#### LEGION OF MARY

On the days around Ash Wednesday we Catholics usually come up with a plan for Lent: to give up something as a sacrifice (like candy or social media); to attend Mass daily; pray the holy rosary; read scripture; etc. But the Church reminds us that Lent should consist of more than external actions, it is a time of Grace to convert and go back to the closeness to God like the Prodigal Son: "I shall get up and go to my father and I shall say to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you." (Lk 15:18)

To go back to the House of the Father implies to acknowledge the ways in which we have distanced ourselves from our true home. If the ashes represent our sadness for having rejected the love that God has for us in Christ, they should also lead us to open ourselves to the joy of His merciful welcome, especially in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Whatever practices the Holy Spirit inspires us in this season to express our contrition and grow closer to God, may they also fill us with the hope of Easter, that with Christ we can rise from our failures and feel the strength of the victory of His love over our sins.

#### **Abstinence during Lent**

Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

Abstinence: Obligatory from age 14 onwards.

Abstinence forbids the eating of meat (including pork) and poultry. Saltwater fish, freshwater fish and shellfish are permitted. Those who are not specifically obliged to abstain from eating meat are encouraged to join in the discipline of abstaining to the extent that they are able.

#### **Special circumstances:**

Those that are excused from fast and abstinence include the physically or mentally ill, including individuals suffering from chronic illnesses. Also excluded are pregnant or nursing women. In all cases, common sense should prevail.

#### Notes on Lenten Music

During Lent (except for Lent IV and Solemnities), the organ is used only to accompany singing. The Roman Missal Chant Mass is sung at the Saturday Vigil and Mass XVII on Sundays. ### Prayer Before A Crucifix: A Plenary Indulgence for Lent

On any Friday during Lent a plenary indulgence is granted the Faithful who, after Communion, devoutly recite the following prayer before an image of the crucified Lord. On other days of the year the indulgence is a partial one.

At St. Agnes, the large Crucifix on the wall above the sanctuary will work, in addition to a printed image in a missal, prayer book, or church bulletin.

If you have received the Eucharist and recite the prescribed prayer, the only remaining requirements for this indulgence are (1) confession and (2) prayers for the intentions of the Holy Father; one Our Father, One Hail Mary, and one Glory Be will do.

One can obtain a plenary indulgence for themselves, or, we can offer it for a soul in purgatory, including a friend or relative. This is an act of charity and spiritual tithing to do during Lent.

#### Prayer Before The Crucifix



Look down upon me, good and gentle Jesus, while before Thy face I humbly kneel, and with burning soul I pray and beseech Thee to fix deep in my heart the lively sentiments of faith, hope and charity, a true contrition for my sins, and a firm purpose of amendment. Meanwhile, I contemplate

with great love and tender pity Thy five Precious Wounds, pondering over them within me, having in mind the words which David, Thy prophet, said of Thee, my Jesus: "They have pierced My hands and My feet; they have numbered all My bones."

Please do not leave flowers in the church during the Lenten Season. It is a time of penance. Thank you.


