gospel. John the Baptist is there with two of his disciples and points toward Jesus. It's four o'clock in the afternoon of the Sabbath, a day of restricted travel. But the disciples go and see. They spend a whole day with Jesus unexpectedly and never go back. What seems like happenstance becomes a lifechanging experience.

Something like that has happened to us – perhaps because of the family we were born into. Or it may be that one parent was Catholic or a future spouse was Catholic or a person of influence was a Catholic. But these circumstances became the opportuni-

ty for Christ to touch your life. For me, the unexpected circumstance was a high school retreat. The Brother who gave the retreat used this text: "Come and see." I heard it referring to my question, "Should I become a priest?" I went and saw...and I discovered not only a vocation as a priest but a vocation as a follower of Christ.

The Gospel says that the disciples asked, "Where are you staying?" and that they stayed with Jesus. "Stayed" is a very passive word. The Greek word is "abiding" or "remaining" – it is an active verb, the verb that describes the relationship of the Father and the Son and the relationship of the Father and Son and the disciple. The unexpected circumstances led to a life-long and life-altering experience.

Christ is constantly asking us, "What are you looking for?" Christ constantly invites us, "Come and see." And, when we do, we find what we need.

What is your disciple story? What were the unexpected circumstances that prompted your following and abiding with Christ?

You may have the occasion, like John the Baptist, to point to Christ, to be the unexpected circumstance for others. We need to be ready!
