Monday, November 1st All Saints Day



All Saints Day is classified as a Holy Day of Obligation, however when November 1st falls on a Saturday or a Monday, the obligation to attend Mass is abrogated.

This year Saint Agnes will have our regular Mass Schedule on All Saints Day. Mass will be celebrated at: 8:00 AM, 12:10 PM, 1:10 PM and 5:10 PM.

Even though you are not obligated to attend Mass this year, celebrating All Saints Day by attending Mass is a wonderful way to honor the saints, who constantly intercede with God on our behalf.

Saint Agnes offers premium candles that you can burn in memory of a loved one. These 7-day pillar candles, housed in a glass jar with a write-on label for your intention's name, can be placed in the church or you can take them home.

Candles can be purchased at the rectory office, the bookstore or from the sacristan and are priced at 1 for \$12 or 2 for \$20. This is a lovely way to remember your intention and to also help you focus your prayers for their soul.

World Mission Sunday is Next Weekend Sunday, October 24, 2021

Every year, something special happens on the next-to-last Sunday of October. World Mission Sunday joins all Catholics of the world into one community of faith. At Mass that Sunday, we recommit ourselves to our common vocation, through Baptism to be missionaries, through prayer, participation in the Eucharist, and by giving generously to the second collection next weekend for the Society for the Propagation of the Faith. Pope Francis' message for World Mission Sunday this year reflects on the theme: "We cannot but speak about what we have seen and heard" (Acts 4:20). He reminds us that, "as Christians, we cannot keep the Lord to ourselves," as we "recall with gratitude all those men and women who by their testimony of life help us to renew our baptismal commitment to be generous and joyful apostles of the Gospel."

On World Mission Sunday, we join our Holy Father in supporting his missions. As we pray and respond here at home, we share in those celebrations taking place in every parish and school throughout the world. Together, through our prayers and financial support, we bring the Lord's mercy and concrete help to the most vulnerable communities in the Pope's missions.

In a world where so much divides us, World Mission Sunday rejoices in our unity as missionaries by our Baptism, as it offers each one of us an opportunity to support the life giving presence of the Church among the poor and marginalized in more than 1,111 mission dioceses.



Saint Luke the Evangelist October 18

Early historians said this author of the third Gospel and the Acts of the Apostles was born to a pagan family in Antioch (Turkey) and converted to Christianity. According to Paul's letters and Acts, he was a doctor and Paul's companion during his later journeys and imprisonment in Rome. Luke's New Testament writings in Greek were for gentiles, extending to them the salvation promised to Israel. He is the patron of physicians and surgeons and, because of a legend that he painted a Marian icon, of painters. **Saint Luke the Evangelist, pray for us!**
