

A Note From the Pastor...

Dear Friends & Parishioners,

We have tried to create an atmosphere of peace and serenity by celebrating Holy Mass with devotion and by bringing God's mercy to you through the Sacrament of Confession. These two sacraments, along with other devotions, bring Christ to



midtown Manhattan at The Church of St. Agnes. In order for the Church to be a beautiful, clean, and safe place to pray requires a fantastic staff and financial support.

I am asking you to support St. Agnes in the offertory collection, through online contributions on your smartphone, or in any way that you can volunteer. I have been here a little over two and a half years and the pastor's term is limited. On the other hand, many of you have come, and will continue to come, to this parish. St. Agnes will continue to attract souls during the centuries ahead. We pray for the parish, but I am asking you to be generous in supporting St. Agnes by your financial contributions.

Many of you come from all around New York, New Jersey, Connecticut, Long Island, and beyond. I am sure you support your home parish. But St. Agnes is in the center of New York City since 1873 and it is a place where the Catholic Church should be, right in the middle of everyday life. Midtown Manhattan is where we can spend three to five dollars for coffee or \$15.00 for a sandwich and a bottle of water. I am asking you to spend that level of money to support St. Agnes. Nothing dramatic, but a good way to give generously. During Lent almsgiving is one of the principal ways to be penitent and to give glory to God.

I want to encourage you to come to weekday Mass at least once a week during Lent or visit the Blessed Sacrament in the afternoons for Eucharistic Adoration. Please see the bulletin or our website for out Lenten and Holy Week schedules.

This year we saw a big increase in Mass attendance for Ash Wednesday. Since then, we've seen a 25% increase in Mass attendance overall! Keep up the good work! Make good use of the Lenten Season by extending your commitment of time and prayer throughout the year. Your love for Jesus, for the Heavenly Father, doesn't end on Easter Sunday, and it shouldn't. Stay with us for the liturgical year. The Holy Spirit can help us to celebrate Feast Days to come! Remember that Divine Mercy Sunday is the Sunday right after Easter.

St. Agnes, pray for us! Mary, Mother of the Church, pray for us! Sacred Heart of Jesus, have mercy on us!
