

Total Consecration to Jesus Through Mary

For the 24th consecutive year, parishioners of St. Agnes are preparing for the Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary, as developed by St. Louis Marie de Montfort. The 33-day period of preparation begins on Monday, August 6th (the Feast of the Transfiguration of our Lord). The prayers are said personally and individually, and culminates on Friday, September 7th, with the vigil of the Nativity of The Blessed Mother. The Mass and Consecration on Saturday, September 8th, the Feast of the Nativity of The Blessed Virgin Mary, will however be public for all who are prepared to make their Consecration.

2nd collection for the Diocese of Parassala, India

This weekend St. Agnes welcomes Bishop Thomas Mar Eusebius of Parassala, India. His diocese is one of our youngest, having been established in August of 2017. The diocese of Parassala serves 40,000 Catholics out of 1.1 million people; most are of the Hindu religion. This is purely a mission diocese; it was born of the hard work of our missionary priests and religious and today has 103 parishes to its name! However, with only 27 priests and economic, social, and educational challenges, they are in need of support. Thankfully, they do have candidates for the priesthood, but due to a lack of resources, they cannot accommodate all applicants. Monthly expenses for a seminarian are about \$150. Please consider supporting this diocese with a contribution. Thank you!

Refresh my memory: Why do we use incense? What is a thurible?

At Mass and other liturgical services we see priests and acolytes (altar servers) swinging the thurible (THUR-eh-bel), sending clouds of incense wafting through the air. Incense has been used in the Christian liturgy from its earliest centuries. In fact, it was a part of the Jewish tradition that came before it, a use that was commanded by God, Himself, and recorded in scripture.

And the Lord said to Moses, "Take sweet spices, stacte, and onycha, and galbanum, sweet spices with pure frankincense (of each shall there be an equal part), and make an incense blended as by the perfumeer, seasoned with salt, pure and holy; and you shall beat some of it very small, and put part of it before the testimony in the tent of meeting where I shall meet with you; it shall be for you most holy. And the incense which you shall make according to its composition, you shall not make for yourselves; it shall be for you holy to the Lord. Whoever makes any like it to use as perfume shall be cut off from his people." (Exodus 30:34-38)

The smoke of the incense is symbolic of sanctification and purification, as well as symbolic of the prayers of the faithful. *It is one of the outward signs of spiritual realities*, and that is why it has its place in Christian liturgy. Source: Gretchen Filz, Catholicompany.com, 9/10/17.

You might see the priest bless the incense before using the thurible. His prayer might be similar to the one below:

"Be thou blessed + by Him in Whose honor thou shalt burn."



In August, we remember the Most Pure Heart of Mary

August brings us the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary on the 15th of month, *which is a Holy Day of Obligation*. Eight days later (an octave), on August 22nd, we have another special day for Our Lady: the current calendar celebrates the Queenship of Mary, while the calendar of 1962 celebrates the Immaculate Heart of Mary.



These are significant days.

On the day of her **Assumption**, Mary our Mother was solemnly crowned by Christ and received by the whole court of Heaven as Queen. Source: catholictradition.org/Mary

In October of 2002, Pope John Paul II, in his apostolic letter Rosarium Virginis Mariae wrote:

"Christ was raised in glory to the right hand of the Father,
while Mary herself would be raised to that same glory
in the Assumption, enjoying beforehand, by a unique privilege,
the destiny reserved for all the just at the resurrection of the dead.
Crowned in glory – as she appears in the last Glorious Mystery (of the Rosary)–
Mary shines forth as Queen of the Angels and Saints,
the anticipation and the supreme realization
of the eschatological state of the Church."

In 1954, the Holy Father, Venerable Pius XII, created the **Feast of the Queenship of Mary**. In his encyclical (a papal letter sent to all bishops of the Church) the Pope stated that, "The purpose of the Feast is that all may recognize more clearly and venerate more devoutly the merciful and motherly sovereignty of her who bore God in her womb." *Source: catholictradition.org/Mary*

The Immaculate Heart of Mary is a devotional name <u>used to refer to the interior life of the Blessed Virgin Mary</u>, her joys and sorrows, her virtues and hidden perfections, and, above all, her virginal love for God the Father, her maternal love for her son Jesus, and her compassionate love for all people.
