

A Note From Our Pastor

Parishioners and Friends,

We are coming to close the **150th year of St. Agnes**, and we have been able to serve all of you through difficult and good times. **On January 21st**, we will celebrate St. Agnes, and Cardinal Dolan will come to celebrate Mass at 12:30 pm and join us for a reception downstairs. Though it is a Sunday, we will celebrate our Patroness, St. Agnes.

As you have seen, we have not asked much for financial support, but we need to do so as COVID has reduced the number of people visiting the parish and as the parish has changed in the last few years.

Many do not have the finances to do so, but some of you could give St. Agnes \$50,000 or \$100,000, or even more on an annual basis, which would be helpful for us to pay off our financial deficit of \$400,000 a year. When things do not work well, such as a boiler or an elevator, it costs \$25,000 or \$50,000 to repair, which makes that deficit even worse. Right now, the elevator does not work, the motor is broken, and it will cost \$30,000 to fix. The overhead for both elevators costs approximately \$100,000 a year.

St. Agnes Church is a beautiful place to pray, and we keep it clean all the time thanks to people who volunteer and who are conscientious. The Church could use a paint job and repair the leaks in the ceiling, but that is way out of range for what we receive. To repaint and improve the interior of the Church would cost \$500,000. That's not like painting the living room of your home.

As we close the year, I hope some of you step forward and help us and that many of you can keep St. Agnes as one of the beneficiaries of your last will. My mother left me some money when she died, and a big part went to St. Agnes. My sister and her husband celebrated my birthday this year, giving St. Agnes \$50,000.

People have told me how much St. Agnes was part of the lives of their parents or grandparents, and they may not come to St. Agnes. Still, a part of who they are depends on the Masses and Confessions of their forebears, and they might consider keeping this wonderful place to continue providing Mass and Confessions in the future. People who graduated from elementary school or high school might also feel a bond to help St. Agnes.

I pray to St. Agnes, a girl of 13, to watch over the parish and to help us continue what she exemplified when she surrendered her life for Christ. I pray that others will follow her example to spread the good news of God here in Midtown Manhattan.
