

From Fr. Dan, Pastor

Dear Friends,

We are glad that you are here with us. If this is your first or second time with us, we are extra-grateful that you have come to be with us. It is our hope that you experience the love of Jesus. You are always warmly welcomed here!

"All of you should be like-minded, sympathetic, loving toward one another, kindly disposed, and humble. Do not return evil for evil or insult for insult. Return a blessing instead. This you have been called to do, so that you may receive a blessing as your inheritance." —1 Peter 3:8-9

"Yet we are asked to forgive. Not just every abuse or pain or irritation that comes our way, but every time the memories of these things rise in our minds. Again. And again. We can't force ourselves to feel differently about those who hurt us. However, every time the memories of these things rise in our minds we can forgive, again and again, and again."

Archbishop Henning: He entrusted us with His work of healing and reconciliation. "With rising violence, deepening divide, and angry rhetoric, our culture slips towards darkness. It is easy in our culture to tear down and denigrate. The better path is the one in which we build up

and encourage. He entrusted us with His work of healing and reconciliation: 'Whatsoever you do for the least of these...' When human beings respond to that call and recognize the presence of the Lord among us in our brothers and sisters then hope abounds." —Archbishop Richard G. Henning, the Archbishop of Boston

Pilgrimage & Mass for the Season of Creation at Our Lady's

October 4 is a joyous day, the feast of St. Francis of Assisi. This year marks the 800th anniversary of his "Canticle of the Creatures," as well as the 10th Anniversary of Pope Francis' encyclical *Laudato Si: On Care for Our Common Home*.

In celebration, the Boston Catholic Climate Movement and the Archdiocese of Boston are co-sponsoring a pilgrimage and Mass for the Season of Creation on Saturday, October 4, at Our Lady's. A Pilgrimage of Hope for Creation will begin at 11:50am in front of the church, as we prayerfully visit three nearby sites that reflect the themes of Laudato Si. A special Mass for Creation will follow at 1pm, with Bishop Cristiano Barbosa, auxiliary bishop of Boston and the second native Brazilian bishop in the United States, presiding. After the Mass, a reception in the lower hall will offer conversation, networking, and sharing of resources and parish initiatives that bring Laudato Si to life. We hope you will join us!

September 28: 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's Gospel, the rich man showed no compassion or sense of responsibility for Lazarus, the man who was begging at his gate. He remained indifferent to the pain and hunger surrounding him, concerned only with his own comfort and pleasure. This parable challenges us to examine our own worldview: Do we turn a blind eye to those in need, unwilling to accept our responsibility for the poor, the stranger, and those who suffer around us? The rich man realized his responsibility too late! What will it take for us to truly listen to God's word, and respond with compassion and care? Recall Christ's words, "When you did it for one of these least ones. . . you did it for me." Christ awaits our response!

Fr. John Sassani Homily Given on September 30, 2007 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time Liturgical Year C

Today's first reading from Amos was chosen to prepare us to hear the parable of Jesus about the rich man and the poor man. And there is a reading from the Letter of St. James that is often chosen to prepare us for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. There may be a greater connection than there seems between those two readings.

By means of this parable that we hear today, Jesus isn't simply condemning the neglectful contempt that the rich man showed toward Lazarus. Jesus is indicating that faith is a way of life that looks in two directions: vertically to God and horizontally to neighbor. Jesus' idea of faith is both contemplative and active.

St. James, a close relative of Jesus, had a similar view of faith. Repeatedly in his brief letter, he calls Christians to not only hear the word – contemplation – but to be doers of the word – action. Faith is not only what we believe about God but how we accept the call of Christ to be his partners in the world.

But this partnership isn't just about action; it is also about prayer. Prayer allows Christ the opportunity to envision the life of the Kingdom of Heaven, so that – by action – that vision can be enacted. In the Kingdom, no one will be hungry and neglected like Lazarus, because

doers of the word assist the poor and neglected. In the Kingdom, no one will be so self-absorbed as to notice another only for personal gain, because doers of the word have the attitude of Christ, who came not to be served, but to serve. In the Kingdom, no one will be sick, because doers of the word pray for the sick and embody the healing touch of Christ for their wellbeing.

St. Theresa has a beautiful prayer about what it means to be doers of the word:

Christ has no body now but yours, no hands, no feet on earth but yours. Yours are the eyes through which he looks on the world with compassion. Christ has no body now on earth but yours.

Today, Christ looks on the sick with compassion – through *our* eyes. Today, his healing touch is given – through *our* hands.

And then there's Lazarus and the poor. The transformation of poverty, war, prejudice, disease, and so on is *Christ's* work, but he has no body now on earth but us. As we gather for the Eucharist today, Christ comes – Body and Blood, personally – so that we can be reinvigorated as His Body, to do his work by enacting the life of the Kingdom.

Religious Education—Classes Are Starting! There's Still Time to Register!



Registration for 2025-2026: Registration for the 2025-2026 school year is ongoing. Returning families had information sent to them by email, and we are so eager to hear from newly-registering families who will be joining us in the fall. All information can be found online at https://sholnewton.org/

<u>religiouseducation</u>. The registration form is online at https://forms.office.com/r/M6ZBLz1ew5 or scan the QR code here (this is one common form for all grades and both parishes).

Confirmation Age Change: Please visit https://sholnewton.org/confirmation-age-change to learn about how we are continuing the transition to Grade 8 Confirmation this year.

For Grades K-5: There are three in-person class options for elementary school students. At Sacred Heart, classes are Tuesdays 4:00-5:00pm. At Our Lady's, classes are Sundays 8:45-9:45am and Mondays 4:00-5:00pm. We also plan to offer one Grade 5 class during our Monday night (7:00-8:00pm) middle school class time at Our Lady's. Classes begin September 21 & 22 at Our Lady's; September 30 at Sacred Heart.

A special note for families with students in early elementary school: preparation for First Penance and First Holy Communion is a two-year program, with both Grade 1 and Grade 2 classes required before First Communion. We also have a Kindergarten class on Sunday mornings, which is an optional but very fun introduction to faith formation classes. Students who attend Catholic School and are entering Grade 2 need to register in the parish, as sacramental preparation takes place in the parish rather than in school.

For Grades 6 & 7: There are two in-person class options for Grade 6 & 7 students. At Sacred Heart, classes are Tuesdays 7:00-8:00pm. At Our Lady's, classes are Mondays 7:00-8:00pm. Classes begin September 23 at Our Lady's; September 30 at Sacred Heart.

For Confirmation Preparation (typically Grades 8 & 9; older grades welcome): Classes are held at Our Lady's on Sunday evenings. Session 1 meets 4:45-5:45pm; Session 2 meets 7:00-8:00pm. The 6pm Mass is celebrated in between. Both sessions will begin on September 21.

Homeschool Option: We are happy to continue offering a homeschool option for those who need it (all grades except sacrament prep). It will again consist of weekly lessons at home, Zoom check-ins with staff, and a family volunteer service component.

Welcome and Welcome Back! We are always eager to hear from any families who may have been away from Mass and/or Religious Education for the last few years—you are so very welcome to come back! And of course we are eager to hear from families who are new to our community. It is always a good time to draw closer to Jesus and His Church—please reach out!

Volunteers: Please consider volunteering as a catechist, assistant, or hall monitor in our Religious Education program. Training and support is available, and there is so much joy to discover in sharing faith!

This invisible but essential ministry is conducted quietly behind the scenes, primarily in participants' homes. All linens and towels used at Masses and all other Liturgical celebrations are washed and ironed each week. Volunteers pick up the linens on Monday of the week they are scheduled and return them by the end of the week. Guidelines are provided for the care of the linens. Frequency of service depends on



the number of participants but is generally about once a month. If you are looking for a way to serve the Parish in your home, this may be your calling. For more information, please contact Chris Graf at cmg829@comcast.net.
