New Refugee Ministry: Can You Help?

We are thrilled to announce that our collaborative is partnering with the Sisters of Saint Joseph and Catholic Charities to welcome a refugee family! At this point, we don't know any details other than it will be a family, but we expect to be matched SOON and look forward to sharing more information with our collaborative community as we have it.

This is an exciting opportunity for real hands-on ministry, and there are numerous volunteer opportunities. Here is what we predict will be needed so far:

Welcoming – freshen up and set up the house with groceries and other welcoming gestures; arrange for food and meals for the first week post-arrival; be neighborly for their first few months with us - guiding them through our neighborhood!

Education – coordinate school and daycare sign-up; aid in acclimating the parents and children to our school and daycare system; provide English tutoring and practice

Medical – sign the family up for medical and dental care and help them understand how medical care works; possibly accompany them on appointments

Job Sourcing – understand the family's skill sets and help them find employment

Finances – support the family as they work towards financial independence with budgeting and saving plans

Please note that the family is coming to the US via a federally-funded program that has been in place for over 40 years. They will have had background and medical checks. They will arrive as lawful permanent residents and should be able to work right away (provided their Social Security cards are in hand).

Msgr. Dennis Sheehan Homily Given on April 24, 2011 Easter Sunday of the Lord's Resurrection

It's quite a story, isn't it? Two women at sunrise, there at Jesus' tomb. Suddenly, the earthquake, the angel like a bolt of lightning moving the rock like whisking a feather. What to make of it all?

Well, first of all, it's a story of contrast. The guards, we are told, are so filled with fear they are like dead men. So much for the power of this world. They lie in a trembling heap before the awesome glory of Jesus risen. They thought they were masters of it all, making sure the dead stay dead. On Easter, the dead one lives, and the powers of this world are relegated to death.

Contrast indeed. The guard shakes in fear before the angel of life. The two weeping women? "Do not fear." We're told that, after hearing the angel, they left in a mixture of fear and joy. Fear in the new. Joy in the hope of life.

But again, what to make of it all? Place yourself for a moment at the tomb that Easter dawn. Maybe you know something of what those women are going through. They hear the angel: "He is risen!" They see the door of the tomb agape and inside on-

ly bare stone walls! Are they totally convinced? Probably not. Neither, I venture, are many of us. We're mixtures of joy, hope, and fear every Easter. We want it all to be true.

So what's our Easter summons? "Go quickly. Tell what you heard. Then you will see him." You and I meet the Easter Jesus when we take the leap like them, risk the dare, and cry out to any and all: "He is risen! He is risen!"

We won't meet Jesus the way the women did as they ran from the tomb. But it's a vital part of my faith – and hopefully yours – that we have a whole host of meeting places with Jesus. He is risen in our prayer. He is risen in our Eucharist. He is risen, yes, in our trials, our frustrations, our disappointments. We will see him as those women did. We will see him as his disciples did. Not at the tomb or in Galilee, but in life right here and now.

Go then, says the angel. Go then, says the risen Lord. Trust that you'll see him if you really look. Blessed Easter to all. Christ is risen. He is truly risen.



Over the weekend of January 20 & 21, Cardinal Seán O'Malley announced a major change to the Archdiocesan policy - moving the typical age of Confirmation from 15/16 to 13/14 (Grade 10 to Grade 8) over the course of the next several years.

San Marcos Students: Growing through Scholarships

Here at Our Lady's, we are raising funds to help 60 very poor children from our sister parish, San Marcos in Honduras, go to school. Our contributions provide them with shoes, uniforms, books, supplies, transportation, even food and medicine if needed—whatever will enable a child to participate fully in an education. About half of the 60 are in elementary school (primaria) and half in high school (secondaria).

This week, we learned about one scholarship recipient: Angelica Maria Gonzales Lopez, a 13-year-old girl who lives with her single mother Noreida and her great-grandmother, in the house of the older woman. Noreida and Angelica sell vegetables to others to support their family. But Noreida values education very much, At 17, she became pregnant with Angelica, and she couldn't finish high school. Now 30, this motivated mother has gone back to complete high school. In the evenings, she and Angelica are both studying! They applied for a scholarship because their limited income from selling vegetables is not enough. They are involved

in the parish too. Angelica has been an altar server since age 9. Noreida volunteers with the parish's TV channel, Comunidad TV, which broadcasts Mass and other programs to the large territory of the parish, including 64 villages, where they are viewed on phones, not TVs.

We welcome you to become part of the Our Lady's community of support for these children—the very poor who would have a difficult time going to school if not for a scholarship. If
