

Total Consecration to Jesus Through Mary


For the 25th consecutive year, parishioners of St. Agnes are preparing for the Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary, as developed by St. Louis Marie de Montfort. The 33-day period of preparation begins on Tuesday, August 6th (the Feast of the Transfiguration of our Lord). The prayers are said personally and individually, and culminates on Saturday, September 7th, with the vigil of the Nativity of The Blessed Mother. The Mass and Consecration at 12:30pm on Sunday, September 8th, the Feast of the Nativity of The Blessed Virgin Mary, will, however, be public for all who are prepared to make their Consecration.

St. Louis Marie de Montfort—the proponent of this True Devotion to Jesus through Mary—proposed that, "the faithful consecration to Jesus through Mary is an effective way of living out our Baptismal commitment. It is giving ourselves entirely to the Blessed Virgin, in order to belong entirely to Jesus through her." Mary is the most conformed to Jesus—and that the more one is consecrated to her, the more one is consecrated to Jesus.

The preparatory prayer book, *Preparation for Total Consecration according to St. Louis Marie de Montfort*, is available in ENGLISH and SPANISH at the St. Agnes bookstore.
