Fridays during Lent

Exposition of The Blessed Sacrament



On Fridays during Lent, the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed from 1:45 PM to 5:00 PM (Benediction).



Stations of the Cross

Saint Agnes offers Stations of the Cross, lead by a Priest, every Friday during the season of Lent. Stations will follow the 5:10 PM Mass.

Please do not leave flowers in the church during the Lenten Season. It is a time of penance. Thank you.

Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

Abstinence: Obligatory from age 14 onwards. Abstinence forbids the eating of meat (including pork) and poultry. Saltwater fish, freshwater fish and shellfish are permitted. Those who are not specifically obliged to abstain from eating meat are encouraged to join in the discipline of abstaining to the extent that they are able.

Special circumstances:

Those that are excused from fast and abstinence include the physically or mentally ill, including individuals suffering from chronic illnesses. Also excluded are pregnant or nursing women. In all cases, common sense should prevail.

Prayer Before A Crucifix: A Plenary Indulgence for Lent

On any Friday during Lent a plenary indulgence is granted the Faithful who, after Communion, devoutly recite the following prayer before an image of the crucified Lord. On other days of the year the indulgence is a partial one.

At St. Agnes, the large Crucifix on the wall above the sanctuary will work, in addition to a printed image in a missal, prayer book, or church bulletin.

If you have received the Eucharist and recite the prescribed prayer, the only remaining requirements for this indulgence are (1) confession and (2) prayers for the intentions of the Holy Father; one Our Father, One Hail Mary, and one Glory Be will do.

One can obtain a plenary indulgence for themselves, or, we can offer it for a soul in purgatory, including a friend or relative. This is an act of charity and spiritual tithing to do during Lent.

Prayer Before The Crucifix



Look down upon me, good and gentle Jesus, while before Thy face I humbly kneel, and with burning soul I pray and beseech Thee to fix deep in my heart the lively sentiments of faith, hope and charity, a true contrition for my sins, and a firm purpose of amendment. Meanwhile, I contemplate

with great love and tender pity Thy five Precious Wounds, pondering over them within me, having in mind the words which David, Thy prophet, said of Thee, my Jesus: "They have pierced My hands and My feet; they have numbered all My bones."
