

## New Refugee Ministry—Can You Help?

We are thrilled to announce that our collaborative is partnering with the Sisters of Saint Joseph and Catholic Charities to welcome a refugee family! We expect the family will arrive in the next 4-8 weeks. At this point, we don't know any details other than it will be a family.

This is an exciting opportunity to work collaboratively, and there are numerous volunteer opportunities. Here is a sample list:

**Welcoming** – meet the family at the airport and arrange for food and meals for the first week post-arrival.

*Housing* – set up the house and source furniture, household goods, etc. Note that several pieces have already been secured. *Education* – coordinate school sign-up.

**Medical** – sign the family up for medical care and help them understand how medical care works.

**Job Sourcing** – understand the family's skill sets and help them find employment.

**Social** – welcome them and show them around the neighborhood.

Please note that the family is coming to the US via a federallyfunded program that has been in place for over 40 years. They will have had background and medical checks. They will arrive as lawful permanent residents and should be able to work right away (provided their Social Security cards are in hand).

#### What about Fasting and Abstinence?

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of our Roman Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59, with exceptions for reasons of illness, pregnancy, and breastfeeding. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of our Roman Catholic Church from age 14 onwards, with exceptions as stated above.

## Fr. John Sassani Homily Given on March 25, 2012 Fifth Sunday of Lent—Liturgical Year B

Some of you may be part of a family business, but probably most of us are not. If there was anything that could be considered a family business in my family, it would be medicine. Two uncles, an aunt, and my sister were all in medical fields. My uncle in Swampscott tried to lure me in. He gave me a job cleaning his office. He even had me observe the lab tech, hoping it would hook me. Obviously it didn't!

Jesus, on the other hand, joined the family business – not the carpentry that Joseph taught Him, but the work of salvation that He learned from His Father.

God the Father labored to bring about creation and to sustain it at every moment. Christ is at work to bring about salvation. Creation is beautiful, and yet it is flawed and, at times, dark. So are we. We are made in the image of God, and yet we are flawed.

The work of salvation is accomplished at a great cost. The Gospel compares it to a grain of wheat that, only after it falls to the ground and dies, can it bear great fruit. St. Paul in the second reading tells us that Jesus offered prayers and supplications with loud cries and tears to God. Jesus was not stoic – but He was obedient through it all.

We are His brothers and sisters. He has drawn us to Himself. May we do the same for others, so that they experience His selfless love ...that we and they may experience the blessings that selfless love offers.



## Scholarships for Children in San Marcos

Our Lady's has had a sister parish relationship with San Marcos, a parish in San Marcos Ocotepeque, Honduras, for almost 25 years. In the early years, we supported the parish by helping fund some building projects, and the people of the parish supported us with their amazing faith and their prayers for us. When we decided, at the San Marcos parishioners' request, about 13 years ago to fund scholarships for elementary and high school children, we became aware of the beautiful souls of these children, as they sent us messages of gratitude and love and trust in God each year. In the back of church this weekend, you can see many of their cards and messages from over the years. One scholarship is an average of \$300 per school year, used for necessities such as shoes, books and supplies, transportation, uniforms, even food or medicine if a child needs it.

Elkin Natanael, age 16 and in Grade 9, is the grateful recipient of a scholarship this year. He lives with his mother, younger brother, and grandparents. His father abandoned them after his mother was diagnosed with epilepsy, and she is unable to work because of her condition. So most of the family's support came from his

uncle, who had gone North to support them and others in his family, but he died in a work accident in the U.S. Elkin's grandfather, at 76, is the main support of the family now, helping pick the coffee harvest from November to January, and doing some farming work. Since money is scarce for them, a scholarship helps fill their great need so that Elkin can go to high school in San Marcos.

We are hoping to fund 60 children with scholarships this year. We are so thankful


