

Sacred Heart and Our Lady's Collaborative

From Fr. Dan, Pastor

Dear Friends,

Your coming to Mass warms my heart! It really feels uplifting to see you all. Thanks for choosing to spend your valuable time worshipping Jesus and receiving his Real Presence in Holy Communion.

Pope Leo: "Immersed in an ocean of infinite love." "The resurrection of the crucified Jesus from the dead sheds light on the destiny of each one of us. For he told us: 'This is the will of him who sent me, that I should lose nothing of all that he has given me, but raise it up on the last day' (*Jn* 6:39). Thus, the focus of God's concerns is clear: that no one should perish forever and that everyone should have their own place and radiate their unique beauty.

"This is the mystery that we celebrated on the Solemnity of All Saints: a communion of differences that, so to speak, extends God's life to all his daughters and sons who wish to share in it. It is the desire written in the heart of every human being, a longing for recognition, attention and joy. As Pope Benedict XVI explained, the expression 'eternal life' gives a name to this insuppressible expectation: not a succession of time without end, but being so immersed in an ocean of

infinite love that time, before, and after no longer exist. This fullness of life and joy in Christ is what we hope for and await with all our being.

"Each time that death seems definitively to take away a voice, a face or an entire world, interiorly we understand God's concern that no one perish. In fact, each person is an entire world. Without the memory of Jesus – of his life, death and resurrection – the immense treasure of daily life risks being forgotten. In the mind of Jesus, however, even those whom no one remembers, or whom history seems to have erased, always remain in their infinite dignity. Jesus, the rock which the builders rejected, is now the cornerstone (cf. *Acts* 4:11). That is the Easter proclamation. For this reason, Christians always remember the deceased in every Eucharist, and still today ask that those dear to them be remembered in the Eucharistic Prayer. From this proclamation arises the hope that no one will perish."

Special Collection: Hurricane Relief

As you may know, Hurricane Melissa, a category 5 storm with winds of 180mph, slammed into Jamaica on October 28. People and communities in Jamaica, Haiti, and the Dominican Republic have experienced deaths, injuries, and widespread damage. Cuba and the Bahamas are also being impacted.

Recognizing the immediate and expected need for assistance, Archbishop Henning is requesting that pastors take up a special collection to support Catholic Relief Services. CRS is already on the ground and will provide lifesaving support—including emergency shelter, clean water and essential supplies—to families most at risk.

The Archdiocese of Boston has a proud history of stepping forward to assist people in need here in the United States and around the world. Sacred Heart & Our Lady's is holding our collection this weekend, November 8 & 9. Parishioners are asked to address their checks to the parish with "Hurricane Melissa Relief" in the memo. The parishes will then send monies to the Archdiocese for distribution to Catholic Relief Services.

Cheverus Award Announcement

Msgr. Dennis Sheehan Homily Given on November 9, 2008 Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome

The Church's annual calendar of feasts and seasons is full of curiosities. Today's

November 9 Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome is just such a curiosity. For one thing, the feast outranks a normal Sunday. Let me ask two questions: 1 – What is the feast all about? 2 – What meaning could it possibly have for our life of faith and discipleship?

First, what are we celebrating? The Basilica of St. John in the Lateran ranks among the four chief churches of Rome. The other three are St. Mary Major, St. Peter's, and St. Paul Outside the Walls. This particular basilica – St. John – has been considered for centuries as the cathedral church of the diocese of Rome. The Pope is Rome's bishop, and St. John Lateran is his cathedral church. For centuries, the Popes lived in a palace next to St. John Lateran. The "Lateran" part refers to the family who originally owned the property around the basilica. The "basilica" piece refers to the large size and architecture of the church.

Above the main entry door of the Basilica of St. John Lateran is an inscription that reads like this: "This church is the mother and head of all the churches in this city and around the world". That's some claim! But Rome is special for Catholics. We look to the pope as the center of our unity. Celebrating the Pope's cathedral speaks quite

loudly of our communion as a worldwide – catholic – church.

What meaning for us? In the end, churches are buildings. But they are buildings where we come together. Under the roof of this parish church some of us were baptized (or will be today); some were Confirmed and received First Communion. This building is where we are reconciled as a sinful and forgiven people. We are married here. Above all we gather here for the central mystery of our life of faith – the celebration of Sunday Mass. Churches, yes, are "only buildings". But they are buildings full of faith, full of memory, full of grace, mercy and healing.

The real "church" here or in Rome is the communion of the faithful. Pope Leo I in the 400s was preaching on this feast in the Lateran Basilica. He observed that some people had complained that the church was too plain, not ornate enough. Let me remind us all, said Pope Leo 1600 years ago, you are the church's decoration; your life of faith is the beauty and splendor of this church. May the Pope's words be as true of us here as they were of his people then. The most beautiful fixture of any church is its gathered people, their faith, their care for one another, their service to one and all. There's ample reason, today gathered at the altar, to give thanks to the Lord our God.



October Overview: In Grades K-1 and 3-7, our students use the Pflaum Gospel Weekly program to meet Jesus in the Gospel and to learn about the beauty of our Catholic faith. What we hear in Mass on Sundays we then learn about in class on Sundays, Mondays, and Tuesdays! Every student, no matter the grade, hears the same Gospel. That means, in the last few weeks, we've heard Jesus tell the story of Lazarus and the rich man, share about faith the size of a mustard seed, and the healing of the ten lepers. It is truly a gift to learn from Jesus each week in class!

Our **First Penance** classes are going well, and our young students are getting excited to celebrate God's mercy and love in the Sacrament of Penance in December! Thank you for keeping them in your prayers during this exciting year.

Confirmation classes: our Confirmation candidates in Grades 8 and up are using the Pflaum program "Gifted with the Spirit" as they prepare for the Sacrament of Confirmation in the spring. This program presents the beauty of our Catholic faith while giving students time for conversation and reflection

about their own personal relationship with Jesus.

We are also preparing for a Confirmation retreat day to Cape Cod later this month. We know it will be a beautiful day of faith and friendship. Our fingers are crossed for mild weather!

Thank you for keeping our Confirmation Candidates in your prayers as they prepare for this sacrament, to be celebrated in May 2026.




