Jesus has made Himself the Bread of Life to give us life. Night and day, He is there. If you really want to grow in love, come back to the Eucharist, come back to that Adoration.

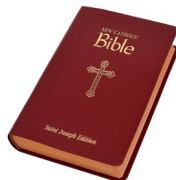

2022/2023 RCIA Course Rite of Christian Initiation

We will offer an RCIA Course starting on September 29, 2022 which covers all aspects of Catholic teaching including revelation, scripture, theology, the sacraments and the commandments.

This course will be free of charge.

Classes will switch between in person and online depending on the week. In person classes will take place at 7:00 PM on Thursdays. The first class will be in person on Thursday, September 29th at 7:00 PM.

This program is meant to serve:

- Those who are seeking baptism or wish to be received into the Catholic Church.
- Those who are seeking to complete their sacraments, such as First Communion and Confirmation.
- Those who wish to acquire a deeper knowledge of their faith.

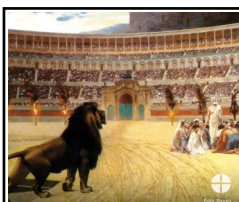
Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles

Feast Day – June 29

These apostles share a feast as founders of the church in Rome. Peter, a Galilean fisherman chosen by Christ as one of the Twelve Apostles, became the undisputed leader of the fledgling church after Pentecost. Paul, a Pharisee and Roman citizen who had persecuted Christians, became after his dramatic conversion the church's greatest missionary, its "apostle of the gentiles." By tradition both were martyred in Rome. Their adventures are recounted in the Acts of the Apostles, and letters from them are included in the New Testament.

The First Martyrs of Rome

Feast Day – June 30

After a raging fire destroyed two-thirds of Rome in 64, Emperor Nero blamed Rome's Christians to divert suspicion from himself. Those acknowledging their Christianity were arrested and executed. Some were covered in wax and set afire as torches; some were sewn into animal skins and cast into the arena with wild animals; others were crucified. Sts. Peter and Paul died in the same persecution. The feast of these earliest martyrs of the Roman church is celebrated a day after the joint feast of Peter and Paul. The Roman historian Tacitus said the protomartyrs were to be pitied "for it was felt that they were being sacrificed to one man's brutality."

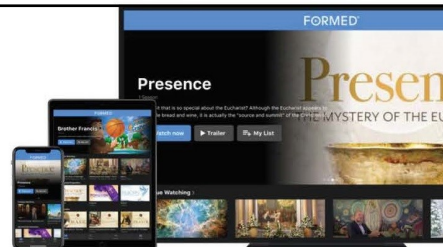
