

Plenary Indulgence Opportunity

A plenary indulgence is granted to the faithful who visit a church on the Feast Day of its Patron/Patroness. Spending some time at the church by reciting one Our Father and one Creed is the traditional "visit" required. The usual conditions of Confession, reception of the Eucharist, and prayers for The Holy Father* also apply. *One *Our Father*, one *Hail Mary*, and one *Glory Be* will do.

In Stock at the Bookstore: Daily Roman Missal

By popular request from our parishioners here at St. Agnes, the bookstore has the *Daily Roman Missal* available for sale (it has sold out more than once!). Using a missal is a personal choice, but a very worthwhile one. A missal encourages you to prepare for Mass by reading ahead, learning and working with the liturgical calendar, and having favorite prayers at the ready. It helps you to understand how the Church works in a way that leaflets and paper worship aids do not.

How do you know if you are ready to step up to using a missal?

- Mass is feeling stale for you
- You have never owned a missal before and have been a life-long Catholic
- You have worked with various prayer booklets and need something fresh
- You like having everything compiled into a single source
- You like a challenge! Missals take time to master. This is true for everyone, so be patient with yourself and work through the book at your own pace. Sunday Mass is an excellent place to start.

Features of the Daily Roman Missal include:

- Prayers, antiphons, and readings (A-B-C cycle for Sundays, two-year cycle for weekdays) for all Masses throughout the liturgical year
- English and Latin texts side-by-side for the Order of Mass (including the four Eucharistic Prayers), the Entrance and Communion Antiphons, the response to the Responsorial Psalm, the Sequence, the Alleluia verse before the Gospel, and many devotions and prayers
- Masses for all the Saints on the General Roman Calendar, adapted for use in the dioceses of the USA
- Liturgical Calendar of dates through 2031, six placeholder ribbons; the text is 10pt font
- Smyth-sewn binding has been reformulated to provide durability and allows the Missal to lay flat when open
- All this plus over 200 pages of devotions and prayers complete this exceptional, one-volume hand missal
- This gift-quality missal is available in classic black or (a very elegant) deep burgundy leather. By Scepter Publishing.

Note: The Daily Roman Missal follows the current Liturgical Calendar for English Masses.


