

### **Message from our Pastor**

Our Lord is King, and many of the people of Jerusalem recognized who he is on Palm Sunday. Unfortunately, many eventually asked for his death by crucifixion, even though he was King who had done miracles and had preached about God so well. He raised people from the dead, made lame people walk, blind people see, deaf people, hear and learn how to speak.

Holy, holy, Lord God of Hosts! The people already recognize God is Holy in three ways, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, which Christ revealed to us. Heaven and Earth are filled with his glory! Palm Sunday, when we reflect on the Passion of Our Lord, we see God in Jesus Christ. Many people see it, but many were afraid to support Him at the end of his generous life.

What are the palms that we will lay down before the Lord as he enters Jerusalem? What small sacrifices may we make to show our love for him and our love for those around us in our family and in our environment? We support others by not complaining but by listening, being patient, not talking about people behind their backs by smiling, and holding our tongues, even if the person speaking is making a mistake.

We let go of our tendency to control and to let go of grudges and not give in to our self-centeredness, not to give in to intemperance in food or drink or in other things of pornography and use of video games, and to get lost in vain thoughts.

When Holy Week comes, we will be prepared to accompany Christ as he prepares for His throne, the Cross, after he is seized as a criminal on Holy Thursday. We stay close to him and suffer with him in many small ways as he is led to Calvary, and we are ready to be with him at the scourging at the pillar and his being raised up on the Cross.

The world needs this sacrifice of ourselves to make it peaceful and just, calm and without war. Hosanna in the highest!

Have a Blessed Palm Sunday and Passion of Our Lord.

### **Tenebrae Service** Spy Wednesday, April 5 at 6:00 PM



Tenebrae (Latin for "darkness") is a religious service celebrated during Holy Week. Tenebrae is distinctive for its gradual extinguishing of candles while a series of readings and psalms are chanted or recited. One candle is extinguished after each of the nine psalms of Matins and the five of Lauds, gradually reducing the lighting throughout the service. This Service will be live streamed.

This year the Seven Last Words will be preached by the priests of Saint Agnes. Fr. Michael, Fr. Bob, Fr. Francis, Bishop O'Hara and Fr. Saint Agnes's Goal for the 2023 Appeal is: \$57,000

Good Friday (April 7, 2023) is an obligatory day of fasting and abstinence for Catholics.

**Fasting:** *Obligatory from age 18 until age 59.* Fasting means only one full meal a day may be taken. Two smaller meals may be eaten to maintain physical strength but together they should not equal another full meal. Snacking between meals is not permitted, but drinking liquids is allowed. Those who are not specifically obliged to fast are encouraged to

join in the discipline of fasting to the extent that they are able.

**Abstinence:** Obligatory from age 14 onwards.

Abstinence forbids the eating of meat (including pork) and poultry. Saltwater fish, freshwater fish and shellfish are permitted. Those who are not specifically obliged to abstain from eating meat are encouraged to join in the discipline of abstaining to the extent that they are able.

#### **Special circumstances:**

Those that are excused from fast and abstinence include the physically or mentally ill, including individuals suffering from chronic illnesses. Also excluded are pregnant or nursing women. In all cases, common sense should prevail.
