

Saints Simon and Jude - October 28



Listed among the Twelve Apostles in the New Testment, Simon is "the Canaanite" to Matthew and Mark and "the Zealot" to Luke; Jude is "Thaddeus" to Matthew and Mark, "Judas of James" to Luke, and "Judas, not Iscariot" to John. After Pentecost, they disappear. Howev-

er, according to Eastern tradition, Simon died peacefully in Edessa, while Western tradition has him evangelizing in Egypt, then teaming up with Jude, who had been in Mesopotamia, on a mission to Persia, where they were martyred on the same day. Simon is the patron saint of tanners and lumberjacks; Jude is the patron of desperate causes, possibly because early Christians would pray to him, with a name evoking Judas Iscariot, only when all else failed.

On the Church's calendar, we remember the faithful departed in the month of November. However, due to COVID, we've seen the need to talk about the deceased and how to use the Church's teachings and traditions to help those who may be in purgatory. We also hope that talking about the faithful departed now will help us all to make good use of November.

Did you know that St. Agnes has a parish Purgatorial Society? Our 12:30PM Sunday Mass is dedicated to those who are enrolled. For the period of one year, your intention will receive the spiritual benefits of a Sunday Mass, with the hope that they will offer relief to those who are still in Purgatory and help them to be Delivered into Heaven as soon as possible. This makes a wonderful, very helpful and meaningful gift to those who have lost a loved one. Your intention can be recently deceased or someone who died years ago. The Church sets no limits on this; you can enroll your great-great grandparent, if you like. When you enroll your intention, you will receive a gift-quality album with an image of our Lord (white album) or the Blessed Mother (navy album), plus a certificate that states your intention's name and information. Enrollment is available all year long. The fee is \$18/year. For an additional \$4, your album can be mailed through USPS.



All Soul's Day is Monday, November 2nd

Enroll your deceased friends and relatives into St. Agnes's All Souls Novena of Masses!

Note: This novena is offered once a year in the month of November.

How to enroll:

- 1. Pick up an envelope from the rectory office or the sacristy, fill out your information, and include your offering.
- 2. Provide your own envelope, include your contact info, the name(s) of your intentions, and your donation.

Envelopes can be returned to the rectory office or placed in the collection basket at Mass.

3. Make your donation online using *Zelle or Venmo* and then email your intentions to us at **church@stagneschurchnyc.org**

We will fill out an envelope for you.
