for approximately seven days.

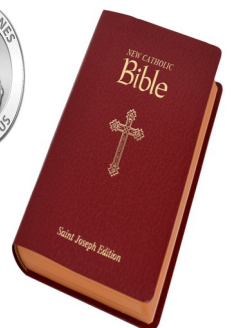
Plain white candles are \$10 each.

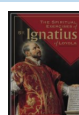
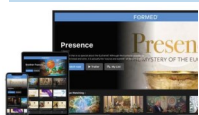
