

Total Consecration to Jesus Through Mary



For the 27th consecutive year, parishioners of St. Agnes are preparing for the Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary, as developed by St. Louis Marie de Montfort. The 33-day period of preparation began on Friday, August 6th (the Feast of the Transfiguration of

our Lord). The prayers are said personally and individually, and culminates on Tuesday, September 7th. The Mass and Consecration, which will be public for all who have prepared, will be on Wednesday, September 8th (The Nativity of The Blessed Virgin Mary) at 5:10pm. This Mass will also be livestreamed on YouTube.

The prescribed guidebook, Preparation for Total Consecration according to St. Louis Marie de Montfort, is available for sale at the Rectory Office and Bookstore.

Saint Hippolytus

170 - 235

Feast Day – August 13

A theologian and martyr who died of ill-treatment in the quarries of Sardinia, Hippolytus was an important Christian in third-century Rome. In his writings, he attacked several popes for their doctrinal teaching and lax discipline. Followers set him up to rival Pope Callistus I, making him the first antipope. Banished to Sardinia during a Roman persecution, this cleric was there reconciled to the church and to another exile, Pope Pontian, with whom he shares this feast. He wrote in Greek and may have been from the East. His work "The Apostolic Tradition" preserved details about Christian life and customs in the early church. Visiting Rome around 212, Origen, a famous Christian teacher, and writer, went to hear Hippolytus preach.

Cecily is currently pursuing a degree in Organ Performance at The Juilliard School as a student of Dr. Paul Jacobs. She began studying the organ at age thirteen with Samuel Metzger. Within her first year of study, Cecily provided organ music for the demanding music program at New Presbyterian Church (Wilton Manors). Shortly after, she became Organist at The Chapel at Edgewater Pointe in her hometown. Cecily also studied with Mark Jones at First Presbyterian Church (Pompano Beach) and later, with Dr. Terry Yount at Saint Andrew's Conservatory (Sanford). She is the First Prize winner in both the New York chapter round and the Northeast regional final round of the 2021 Regional Competition for Young Organists (RCYO).
