

Dear Friends,

You are so welcomed in this place. We hope you'll come again. It is an honor to have you with us. Jesus smiles upon you. You are family. Welcome, Welcome!

Three weeks until Easter and only two weeks until Holy Week starts. Please spread the word.

A proposal of love: What "is new and original about the Christian faith? It is not so much the sum of precepts and moral norms but rather, it is first and foremost a proposal of love which God makes through Jesus and continues to make with humanity. It is an invitation to enter into this love story." — Pope Francis.

"What Thing? Several years ago, I was pondering a fall from grace in my past and was fretting about it. I turned to God in prayer and asked, "You remember that THING I did back then?" God's response was, "What THING?" And I replied, "You know...that THING! Of course you remember. You're God." And God said, "Ummm, actually I don't remember. You see, as soon as you ask for forgiveness, I forget it. So, no, I don't remember." This experience came to mind as I reflected

on the promises in today's reading from Ezekiel. His prophecy reveals such a compassionate side of God, who is so much freer and more flexible than we humans are. There is no malice in God. We may stew over injuries or mistakes, but God's energy is not spent there. God clears the slate. Could we possibly believe in such benevolence, especially if we do not see it modeled in the human community? God does not perseverate over our failings and fallings. God wants only the good and recognizes it when it is chosen. How lucky are we?! God's memory is long, but only for the good and for the Love to which we come running back. As a vulnerable human being, I wish my memory and that of others was calibrated like that. Lent is a good time to recalibrate our efforts. Breathe a huge sigh of relief. We are saved. We are healed. We are forgiven. Aren't they all maybe the same thing? Love looks like this."—Nicki Verploegen

New Refugee Ministry—Can You Help?

We are thrilled to announce that our collaborative is partnering with the Sisters of Saint Joseph and Catholic Charities to welcome a refugee family! We expect the family will arrive in the next 4-8 weeks. At this point, we don't know any details other than it will be a family.

This is an exciting opportunity to work collaboratively, and there are numerous volunteer opportunities. Here is a sample list: *Welcoming* – meet the family at the airport and arrange for food

and meals for the first week post-arrival. *Housing* – set up the house and source furniture, household goods, etc. Note that several pieces have already been secured.

Education – coordinate school sign-up.

Medical – sign the family up for medical care and help them understand how medical care works.

Job Sourcing – understand the family's skill sets and help them find employment.

Social – welcome them and show them around the neighborhood.

Please note that the family is coming to the US via a federally-funded program that has been in place for over 40 years. They will have had background and medical checks. They will arrive as lawful permanent residents and should be able to work right away (provided their Social Security cards are in hand).

What about Fasting and Abstinence?

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of our Roman Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59, with exceptions for reasons of illness, pregnancy, and breastfeeding. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of our Roman Catholic Church from age 14 onwards, with exceptions as stated above.

Fr. John Sassani Homily Given on March 22, 2009 Fourth Sunday of Lent—Liturgical Year B

I served at St. John's in Winthrop for seven years. I had been there a couple of years when, on Saturday as I was preparing my homily, a man called. He said his niece had been in an accident and was seriously injured – would I come – and of course I did. His niece Kirsten was 17 years old. She had been out jogging and was hit by a drunken driver. She was in the hospital all summer for surgery and rehabilitation. Two years later, she was a student at Brown University, living in a dorm – and permanently confined to a wheelchair. Kirsten's parents were heartbroken, experiencing a chronic sorrow. Then they went on a pilgrimage to Medjugorje in Yugoslavia to pray for a cure. Kirsten was not cured, but her parents were.

St. Paul says that God is rich in mercy. Where we were dead, He brought us back to life in Christ. This is want happened to my friends – not the healing of their daughter's paralysis, but the restoration of their hope.

Jesus says that God sent Him into the world not to condemn the world but that we might be saved. Salvation doesn't always look the way we think it should. The Risen Christ on Easter is still wounded.

It's how His disciples know He is not a ghost.

Often salvation is the gift of hope in the face of despair. This hope is not only hope for me or for you or for us, but our Christian protest against suffering and despair. My friends began a Christmas ministry where they and their family and friends befriended poorer families for Christmas in a sustained way. This gave them a chance to protest against suffering in a tangible way.

People who are given hope and can offer hope are needed in a world marked by starvation, exploitation, addiction, disease, growing poverty and homelessness.

Today is Laetare Sunday. We are called to Rejoice! Lent is half over. That may be no big deal. But suffering is half over – not just political or economic or medical, but by the death and Resurrection of Christ. It includes our living new lives, not only lives marked by hope for ourselves but by the good works that protest against despair and sorrow. It is lives marked by hope and good works that gather more and more people into the hope that Christ offers.



Scholarships for Children in San Marcos

As we have done in previous Lents, Our Lady's is raising funds for scholarships to help poor families of our sister parish, San Marcos, Honduras, send their children to school. Due to a lot of transition in San Marcos this past year, we are late starting our campaign, but the committee there is eager to assist 60 children in getting an education with our help. Scholarships are an average of \$300/year and cover necessities for school like shoes, supplies, uniforms, transportation, even food and medicine for children if needed. Next weekend, we'll describe the newly structured parish of San Marcos in a flyer, and there will be information tables at the back of church about the scholarship program.

In the meantime, we want to introduce you to a dear little girl who is one of the 60 recipients of a scholarship: Dayani Gloribel Rodriguez Ramos. At age 8, Dayani has seen a lot of struggle in her life. Her parents have worked hard and have moved from place to place so her father could get seasonal farm and day jobs. They have lived with her grandmother, her aunt, and a cousin, making fiber-woven mats to support themselves. As Dayani got

to be school age, they moved to a place that had a school, but they found that no teacher was assigned. So, after a year, they had to move on. They finally settled in the village of La Ascencion within the San Marcos parish territory. Dayani missed out on Grades K & 1 (except for learning numbers and letters from her grand-

mother), but she finally started school in Grade 2. Once settled in Ascencion, the family got very involved in the parish, and her father is now a volunteer catechist (pastoral leader of the village Base Ecclesial Community). She and her family are a story of love, overcoming obstacles, and faith. Today Dayani is in Grade 3, and a scholarship gives her and her family hope for her future.




