

## From Fr. Dan, Pastor

Dear Friends,

**Feel Welcomed!** We feel privileged to have you here today. Welcome, Welcome!

Pope Leo: "We should try not to miss any opportunity to act with love. . . . In Lk 12:32-48, Jesus invites us to consider how we will invest the treasure that is our life. He says: "Sell your possessions and give alms."

He exhorts us not to keep to ourselves the gifts that God has given us, but rather to use them generously for the good of others, especially those most in need of our help. It is not simply a matter of sharing the material goods we have, but putting our skills, time, love, presence and compassion at the service of others. In short, everything in God's plan that makes each of us a priceless and unrepeatable good, a living and breathing asset, must be cultivated and invested in order to grow.

The works of mercy are the most secure and profitable bank where we can entrust the treasure of our existence, because there, as the Gospel teaches us, with "two small copper coins" even the poor widow becomes the richest person in the world (cf. Mk 12:41-44).

In this regard, Saint Augustine says: "If you gave a pound of coppers and received a pound of silver, or a pound of silver and received one of gold, you would be delighted at your luck. What you give will certainly be transformed; it isn't gold, it isn't silver, but eternal life that will come your way" (Sermon 390, 2, PL 39, 1706). And he explains why: "It will be transformed, because you yourself will be transformed" (ibid).

To understand what he means by this, we can think of a mother who embraces her children: is she not the most beautiful and richest person in the world? Or a boyfriend and girlfriend, when they are together: do they not feel like king and queen? We could think of many other examples.

Therefore, wherever we are, in the family, parish, school or workplace, we should try not to miss any opportunity to act with love. This is the type of vigilance that Jesus asks of us: to grow in the habit of being attentive, ready and sensitive to one another, just as he is with us in every moment."

## **Special Collection: Hurricane Relief**

As you may know, Hurricane Melissa, a category 5 storm with winds of 180mph, slammed into Jamaica on October 28. People and communities in Jamaica, Haiti, and the Dominican Republic have experienced deaths, injuries, and widespread damage. Cuba and the Bahamas are also being impacted.

Recognizing the immediate and expected need for assistance, Archbishop Henning is requesting that pastors take up a special collection to support Catholic Relief Services. CRS is already on the ground and will provide lifesaving support—including emergency shelter, clean water and essential supplies—to families most at risk.

The Archdiocese of Boston has a proud history of stepping forward to assist people in need here in the United States and around the world. Sacred Heart & Our Lady's will hold our collection on November 8 & 9. Parishioners are asked to address their checks to the parish with "Hurricane Melissa Relief" in the memo. The parish will then monies to the Archdiocese of Boston for distribution to Catholic Relief Services.

time is very important. One photo usually stands out. All the relatives from both the bride and groom's families gather together. All of them smile, the camera clicks, and presto! This moment in time is preserved in glorious color through the miracle we call photography.

Someday, decades later, another generation may look at that wedding snapshot. In a sense, that's what we do as a church today on the Feast of All Saints. Instead of a bride and bridegroom, Jesus Christ is at the center of today's family photo. But the camera has not yet clicked! Gathered with Jesus are the hosts of holy ones from every age and every land. Why has the photo not yet been shot? Because we're still gathering. We're the latest generation, the youngest holy ones. We're still walking toward the picture.

As we walk, we look today at those gathered around the Lord Jesus. There's John the Baptist dressed up in camel hair. There's Mary, Jesus' mother standing close. Why, look! Even Joachim and Anna, Jesus' grandparents, are in the crowd. And there Mary Magdalen, all dressed up for the photo.

But that's not all. Here's young King Louis of France, regal in his robes and crown. Next to him is Francis of Assisi who wore rags for Christ. There are children

On their wedding day, most couples take here, teenagers like Agnes the Roman martyr and Luigi the Jesuit novice. They're from all over – from Hungary to Harlem, from Chile to Korea. Strange though, isn't it? In the photo, they all look a bit like Jesus.

> Here come the latest. One is the neighbor you remember as a kid. There's your aunt who always had time for you. There's the neighborhood doctor. It's quite an invitation list and includes faces you remember and recognize.

> The family of Jesus is gathered and still gathering. That's the reason we celebrate all the saints today. Yes, even you and I, all of us, are moving toward Jesus. We're not all pretty or handsome, but a lot of us look a bit like Jesus.

You have an invitation to this photo of Jesus' family. The photo will be taken with a lens wide enough to span continents and centuries.

Remember the old song about the saints marching? Let me add a new verse to close:

*O when the saints all gather round* O when the saints all gather round I want to be there in that picture When the saints all gather round.

Happy Feast Day to all of you. Now move toward Jesus and we'll take that picture.

October Overview: In Grades K-1 and 3-7, our students use the Pflaum Gospel Weekly program to meet Jesus in the Gospel and to learn about the beauty of our Catholic faith. What we hear in Mass on Sundays we then learn about in class on Sundays, Mondays, and Tuesdays! Every student, no matter the grade, hears the same Gospel. That means, in the last few weeks, we've heard Jesus tell the story of Lazarus and the rich man, share about faith the size of a mustard seed, and the healing of the ten lepers. It is truly a gift to learn from Jesus each week in class!

Our **First Penance** classes are going well, and our young students are getting excited to celebrate God's mercy and love in the Sacrament of Penance in December! Thank you for keeping them in your prayers during this exciting year.

**Confirmation classes:** our Confirmation candidates in Grades 8 and up are using the Pflaum program "Gifted with the Spirit" as they prepare for the Sacrament of Confirmation in the spring. This program presents the beauty of our Catholic faith while giving students time for conversation and reflection

about their own personal relationship with Jesus.

We are also preparing for a Confirmation retreat day to Cape Cod in a few weeks. We know it will be a beautiful day of faith and friendship. Our fingers are crossed for mild weather!

Thank you for keeping our Confirmation Candidates in your prayers as they prepare for this sacrament, to be celebrated in May 2026.

# Please Help Care for Our Church and Be Kind to the Kneelers!

We have been finding more kneelers are getting broken, and we ask that more caution be taken with them. When the kneelers are in the upright position, please do not stand on them. The brackets and hardware aren't strong enough for this, and many of them have been breaking. The more caution we take, the longer the kneelers will last us! Please note: standing on the kneelers when they are down on the ground IS very much okay—especially for our littlest parishioners who do this to see better. 




