

From Fr. Dan, Pastor

Dear Friends,

The wonder of Holy Week is here! You are warmly invited to the moving liturgies of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and Easter!

Your ministry makes the difference! I see you reaching out with loving care to each other and all. You bring Christ's love and help to all in so many ways. The presence of Jesus and of Sacred Heart and Our Lady's is way more than the clergy, or the staff. It also is the ministry of all of you. Thank you!

When Love Dawns on Us: "God is like a lover who loves and whose love is not returned. So God has to wait, and God waits for a change of heart in his beloved. God waits, and does not force, because to force would be to violate the law of love. God waits until the strength of his love begins to dawn on the one whom he loves and who is not yet able to return it. And God reveals himself this way, hoping that the beloved will begin to open his or her eyes and ears to what God has done. This change of heart in the beloved, you and me, is conversion. This conversion, this change of heart, includes repentance. Repentance is not

repentance for a Christian unless it includes the realization of forgiveness. If it did not, it would be shame or remorse. But for the Christian, sorrow for our sins, a realization of our weakness, is never depressing, should never make us downcast, because if it is truly the result of the grace of God then at the same time it includes the dawning, the realization of what God's forgiveness is. So repentance for the Christian is always, paradoxically, a joyous occasion, one that leads to peace."—Cardinal Basil Hume, adapted from "A Turning to God."

New Refugee Ministry: Can You Help?

We are thrilled to announce that our collaborative is partnering with the Sisters of Saint Joseph and Catholic Charities to welcome a refugee family! We expect the family will arrive in the next 4-8 weeks. At this point, we don't know any details other than it will be a family.

This is an exciting opportunity to work collaboratively, and there are numerous volunteer opportunities. Here is a sample list:

Welcoming – meet the family at the airport and arrange for food and meals for the first week post-arrival.

Housing – set up the house and source furniture, household goods, etc. Note that several pieces have already been secured.

Education – coordinate school sign-up.

Medical – sign the family up for medical care and help them understand how medical care works.

Job Sourcing – understand the family's skill sets and help them find employment.

Social – welcome them and show them around the neighborhood.

Please note that the family is coming to the US via a federally-funded program that has been in place for over 40 years. They will have had background and medical checks. They will arrive as lawful permanent residents and should be able to work right away (provided their Social Security cards are in hand).

Msgr. Dennis Sheehan Homily Given on 2009 Palm Sunday—Liturgical Year B

Go back with me to that gospel story of Jesus entry into Jerusalem. He's greeted by joyous crowds. But most of the story is about getting a donkey for Jesus to ride on.

That's right. The gospel says that everything gets going when Jesus sends two disciples to get a colt. He enters Jerusalem as a kingly hero. Here he will usher in the reign of God. But it will only happen when they finally get him transportation.

Jesus sends two disciples on the errand. Now no one really knows what they were thinking. Who knows? Maybe it was James and John. Those were the two who had asked to sit at Jesus right and left in this glory. They had bigger ambitions than being on donkey detail.

Here's Jesus, about to enter Jerusalem and go headto-head with the powers of this world. But these two disciples are sent to grab a free donkey.

We read Mark's gospel today. Overall, it doesn't paint the disciples of Jesus as rocket scientists or heroes. More often, they misunderstand and say stupid things. But here it's a little different. If they hadn't done as Jesus said, there would have been no Palm Sunday. No one would have waved branches or shouted Hosanna! They did the small

task, found the donkey, and look! Jesus came to Jerusalem!

Take that as a picture of a disciple. We're that kind. We clean the church. We split the palms. We rehearse the music. Some disciples preach and cast out demons. But most of us are on donkey detail. We take the meatloaf to the hungry neighbor. We bake the cookies and serve the funeral for a family who's lost a loved one. We sell the coffee that feeds people in faraway Honduras. Through these and countless other donkey jobs, we prepare the way for Jesus. We do those things that make it possible for Jesus to enter.

I have a friend who made a pulpit for his parish church. He gathered the wood, did the carpentry, finished the surfaces. I hope every preacher who ever stands in that pulpit realizes that his preaching rest on the quiet effort of one faithful man. God's Word gets through because of the gracefilled, loving, and hardworking hands that put that pulpit together.

Donkey detail? Thank God for it. Then and now, it paves the way for Jesus.

Blessed Palm Sunday! Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

Over the weekend of January 20 & 21, Cardinal Seán O'Malley announced a major change to the Archdiocesan policy - moving the typical age of Confirmation from 15/16 to 13/14 (Grade 10 to Grade 8) over the course of the next several years.

As a staff, we look forward to participating in many meetings and conversations in the months ahead, both on the archdiocesan level and the parish/collaborative level. We

Scholarships for Children in San Marcos

During Lent, Our Lady's parishioners are contributing funds to support educational necessities for 60 poor children of our sister parish, San Marcos in Honduras. The parish itself is huge; the territory of the parish is actually much greater than the municipality of San Marcos. At 106 sq. mi., the parish is more than twice the area of the City of Boston (48 sq. miles). In this environment of such long distances, it is difficult for children to get to school.

Gloria Guadalupe Rodezno Mejia, age 6, lived in a very impoverished area with her single mother and younger sister. Her mother sold clothing and utensils door to door to support the little girls. But a school was two hours away on foot, too far for a small child to go. So her mother decided to send Gloria to live with the child's godmother, a widow whose husband died in an accident working in the U.S. That woman, Yolanda, lives closer to a

school and gives Gloria a home with her. So after not being able to attend kindergarten, Gloria went into first grade this year. A scholarship enables her to have shoes, a uniform, supplies and books, even food or medicine if needed.






